IN THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

JUNE 4, 2015

To amend, on an emergency basis, due to congressional review, the Firearms Control Regulations Act of 1975 to permit a person to register a firearm for self-defense in his or her place of business, to provide a Freedom of Information Act exception for pistol registration information, to specify application requirements for applying for a license to carry a concealed pistol, to specify the duration of such licenses and requirements for renewal of licenses, to establish duties of licensees, to provide for revocation of licenses, to create a criminal offense of carrying while consuming alcohol or while impaired, to specify prohibitions on licensees, to establish a Concealed Pistol Licensing Review Board, to provide a Freedom of Information Act exception for license information, to specify penalties for violations, and to require the Mayor to issue rules; and to amend An Act To control the possession, sale, transfer, and use of pistols and other dangerous weapons in the District of Columbia, to provide penalties, to prescribe rules of evidence, and for other purposes to authorize the Chief of Police to issue licenses to carry a concealed pistol to District residents and non-residents provided certain conditions are met.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this act may be cited as the "License to Carry a Pistol Congressional Review Emergency Amendment Act of 2015".

Sec. 2. The Firearms Control Regulations Act of 1975, effective September 24, 1976 (D.C. Law 1-85; D.C. Official Code § 7-2501.01 *et seq.*), is amended as follows:

(a) Section 201(b)(4) (D.C. Official Code § 7-2502.01(b)(4)) is amended by striking the phrase "the home" and inserting the phrase "the home or place of business" in its place.

(b) Section 202(a)(4)(C) (D.C. Official Code § 7-2502.02(a)(4)(C)) is amended to read as follows:

“(C) Any person who seeks to register a pistol:

“(i) For use in self-defense within that person’s home or place of business; or

“(ii) As part of the application process for a license to carry a concealed pistol pursuant to section 902; or”.

(c) Section 203(a)(4) (D.C. Official Code § 7-2502.03(a)(4)) is amended as follows:

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- (1) Subparagraph (D) is amended by striking the word "or" at the end.
- (2) Subparagraph (E) is amended by adding the word "or" at the end.
- (3) A new subparagraph (F) is added to read as follows:

"(F) Violation of section 503 of the Omnibus Public Safety and Justice Amendment Act of 2009, effective December 10, 2009 (D.C. Law 18-88; D.C. Official Code § 22-3133);".

- (d) A new section 211a is added to read as follows:

"Sec. 211a. Freedom of information exception.

"Any record regarding a person who has applied for, received, or had revoked any registration issued pursuant to this title shall not be made available as a public record under section 202 of the Freedom of Information Act of 1976, effective March 25, 1977 (D.C. Law 1-96; D.C. Official Code § 2-532).".

(e) Section 706(a) (D.C. Official Code § 7-2507.06(a)) is amended by striking the phrase "Except as provided in sections 205, 208, 702, and 807" and inserting the phrase "Except as provided in sections 205, 208, 702, 807, and Title IX" in its place.

- (f) A new Title IX is added to read as follows:

"TITLE IX – LICENSES TO CARRY A PISTOL.

"Sec. 901. Definitions.

"For the purposes of this title, the term:

"(1) "Child" means a person under 18 years of age.

"(2) "Concealed pistol" means a loaded or unloaded pistol carried on or about a person entirely hidden from view of the public, or carried on or about a person in a vehicle in such a way as it is entirely hidden from view of the public.

"(3) "Law enforcement officer" means a sworn member of the Metropolitan Police Department or of any other law enforcement agency operating and authorized to make arrests in the District of Columbia, and includes an MPD reserve officer, a special police officer appointed pursuant to section 202 of An Act Making appropriations to provide for the expenses of the government of the District of Columbia for the fiscal year ending June thirtieth, nineteen hundred, and for other purposes, approved March 3, 1899 (30 Stat. 1057; D.C. Official Code § 5-129.02), and a campus and a university special police officer appointed pursuant to the College and University Campus Security Amendment Act of 1995, effective October 18, 1995 (D.C. Law 11-63; 6A DCMR § 1200 *et seq.*).

"(4) "License" means a license to carry a concealed pistol issued pursuant to section 6 of the Pistols and Other Dangerous Weapons Act.

"(5) "Licensee" means a person who has been issued a license pursuant to section 6 of the Pistols and Other Dangerous Weapons Act.

"(6) "MPD" means the Metropolitan Police Department.

"(7) "Section 6 of the Pistols and Other Dangerous Weapons Act" means section 6 of An Act To control the possession, sale, transfer, and use of pistols and other dangerous weapons in the District of Columbia, to provide penalties, to prescribe rules of evidence, and for other purposes, approved July 8, 1932 (47 Stat. 650; D.C. Official Code § 22-4506).

"Sec. 902. Application requirements.

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“(a) A person who submits an application pursuant to section 6 of the Pistols and Other Dangerous Weapons Act shall certify and demonstrate to the satisfaction of the Chief that he or she:

“(1) Is at least 21 years of age;

“(2) Meets all of the requirements for a person registering a firearm pursuant to this act, and has obtained a registration certificate for the pistol that the person is applying to carry concealed;

“(3)(A) Does not currently suffer from a mental illness or condition that creates a substantial risk that he or she is a danger to himself or herself or others; or

“(B) If he or she has suffered in the previous 5 years from a mental illness or condition that created a substantial risk that he or she was a danger to himself or herself or others, no longer suffers from a mental illness or condition that creates a substantial risk that he or she is a danger to himself or herself or others;

“(4) Has completed a firearms training course or combination of courses, conducted by an instructor (or instructors) certified by the Chief, which includes at least 16 hours of training, and covers the following:

“(A) Firearm safety;

“(B) Firearm nomenclature;

“(C) Basic principles of marksmanship;

“(D) Care, cleaning, maintenance, loading, unloading, and storage of pistols;

“(E) Situational awareness, conflict management, and use of deadly force;

“(F) Selection of pistols and ammunition for defensive purposes; and

“(G) All applicable District and federal firearms laws, including the requirements of this act, An Act To control the possession, sale, transfer, and use of pistols and other dangerous weapons in the District of Columbia, to provide penalties, to prescribe rules of evidence, and for other purposes, approved July 8, 1932 (47 Stat. 650; D.C. Official Code § 22-4501 *et seq.*), and District law pertaining to self-defense;

“(5) Has completed at least 2 hours of range training, conducted by an instructor certified by the Chief, including shooting a qualification course of 50 rounds of ammunition from a maximum distance of 15 yards (45 feet); and

“(6) Has complied with any procedures the Chief may establish by rule.

“(b) An applicant shall satisfy the requirements of subsection (a)(4) and (a)(5) of this section with a certification from a firearms instructor that the applicant:

“(1) Demonstrated satisfactory completion of the requirements of subsection (a)(4) and (a)(5) of this section; and

“(2) Possesses the proper knowledge, skills, and attitude to carry a concealed pistol.

“(c) An applicant may be exempt from some or all of the requirements of subsection (a)(4) and (a)(5) of this section if the applicant has submitted evidence that he or she has received firearms training in the United States military or has otherwise completed firearms

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training conducted by a firearms instructor that, as determined by the Chief, is equal to or greater than that required under subsection (a)(4) and (a)(5) of this section.

“(d) An applicant for a license may satisfy any component of the requirements of subsection (a)(4) and (a)(5) of this section by demonstrating to the satisfaction of the Chief that the applicant has met that particular component as part of a successful application to carry a concealed pistol issued by the lawful authorities of any state or subdivision of the United States.

“(e)(1) An applicant shall sign an oath or affirmation attesting to the truth of all the information required by section 6 of the Pistols and Other Dangerous Weapons Act and this section.

“(2) Any declaration, certificate, verification, or statement made for purposes of an application for a license to carry a concealed pistol pursuant to this act shall be made under penalty of perjury pursuant to section 401 of the District of Columbia Theft and White Collar Crimes Act of 1982, effective December 1, 1982 (D.C. Law 4-164; D.C. Official Code § 22-2402).

“(f) An applicant is required to appear for an in-person interview at the MPD headquarters for purposes including verification of the applicant’s identity and verification of the information submitted as part of the application process for a license.

“(g) Any person whose application has been denied may, within 15 days after the date of the notice of denial, appeal to the Concealed Pistol Licensing Review Board established pursuant to section 908.

“Sec. 903. Expiration and renewal of licenses.

“(a) A license shall expire no later than 2 years after the date of issuance unless revoked by the Chief or renewed pursuant to this title.

“(b)(1) A license shall be eligible for renewal if:

“(A) The licensee continues to meet the requirements of section 6 of the Pistols and Other Dangerous Weapons Act and section 902, except that:

“(i) With regard to section 902(a)(4), only 4 hours of such training shall be required for renewal; and

“(ii) With regard to section 902(a)(5), the licensee shall provide proof of 2 hours of range practice within the previous 12 months; and

“(B) The licensee follows any procedures the Chief may establish by rule.

“(2) Timely renewal shall be the responsibility of the licensee, pursuant to any procedures the Chief may establish by rule.

“(c) Any person whose renewal application has been denied may, within 15 days after the date of the notice of denial, appeal to the Concealed Pistol Licensing Review Board established pursuant to section 908.

“Sec. 904. Duties of licensees.

“(a) A licensee shall comply with all limits and conditions of the license.

“(b) A licensee shall notify the Chief in writing:

“(1) Immediately upon discovery of the loss, theft, or destruction of the license and include the circumstances of the loss, theft, or destruction, if known; and

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“(2) Within 30 days after a change in the licensee’s name or address as it appears on the license.

“(c) A licensee shall have on or about his or her person each time the pistol is carried in the District:

“(1) The license; and

“(2) The registration certificate for the pistol being carried, issued pursuant to this act.

“(d) If a law enforcement officer initiates an investigative stop of a licensee carrying a concealed pistol pursuant to section 6 of the Pistols and Other Dangerous Weapons Act, the licensee, and any other licensee carrying a concealed pistol pursuant to section 6 of the Pistols and Other Dangerous Weapons Act who is with the stopped licensee at the time of the investigative stop, shall:

“(1) Disclose to the officer that he or she is carrying a concealed pistol;

“(2) Present the license and registration certificate;

“(3) Identify the location of the concealed pistol; and

“(4) Comply with all lawful orders and directions from the officer, including allowing a pat down of his or her person and permitting the law enforcement officer to take possession of the pistol for so long as is necessary for the safety of the officer or the public.

“(e) The duties set forth in this section are in addition to any other requirements imposed by this act or applicable law.

“(f) In addition to any other penalty provided by law, a person who violates this section shall be subject to revocation of his or her license.

“Sec. 905. Revocation and suspension of licenses.

“(a)(1) The Chief may limit or revoke a license upon a finding that the licensee no longer meets the requirements of section 6 of the Pistols and Other Dangerous Weapons Act and this title, or as a penalty as specified in this act.

“(2) The United States Attorney for the District of Columbia, the Attorney General for the District of Columbia, or any person may apply to the MPD at any time for limitation or revocation of a license.

“(3) Any person having knowledge that a licensee no longer meets the requirements of this act or the requirements of section 6 of the Pistols and Other Dangerous Weapons Act may so notify the Chief or any other law enforcement officer who may take such action as may be appropriate.

“(4) Before a limitation or revocation taking effect, the Chief shall serve a notice of intent to limit or revoke the license. The limitation or revocation shall take effect unless the licensee requests an appeal to the Concealed Pistol Licensing Review Board established pursuant to section 908 no later than 15 days after the date of the notice of intent.

“(b)(1) The Chief may summarily suspend or limit, without a hearing, a license, when the Chief has determined that the conduct of a licensee presents an imminent danger to the health and safety of a person or the public.

“(2) At the time of the summary suspension or limitation of a license, the Chief shall provide the licensee with written notice stating the action that is being taken, the basis for

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the action, and the right of the licensee to request a hearing.

“(3) A licensee shall have the right to request a hearing within 72 hours after service of notice of the summary suspension or limitation of the license. The Concealed Pistol Licensing Review Board shall hold a hearing within 72 hours after receipt of a timely request, and shall issue a written decision within 72 hours after the hearing.

“Sec. 906. Carrying a pistol while impaired.

“(a) A licensee shall not carry a pistol while he or she is consuming alcohol.

“(b) A licensee shall not carry a pistol while impaired.

“(c) Upon establishing reasonable suspicion that a licensee has been consuming drugs or alcohol, a licensee’s failure to submit to one or more field sobriety, breathalyzer, or urine tests, administered to determine whether the licensee is impaired while carrying a pistol, shall be grounds for summary suspension of the license pursuant to section 905(b).

“(d) In addition to any other penalty provided by law, any person who violates this section shall be subject to revocation of his or her license.

“(e) For the purposes of this section, the term “impaired” means a licensee has consumed alcohol or other drug or drugs and that it has affected the licensee’s behavior in a way that can be perceived or noticed.

“Sec. 907. Prohibitions on carrying licensed pistols.

“(a) No person holding a license shall carry a pistol in the following locations or under the following circumstances:

“(1) A building or office occupied by the District of Columbia, its agencies, or instrumentalities;

“(2) The building and grounds, including any adjacent parking lot, of a childcare facility, preschool, public or private elementary or secondary school; or a public or private college or university;

“(3) A hospital, or an office where medical or mental health services are the primary services provided;

“(4) A penal institution, secure juvenile residential facility, or halfway house;

“(5) A polling place while voting is occurring;

“(6) A public transportation vehicle, including the Metrorail transit system and its stations;

“(7) Any premises, or portion thereof, where alcohol is served, or sold and consumed on the premises, pursuant to a license issued under Title 25 of the District of Columbia Official Code; provided, that this prohibition shall not apply to premises operating under a temporary license issued pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-115, a C/R, D/R, C/H, D/H, or caterer license issued pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-113, or premises with small-sample tasting permits issued pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 25-118, unless otherwise prohibited pursuant to subsection (b)(3) of this section;

“(8) A stadium or arena;

“(9) A gathering or special event open to the public; provided, that no licensee shall be criminally prosecuted unless:

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“(A) The organizer or the District has provided notice prohibiting the carrying of pistols in advance of the gathering or special event and by posted signage at the gathering or special event; or

“(B) The licensee has been ordered by a law enforcement officer to leave the area of the gathering or special event and the licensee has not complied with the order;

“(10) The public memorials on the National Mall and along the Tidal Basin, and any area where firearms are prohibited under federal law or by a federal agency or entity, including U.S. Capitol buildings and grounds;

“(11) The area around the White House between Constitution Avenue, N.W., and H Street, N.W., and between 15th Street, N.W., and 17th Street, N.W.;

“(12) The U.S. Naval Observatory and its grounds, and from the perimeter of its fence to the curb of Massachusetts Avenue, N.W., from 34th Street, N.W., south on Massachusetts Avenue, N.W., to Observatory Circle, N.W.;

“(13)(A) When a dignitary or high-ranking official of the United States or a state, local, or foreign government is moving under the protection of the MPD, the U.S. Secret Service, the U.S. Capitol Police, or other law enforcement agency assisting or working in concert with MPD, within an area designated by the Chief, the Chief of the U.S. Secret Service, or the Chief of the U.S. Capitol Police, or a designee of any of the forgoing, that does not include any point at a distance greater than 1,000 feet from the moving dignitary or high-ranking official; provided, that no licensee shall be criminally prosecuted unless:

“(i) The law enforcement agency provides notice of the designated area by the presence of signs, law enforcement vehicles or officers acting as a perimeter, or other means to make the designated area of protection obvious;

“(ii) The District or federal government has provided notice prohibiting the carrying of pistols along a designated route or in a designated area in advance of the event, if possible, and by posted signage along a route or in a designated area; or

“(iii) The licensee has been ordered by a law enforcement officer to leave the designated area and the licensee has not complied with the order.

“(B) For the purposes of this paragraph, the term “moving” shall include any planned or unplanned stops, including temporary stops, in locations open to the public.

“(14) When demonstration in a public place is occurring, within an area designated by the Chief or his or her designee, or other law enforcement agency, that does not include any point at a distance greater than 1,000 feet from the demonstration; provided, that no licensee shall be criminally prosecuted unless:

“(A) The law enforcement agency provides notice of the designated area by the presence of signs, law enforcement vehicles or officers acting as a perimeter, or other means to make the designated area of the demonstration obvious;

“(B) The District or federal government has provided notice prohibiting the carrying of pistols along or within a demonstration route or designated area in advance of the event, if possible, and by posted signage along a demonstration route or designated area; or

“(C) The licensee has been ordered by a law enforcement officer to leave the designated area and the licensee has not complied with the order; or

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“(15) Any prohibited location or circumstance that the Chief determines by rule; provided, that for spontaneous circumstances, no criminal penalty shall apply unless the licensee has notice of the prohibition and has failed to comply.

“(b)(1) The carrying of a concealed pistol on private residential property shall be presumed to be prohibited unless otherwise authorized by the property owner or person in control of the premises and communicated personally to the licensee in advance of entry onto the residential property.

“(2) The carrying of a concealed pistol in a church, synagogue, mosque, or other place where people regularly assemble for religious worship shall be presumed to be prohibited unless the property is posted with conspicuous signage allowing the carrying of a concealed pistol, or the owner or authorized agent communicates such allowance personally to the licensee in advance of entry onto the property; provided, that such places may not authorize the carrying of a concealed pistol where services are conducted in locations listed in subsection (a) of this section.

“(3) The carrying of a concealed pistol on private property that is not a residence shall be presumed to be permitted unless the property is posted with conspicuous signage prohibiting the carrying of a concealed pistol, or the owner or authorized agent communicates such prohibition personally to the licensee.

“(c) Whenever a licensee carries a concealed pistol and approaches any prohibited location, or is subject to any prohibited circumstance, under subsection (a) or subsection (b) of this section, the licensee shall:

“(1) If the licensee is in a vehicle or if a vehicle is readily available, immediately secure the pistol in the manner prescribed in section 4b(b) of An Act To control the possession, sale, transfer, and use of pistols and other dangerous weapons in the District of Columbia, to provide penalties, to prescribe rules of evidence, and for other purposes, effective May 20, 2009 (D.C. Law 17-388; D.C. Official Code § 22-4504.02(b)); or

“(2) If the licensee does not have a vehicle available, immediately leave the prohibited location or circumstance.

“(d) A licensee shall not be in violation of this section:

“(1) While he or she is traveling along a public street, road, or highway, including an adjacent public sidewalk that touches the perimeter of any of the premises where the carrying of a concealed pistol is prohibited under subsection (a) or (b) of this section if the concealed pistol is carried on his or her person in accordance with this act, or is being transported by the licensee in accordance with section 4b of An Act To control the possession, sale, transfer, and use of pistols and other dangerous weapons in the District of Columbia, to provide penalties, to prescribe rules of evidence, and for other purposes, effective May 20, 2009 (D.C. Law 17-388; D.C. Official Code § 22-4504.02); or

“(2) While driving a vehicle into and immediately parking at any location listed in subsection (a)(2) of this section for the purpose of picking up or dropping off a student or a child; provided, that the licensee shall secure the concealed pistol in accordance with section 4b(b) of An Act To control the possession, sale, transfer, and use of pistols and other dangerous weapons in the District of Columbia, to provide penalties, to prescribe rules of evidence, and for other

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purposes, effective May 20, 2009 (D.C. Law 17-388; D.C. Official Code § 22-4504.02(b)), before leaving the parked vehicle.

“(e) A licensee shall not carry a pistol openly or otherwise in a manner that is not concealed.

“(f) In addition to any other penalty provided by law, any person who violates this section shall be subject to revocation of his or her license.

“(g) For the purposes of this section, the term:

“(1) “Demonstration” means one or more persons demonstrating, picketing, speechmaking, marching, holding a vigil, or engaging in any other similar conduct that involves the communication or expression of views or grievances and that has the effect, intent, or propensity to attract a crowd or onlookers. The term “demonstration” does not include the casual use of property by visitors or tourists that does not have the effect, intent, or propensity to attract a crowd or onlookers.

“(2) “Public place” means a place to which the general public has access and a right to occupy for business, entertainment, or other lawful purpose. The term “public place” is not limited to a place devoted solely to the uses of the public, and includes:

“(A) The front or immediate area or parking lot of a store, restaurant, tavern, shopping center, or other place of business;

“(B) A public building, including its grounds and curtilage;

“(C) A public parking lot;

“(D) A public street, sidewalk, or right-of-way;

“(E) A public park; and

“(F) Other public grounds.

“(3) “Public transportation vehicle” means any publicly owned or operated commercial vehicle, including any DC Circulator bus, DC Streetcar, MetroAccess vehicle, Metrobus, or Metrorail train.

“(4) “Residence” means a building wholly or partly used or intended to be used for living and sleeping by human occupants, together with any fences, walls, sheds, garages, or other accessory buildings appurtenant to the building, and the area of land surrounding the building and actually or by legal construction forming one enclosure in which such a building is located, but does not include adjacent common areas or commercial property contained in any part of the building.

“Sec. 908. Concealed Pistol Licensing Review Board.

“(a) There is established a Concealed Pistol Licensing Review Board (“Board”) for the purpose of hearing appeals from:

“(1) A denial of an application or renewal application for a license to carry a concealed pistol in the District pursuant to this act;

“(2) A summary suspension or limitation of a license to carry a concealed pistol;

or

“(3) A limitation or revocation of a license to carry a concealed pistol.

“(b)(1) The Board shall consist of 7 members as follows:

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“(A) The United States Attorney (“USAO”) for the District of Columbia or his or her designee; provided, that if the USAO declines to provide a representative, the Mayor shall appoint a person who is a former employee of the USAO;

“(B) The Attorney General for the District of Columbia or his or her designee;

“(C) A mental health professional employed by the Department of Behavioral Health, appointed by the Mayor;

“(D) A former sworn officer of a law enforcement agency other than the MPD, appointed by the Mayor;

“(E) Three public members appointed by the Mayor, as follows:

“(i) One mental health professional; and

“(ii) Two District residents with experience in the operation, care, and handling of firearms.

“(2) The appointment of members designated by subsection (b)(1)(D) and (b)(1)(E) of this section shall be made in accordance with the following provisions:

“(A) Each member shall be appointed for a term of 4 years, and shall continue to serve during that time as long as the member remains eligible for the appointment;

“(B) A member may be reappointed;

“(C) A Board member whose term has expired may continue to serve as a member until a replacement member has been appointed;

“(D) A person appointed to fill a vacancy occurring before the expiration of a term shall serve for the remainder of the term or until a successor has been appointed; and

“(E) A member may be removed by the appointing authority only for incompetence, neglect of duty, or misconduct.

“(3) The Mayor shall select a chairperson.

“(4) Members shall serve without compensation, but shall be compensated for actual and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their official duties.

“(c) Four members of the Board shall constitute a quorum, except that 2 members shall be a quorum when hearing panels of 3 members are assigned by the Board to conduct a hearing and make a final decision required by this section. Each hearing panel shall contain at least one member designated by subsection (b)(1)(A), (B), or (D) of this section.

“(d)(1) Within 30 days after the effective date of the License to Carry a Pistol Second Emergency Amendment Act of 2014, effective January 6, 2015 (D.C. Act 20-564; 62 DCR 866), the Mayor, by rule, shall establish hearing procedures for a contested case review of any appeal, including the manner and time of appeals, and procedures for the Board to assign panels of 3 Board members to conduct such hearings and issue final decisions, pursuant to subsection (c) of this section.

“(2) The rules shall include that the burden of production of evidence, and the burden of persuasion, at a hearing before the Board shall be upon the applicant or licensee that is challenging a denial of an application or renewal application or limitation or revocation of a license.

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“(e) The meetings and hearings conducted by the Board shall be confidential and not open to the public.

“(f) Any person, including the Chief, aggrieved by a final action of the Board may file an appeal in accordance with Title I of the District of Columbia Administrative Procedure Act, approved October 21, 1968 (82 Stat. 1204; D.C. Official Code § 2-501 *et seq.*).

“Sec. 909. Freedom of information exception; report.

“(a) Any record regarding a person who has applied for, received, or had revoked a license shall not be made available as a public record under section 202 of the Freedom of Information Act of 1976, effective March 25, 1977 (D.C. Law 1-96; D.C. Official Code § 2-532); provided, that aggregate data, excluding any personal identifying information, may be used for the purposes of the public report in subsection (b) of this section.

“(b) Every 2 years, the MPD shall make public a report that includes the following information:

“(1) The total number of valid licenses; and

“(2) For the most recent 2-year period:

“(A) The number of applications for a license received;

“(B) The number of licenses issued;

“(C) The number of licenses renewed, suspended, revoked, or denied;

“(D) The number of licensees convicted of a crime involving a pistol, classified by type of crime;

“(E) The number of pistols for which a license was issued that were reported lost or stolen; and

“(F) The number of pistols for which a license was issued that were found or recovered as stolen that were unreported by a licensee as lost or stolen.

“Sec. 910. Penalties.

“(a)(1) Except as otherwise provided in this title, a person convicted of a violation of a provision of this title, or rules or regulations issued under the authority of this title, shall be fined not more than the amount set forth in section 101 of the Criminal Fine Proportionality Amendment Act of 2012, effective June 11, 2013 (D.C. Law 19-317; D.C. Official Code § 22-3571.01), or imprisoned for not more than 180 days.

“(2) Civil fines, penalties, and fees may be imposed as alternative sanctions for any infraction of the provisions of this title, or any rules or regulations issued under the authority of this title.

“(b) All prosecutions for violations of this title shall be brought in the name of the District of Columbia and prosecuted by the Office of the Attorney General for the District of Columbia.

“Sec. 911. Rules.

“The Chief of the MPD, pursuant to Title I of the District of Columbia Administrative Procedure Act, approved October 21, 1968 (82 Stat. 1204; D.C. Official Code § 2-501 *et seq.*), shall issue rules to implement the provisions of the License to Carry a Pistol Second Emergency Amendment Act of 2014, effective January 6, 2015 (D.C. Act 20-564; 62 DCR 866), and the

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License to Carry a Pistol Congressional Review Emergency Amendment Act of 2015, passed on emergency basis on June 2, 2015 (Enrolled version of Bill 21-221), including rules:

“(1) To establish criteria for determining when an applicant has, pursuant to section 6 of the Pistols and Other Dangerous Weapons Act:

“(A) Demonstrated a good reason to fear injury to his or her person, which shall at a minimum require a showing of a special need for self-protection distinguishable from the general community as supported by evidence of specific threats or previous attacks that demonstrate a special danger to the applicant’s life;

“(B) Demonstrated any other proper reason for carrying a concealed pistol, which shall at a minimum include types of employment that require the handling of cash or other valuable objects that may be transported upon the applicant’s person; and

“(C) Demonstrated the applicant’s suitability to carry a concealed pistol, which shall at a minimum include evidence that the applicant meets the requirements of section 902;

“(2) To establish the type and amount of ammunition that may be carried concealed by a licensee;

“(3) To establish the methods by which a pistol may be carried, including any standards for safe holstering;

“(4) To establish all application forms, investigation procedures, background checks, and fees necessary to process an application for a license to carry a concealed pistol;

“(5) To specify any procedures or requirements specific to non-residents who apply to carry a concealed pistol pursuant to section 6 of the Pistols and Other Dangerous Weapons Act, with regard to the registration requirements in this act;

“(6) To specify requirements for signage on any private premises where the owner or person in control of the premises prohibits the carrying of a concealed pistol pursuant to section 907(b); and

“(7) To establish procedures for the renewal of licenses.”.

Sec. 3. An Act To control the possession, sale, transfer, and use of pistols and other dangerous weapons in the District of Columbia, to provide penalties, to prescribe rules of evidence, and for other purposes, approved July 8, 1932 (47 Stat. 650; D.C. Official Code § 22-4501 *et seq.*), is amended as follows:

(a) Section 4(a) (D.C. Official Code § 22-4504(a)) is amended as follows:

(1) The lead-in language is amended as follows:

(A) Strike the phrase “a pistol” and insert the phrase “a pistol, without a license issued pursuant to District of Columbia law” in its place.

(B) Strike the phrase “capable of being so concealed”.

(2) Paragraph (1) is amended by striking the phrase “a pistol” and inserting the phrase “a pistol, without a license issued pursuant to District of Columbia law” in its place.

(b) Section 6 (D.C. Official Code § 22-4506) is revived as of the effective date of the License to Carry a Pistol Emergency Amendment Act of 2014, effective October 9, 2014 (D.C. Act 20-447; 61 DCR 10765), and is amended to read as follows:

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“Sec. 6. Issuance of a license to carry a pistol.

“(a) The Chief of the Metropolitan Police Department (“Chief”) may, upon the application of a person having a bona fide residence or place of business within the District of Columbia, or of a person having a bona fide residence or place of business within the United States and a license to carry a pistol concealed upon his or her person issued by the lawful authorities of any State or subdivision of the United States, issue a license to such person to carry a pistol concealed upon his or her person within the District of Columbia for not more than 2 years from the date of issue, if it appears that the applicant has good reason to fear injury to his or her person or property or has any other proper reason for carrying a pistol, and that he or she is a suitable person to be so licensed.

“(b) A non-resident who lives in a state that does not require a license to carry a concealed pistol may apply to the Chief for a license to carry a pistol concealed upon his or her person within the District of Columbia for not more than 2 years from the date of issue; provided, that he or she meets the same reasons and requirements set forth in subsection (a) of this section.

“(c) For any person issued a license pursuant to this section, or renewed pursuant to section 903 of the Firearms Control Regulations Act of 1975, passed on emergency basis on June 2, 2015 (Enrolled version of Bill 21-221), the Chief may limit the geographic area, circumstances, or times of the day, week, month, or year in which the license is effective, and may subsequently limit, suspend, or revoke the license as provided under section 905 of the Firearms Control Regulations Act of 1975, passed on emergency basis on June 2, 2015 (Enrolled version of Bill 21-221).

“(d) The application for a license to carry shall be on a form prescribed by the Chief and shall bear the name, address, description and photograph of the licensee.

“(e) Except as provided in section 905(b) of the Firearms Control Regulations Act of 1975, passed on emergency basis on June 2, 2015 (Enrolled version of Bill 21-221), any person whose application has been denied or whose license has been limited or revoked may, within 15 days after the date of the notice of the denial or notice of intent, appeal to the Concealed Pistol Licensing Review Board established pursuant to section 908 of the Firearms Control Regulations Act of 1975, passed on emergency basis on June 2, 2015 (Enrolled version of Bill 21-221).”.

Sec. 4. Repealers.

(a) Section 101 of the Omnibus Public Safety and Justice Amendment Act of 2009, effective December 10, 2009 (D.C. Law 18-88; D.C. Official Code § 22-2511), is repealed.

(b) The License to Carry a Pistol Temporary Amendment Act of 2014, effective May 5, 2015 (D.C. Law 20-169; 61 DCR 11814), is repealed.

Sec. 5. Rules, orders, and administrative actions.

Any rules or orders issued, or administrative actions taken, under the authority of the License to Carry a Pistol Second Emergency Amendment Act of 2014, effective January 6, 2015 (D.C. Act 20-564; 62 DCR 866), are affirmed and ratified and shall remain in effect until

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repealed or superseded, and the authority for such rules or orders issued, or administrative actions taken, shall have not have lapsed during the period of time which elapsed from April 7, 2015, to the effective date of this act.

Sec. 6. Applicability.

This act shall apply as of April 7, 2015.

Sec. 7. Fiscal impact statement.

The Council adopts the fiscal impact statement in the committee report for the License to Carry a Pistol Amendment Act of 2014, enacted on February 6, 2015 (D.C. Act 20-621; 62 DCR 1944), as the fiscal impact statement required by section 602(c)(3) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act, approved December 24, 1973 (87 Stat. 813; D.C. Official Code § 1-206.02(c)(3)).

Sec. 8. Effective date.

This act shall take effect following approval by the Mayor (or in the event of veto by the Mayor, action by the Council to override the veto), and shall remain in effect for no longer than 90 days, as provided for emergency acts of the Council of the District of Columbia in section 412(a) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act, approved December 24, 1973 (87 Stat. 788; D.C. Official Code § 1-204.12(a)).

This bill also raises the maximum annual income of an elderly or tenant with a disability who is exempt from these housing provider petitions from \$40,000 to \$50,000. Additionally, the bill prohibits rent increases whenever a housing provider has failed to: (1) provide proper notice to elderly and tenants with disabilities about their eligibility for the lower cap on an annual rent increase, or (2) where a non-resident owner has failed to appoint and maintain a registered agent in the District. Finally, the bill permits a tenant to establish elderly or disability status by presenting to a housing provider a completed government registration form, along with the minimum information necessary to demonstrate status qualification.

The Chief Procurement Officer (CPO) of the District of Columbia, pursuant to the authority set forth in section 1106 of the Procurement Practices Reform Act of 2010, effective April 8, 2011 (D.C. Official Code § 2-361.06 (2012 Repl.)), hereby gives notice of the adoption, on an emergency basis, of an amendment to Section 3205 of Chapter 32 (Contract Financing and Funding) of Title 27 (Contracts and Procurement) of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations (DCMR).

This amendment adds a new paragraph (s) to Subsection 3205.1, which permits the Chief Procurement Officer to authorize advance payments to a provider of goods or services for the Emancipation Day Parade and activities associated with the celebration and commemoration of District of Columbia Emancipation Day.

The CPO gave notice of her intent to adopt these rules on April 13, 2015, and the emergency and proposed rules were published in the *D.C. Register* on April 24, 2015, at 62 DCR 5208. No comments were received and no changes have been made to the text of the rules as published. The CPO took final action to adopt these rules on May 27, 2015 and they will be effective upon publication.

Chapter 32, CONTRACT FINANCING AND FUNDING, of Title 27 DCMR, CONTRACTS AND PROCUREMENT, is amended as follows:

Section 3205, ADVANCE PAYMENTS, Subsection 3205.1, is amended by adding a new paragraph (s) to read as follows:

- (s) Notwithstanding paragraphs (a) through (g) above, the contracting officer may authorize advance payments to a provider of goods or services for the Emancipation Day Parade and activities associated with the celebration and commemoration of District of Columbia Emancipation Day if the contracting officer determines that the advance payment is in the best interest of the District.

OFFICE OF THE STATE SUPERINTENDENT OF EDUCATION

NOTICE OF FINAL RULEMAKING

The State Superintendent of Education, pursuant to Sections 5(a)(1) and (e)(1) of the District of Columbia College Access Act, approved November 12, 1999, (Pub. L. 106-98; D.C. Official Code § 38-2702(f), and §§ 38-2704(a)(1) and (e))(2012 Repl.); Section 3(b)(11) of the State Education Office Establishment Act of 2000, effective October 21, 2000 (D.C. Law 13-176; D.C. Official Code § 38-2602(b)(11) (2012 Repl. & 2014 Supp.)); and Mayor's Order 2000-138, dated September 7, 2000, hereby gives notice of her intent to amend Section 7004 (Eligibility Determination) of Chapter 70 (Tuition Assistance Grant Program) of Title 29 (Public Welfare) of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations (DCMR), effective on the date of this notice in the *D.C. Register*.

The purpose of the rulemaking is to allow the program to send all applicant status notification, including eligibility and ineligibility letters, to applicants via email. By permitting the D.C. TAG program to send written notifications of applicant status via email, as opposed to sending it through regular mail, the proposed rules allow the program to save money and time, and ensure that applicants are made aware of their tuition assistance status as soon as possible and can plan accordingly.

Proposed regulations were published in the *D.C. Register* on January 9, 2015, at 62 DCR 361. The comment period officially closed on February 9, 2015, with OSSE having received generally supportive comments from one individual member of the community who was not commenting on behalf of or representing any stakeholders. The Office of the State Superintendent of Education has made one clarification amendment, which the Office of the Attorney General determined was non-substantive in nature and therefore did not necessitate re-proposal. Subsection 7004.2 is amended by striking the phrase "listed on the student's application as schools the student is most likely to attend by providing a list of eligible students to the institution" and inserting the phrase "that the student lists on the application." This amendment was made in response to a comment requesting clarification as to whether OSSE would send notification that the applicant is eligible for D.C. TAG to all the schools listed on the student's application.

In addition, the commenter asked OSSE to confirm that communication sent to students via email did not differ from the same communication sent via letter. OSSE affirms that the communication sent via email completely mirrors the communication sent via letter. Students even have the option to print the email in letter format. Finally, the commenter noted that if OSSE is proposing to send ineligibility notices via email, the applicant should be properly notified of their appeal rights. OSSE also affirms that applicants receiving ineligibility notices via email or letter are fully notified of their appeal rights. These final rules were adopted as final on June 3, 2015 and will be effective upon publication of this notice in the *D.C. Register*.

Chapter 70, TUITION ASSISTANCE GRANT PROGRAM, of Title 29 DCMR, PUBLIC WELFARE, is amended as follows:

Subsection 7004.2 of Section 7004, Eligibility Determination, is amended to read as follows:

7004 ELIGIBILITY DETERMINATION

...

7004.2 The Grant Program Office shall send a written notification to the applicant informing him or her of their eligibility to receive tuition assistance. Effective April 1, 2015, the written notification shall be sent to the email address provided by the applicant, or to the applicant's mailing address on file, if an email address has not been provided or if the Grant Program Office receives notice that the email address provided is incorrect or inactive. Additionally, all applicant status notifications and other communications to the applicant from the Grant Program Office may be sent via email. In addition, if the student is determined to be eligible for the tuition assistance, the Grant Program Office will inform the institution that the student lists on the application.

Law 6-42; D.C. Official Code § 2-1801.04(a)(1) (2012 Repl.)), Sections 211 and 219 of the Sustainable Urban Agriculture Apiculture Act of 2012, effective April 20, 2013 (D.C. Law 19-262; D.C. Official Code §§ 8-1825.01 and 8-1825.09 (2013 Repl.)), as amended by Title IV, Subtitle B of the Sustainable D.C. Omnibus Amendment Act of 2014, effective December 17, 2014 (D.C. Law 20-142; 61 DCR 8045 (August 8, 2014)), the District Department of the Environment Establishment Act of 2005, effective February 15, 2006 (D.C. Law 16-51; D.C. Official Code §§ 8-151.01 *et seq.* (2013 Repl.)), and Mayor's Order 2006-61, dated June 14, 2006, hereby gives notice of the intent to adopt the following amendments to Chapter 36 (Department of Health (DOH) Infractions) of Title 16 (Consumers, Commercial Practices, and Civil Infractions) of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations (DCMR), in not less than thirty (30) days.

Pursuant to § 104(a)(1) of the Department of Consumer and Regulatory Affairs Civil Infractions Act of 1985, effective October 5, 1985 (D.C. Law 6-42; D.C. Official Code § 2-1801.04(a)(1) (2012 Repl.)), the proposed rules will be submitted to the Council of the District of Columbia for review and approval. The rule will become effective upon Council approval, or thirty (30) days after submission if the Council has not disapproved the proposed rulemaking, and publication of the final rules in the *D.C. Register*.

These rules will add a new Section 4017, Apiculture Infractions, to Title 16 of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations, by adding to the schedule of fines for violations in 21 DCMR Chapter 19, related to urban apiculture. The fines shall be scheduled as Class 4 infractions.

Chapter 36, DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH (DOH) INFRACTIONS, of Title 16 DCMR, CONSUMERS, COMMERCIAL PRACTICES, AND CIVIL INFRACTIONS, is amended as follows:

A new Section 4017 is added to read as follows:

4017 APICULTURE INFRACTIONS

4017.1 [RESERVED]

4017.2 [RESERVED]

4017.3 [RESERVED]

4017.4 Violation of any of the following provisions shall be a Class 4 infraction:

- (a) 19 DCMR § 1520.1 (failure to register a colony of bees with the Department);

- (b) 19 DCMR § 1523.1 (failure to obtain a permit prior to transporting a colony, portion of a colony, bees on combs, empty used combs, or used hives into the District);
- (c) 19 DCMR § 1523.3 (failure to obtain a Certificate of Apiary Inspection from the Department prior to taking any colony, portion of a colony, bees on combs, empty used combs, or used hives out of the District);
- (d) 19 DCMR § 1524.2 (failure to keep bees in hives with removable combs);
- (e) 19 DCMR § 1524.3 (failure to maintain hive in sound condition);
- (f) 19 DCMR § 1524.4 (failure to maintain adequate space in the hive to prevent overcrowding and deter swarming);
- (g) 19 DCMR § 1524.5 (failure to provide colony with a convenient, adequate, and constant source of water);
- (h) 19 DCMR § 1524.6 (failure to promptly remediate a bee swarm);
- (i) 19 DCMR § 1525.1 (failure to locate a hive as required from a property line);
- (j) 19 DCMR § 1525.1d (failure to secure annual written approval from neighbors within 30 feet of the proposed hive when hive distance requirements aren't met)
- (k) 19 DCMR § 1525.2 (failure to provide an adequate flyway barrier);
- (l) 19 DCMR § 1525.3 (failure to obtain written permission from the Department to keep more than four (4) hives on any one-quarter acre lot (10,890 square feet));
- (m) 19 DCMR § 1526.2 (violation of the ban on the keeping of Africanized bees);
- (n) 19 DCMR § 1526.3 (failure to re-queen a colony with a marked queen in a colony that exhibits unusual aggressive characteristics);
- (o) 19 DCMR § 1527.1 (failure to take measures to control the spread of bee disease);
- (p) 19 DCMR § 1527.2 (failure to quarantine a colony that is suspected to have American foulbrood or other bee disease that may pose a risk to the colony, environment, or public health);

- (q) 19 DCMR § 1527.3 (failure to notify the Department of a quarantined colony);
- (r) 19 DCMR § 1527.4 (removing bees, colonies, and equipment from a quarantined area); or
- (s) 19 DCMR § 1527.8 (failure to properly destroy a colony with American foulbrood or any untreatable disease).

NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULEMAKING

Urban Agriculture: Apiculture Regulations

The Director of the District Department of the Environment (Department), in accordance with the authority set forth in the District Department of the Environment Establishment Act of 2005, effective February 15, 2006 (D.C. Law 16-51; D.C. Official Code §§ 8-151.01 *et seq.* (2013 Repl.)), Sections 211 and 219 of the Sustainable Urban Agriculture Apiculture Act of 2012, effective April 20, 2013 (D.C. Law 19-262; D.C. Official Code §§ 8-1825.01 and 8-1825.09 (2013 Repl.)), as amended by Title IV, Subtitle B of the Sustainable D.C. Omnibus Amendment Act of 2014, effective December 17, 2014 (D.C. Law 20-142; 61 DCR 8045 (August 8, 2014)), and Mayor's Order 2015-068, dated February 4, 2015, hereby gives notice to amend Chapter 15 (Fish and Wildlife) of Title 19 (Amusements, Parks, and Recreation) of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations (DCMR), in not less than thirty (30) days from publication of this notice in the *D.C. Register*.

The purpose of this rulemaking is to require registration of bee colonies kept in the District, and permits for transportation of bees on combs, empty used combs, used hives, or other used apiary equipment into and out of the District. The District has a growing number of beekeepers. Currently, honey bee colonies are only permitted under very limited conditions, although they are allowed in equally dense cities, such as New York City and Chicago. With a wide variety of vegetation grown by residents in their yards and urban green spaces, cities provide an excellent foraging environment for honey bees. As urban agriculture continues to grow, residents can benefit from the keeping of honey bees in the District, as honey bees are beneficial to home garden vegetable and fruit production. This regulation promotes the raising of honey bees and expands the District's authority to regulate beekeeping, refines the responsibilities of beekeepers, manages colony disposition, and regulates the management of colony density and distance from property lines.

Chapter 15, FISH AND WILDLIFE, of Title 19 DCMR, AMUSEMENTS, PARKS, AND RECREATION, is amended to add new Sections 1520 – 1530, and to amend Section 1599 as follows:

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1520 URBAN APICULTURE: GENERAL PROVISIONS

1520.1 No person shall keep a colony of bees in the District unless the colony is registered annually with the District Department of the Environment (Department).

1520.2 A person may keep a colony in the District if the colony is established and maintained in a manner consistent with the provisions of this chapter.

1520.3 A fee shall be assessed per apiary.

1521 URBAN APICULTURE: COLONY REGISTRATION

1521.1 All colonies shall be registered within thirty (30) days of establishment of a colony.

1521.2 To register a colony, the beekeeper shall provide the Department with the following information:

- (a) The beekeeper's name, street address, phone number, and e-mail address;
- (b) The name, phone number, e-mail address, and address of the owner or manager of the property where the apiary is located;
- (c) Written permission from the property owner or property manager to establish a colony on a multi-unit building or property, if the beekeeper is not the owner of the property where the colony is to be kept;
- (d) The apiary location, including a street address and global positioning system coordinates;
- (e) A photo of the apiary in its entirety;
- (f) An emergency contact name and phone number; and
- (g) Documentation that the conditions of Section 1525 of this chapter (Apiary Density and Distance) have been met.

1521.3 By registering a colony, the beekeeper is agreeing to provide access for the inspection of the apiary by the Department.

1521.4 A beekeeper registering a colony of bees pursuant to this section shall agree to defend and indemnify and hold harmless the District against any and all claims arising out of the keeping of bees and any other activities related to any permit or registration pursuant to this section.

1521.5 A beekeeper shall notify the Department within ten (10) business days of any changes to the information in the colony registration.

1522 URBAN APICULTURE: FEES

1522.1 A fee of \$10.00 per apiary shall be paid annually to the District Department of the Environment.

1523 URBAN APICULTURE: TRANSPORTATION PERMIT

1523.1 No person shall transport into the District, any colony, portion of a colony, bees on combs, empty used combs, used hives, or any other used apiary appliance without first obtaining a permit from the Department.

1523.2 To obtain a permit to transport a colony or portion of a colony, bees on combs, empty used combs, or used hives into the District, the beekeeper shall provide the Department with the following information:

- (a) The name, phone number, e-mail address, and street address of the beekeeper;
- (b) A description of the item(s), quantity, and origin of item(s) to be brought into the District; and
- (c) A certificate of inspection performed by the state of origin within the previous ninety (90) days.

1523.3 No person shall transport out of the District any colony, portion of a colony, bees on combs, empty used combs, or used hives without first notifying the state of destination, and obtaining a Certificate of Apiary Inspection from the Department.

1523.4 To obtain a Certificate of Apiary Inspection, a person shall provide the Department with the following information at least thirty (30) days prior to transport:

- (a) Name, phone number, e-mail address, and street address of beekeeper; and
- (b) Apiary item, quantity leaving the District, destination, date of movement, and reason for movement.

1523.5 The Department shall inspect the colony for disease prior to issuing a Certificate of Apiary Inspection.

1524 URBAN APICULTURE: BEEKEEPER RESPONSIBILITIES

1524.1 All colonies are subject to inspection by the District Department of the Environment (Department).

- 1524.2 The beekeeper shall keep the colony in a Langstroth-type hive, Top Bar hive, or other hive with removable combs.
- 1524.3 The beekeeper shall maintain the hive in sound condition.
- 1524.4 The beekeeper shall maintain adequate space in the hive to prevent overcrowding and to deter swarming.
- 1524.5 The beekeeper shall provide the colony with a convenient, adequate, and constant source of water to prevent the bees from seeking water from sources where they can be considered a nuisance.
- 1524.6 The beekeeper shall be responsible for the remediation of bee swarms and nuisance conditions.
- 1524.7 In the event that a beekeeper fails to remediate the bee swarm or nuisance condition, the owner of the property on which the colony is located shall be responsible for the remediation, and the beekeeper shall reimburse the property owner for the cost incurred by the remediation.

1525 URBAN APICULTURE: APIARY DENSITY AND DISTANCE

- 1525.1 A hive shall be located at least fifteen feet (15 ft) from a property line, unless one of the following applies:
- (a) A flyway barrier is maintained where the hive is at least five feet (5 ft) from the property line;
 - (b) The hive is located eight feet (8 ft) or more above the grade of the property immediately adjacent;
 - (c) The hive is located on a rooftop and is five feet (5 ft) from the side of the building or structure and at least fifteen feet (15 ft) from the nearest occupied structure, including a roof deck or balcony; or
 - (d) Annual written approval is granted from neighbors whose properties are located within thirty feet (30 ft) of the proposed hive.
- 1525.2 Flyway barriers shall:
- (a) Be at least six feet (6 ft) high at all points;
 - (b) Extend ten feet (10 ft) beyond the hive in each direction;
 - (c) Consist of dense vegetation or a solid barrier; and
 - (d) Comply with the requirements of the District of Columbia Building Code.
- 1525.3 A beekeeper shall not keep more than four (4) hives, unless the property is greater than one-quarter acre (10,890 sq. ft.)

- 1525.4 A beekeeper may add an additional four (4) hives for each additional quarter acre (10,980 sq. ft.) of land.
- 1525.5 Upon written request, the Department may grant a beekeeper permission to keep more than four (4) hives, if the beekeeper has at least three (3) years of documented beekeeping experience and one of the following:
- (a) The beekeeper has received written permission from all neighbors with properties located within thirty feet (30 ft) of the proposed hive site;
 - (b) The hives are located on or adjacent to non-residential, agricultural, industrial, or undeveloped land;
 - (c) The hives are used at a school or other institution for educational or research purposes; or
 - (d) The hives are being held temporarily during an emergency or hive relocation for no more than thirty (30) days, unless a written extension is granted by the Department.
- 1525.6 Documented beekeeping experience shall include the following:
- (a) Registration as a beekeeper in the District or another jurisdiction; or
 - (b) An active membership in a regionally recognized beekeeping association.
- 1525.7 If any of the conditions in Subsection 1525.5 change, the Department may rescind approval for more than four (4) hives, giving the beekeeper thirty (30) days to make changes.
- 1526 URBAN APICULTURE: COLONY DISPOSITION**
- 1526.1 A colony shall be selected from honey bee stock bred for gentleness.
- 1526.2 The possession of Africanized bees is prohibited.
- 1526.3 A beekeeper shall promptly re-queen the colony with a marked queen if the colony exhibits unusual aggressive characteristics, such as unprovoked stinging or excessive swarming.
- 1527 URBAN APICULTURE: BEE DISEASE**
- 1527.1 A beekeeper shall take measures to control the spread of bee diseases, including American foulbrood.
- 1527.2 A beekeeper shall quarantine the colony if the colony is suspected of having American foulbrood or other bee disease that may pose a risk to the colony, environment, or public health.

- 1527.3 The beekeeper shall immediately notify the Department of the quarantined colony.
- 1527.4 Bees, colonies, and equipment may not be moved from a quarantined area.
- 1527.5 The quarantine will remain in effect until terminated in writing by the Department.
- 1527.6 The Department may investigate to assess the health of a colony. In assessing colony health, the Department shall:
- (a) Consider all evidence obtained or presented; or
 - (b) Request a test from the United States Department of Agriculture Bee Research Laboratory.
- 1527.7 The Department shall provide the results of the health assessment of the colony to the beekeeper by personal service, posting, or prepaid mail.
- 1527.8 A colony with an untreatable disease, like American foulbrood, shall be destroyed and the hive and equipment incinerated. The beekeeper must contact the District of Columbia Fire and Emergency Medical Services Department (FEMS) Fire Marshal for an open burning permit and instructions prior to incinerating a diseased hive.
- 1527.9 The Department may order a beekeeper to take measures to control the spread of bee diseases.
- 1527.10 The Department shall treat or destroy the bees, hives, and honey of a beekeeper who fails to take measures ordered by the Department to control or eradicate bee disease.
- 1527.11 The Department may require the beekeeper or property owner to reimburse the costs it incurs to eradicate bee disease.
- 1527.12 The beekeeper may contest the health assessment and the measures ordered by the Department to control or eradicate the bee disease by requesting a hearing with the District of Columbia Office of Administrative Hearings (OAH).

1528 URBAN APICULTURE: DENIAL, SUSPENSION, MODIFICATION, OR REVOCATION OF REGISTRATION

- 1528.1 The Department may deny, suspend, modify, or revoke the registration issued pursuant to § 1521, if the beekeeper has:
- (a) Threatened the public health, safety, or welfare, or the environment;

- (b) Violated or threatened violation of law, and the rules set forth in Sections 1520 to 1527 of this chapter, or the terms and conditions of the registration; or
- (a) Made a false statement or misrepresentation material to the issuance, modification, or renewal of a registration.

1528.2 The notice of proposed denial, suspension, modification, or revocation shall be in writing and shall include the following:

- (a) The name and address of the beekeeper and the apiary;
- (b) A statement of the action or proposed action and the effective date or proposed effective date and duration of the denial, suspension, modification, or revocation;
- (c) The grounds upon which the Department is proposing to deny, suspend, modify, or revoke the registration;
- (d) Notice that the beekeeper has a right to request an administrative hearing before the OAH, in accordance with Rules of Practice and Procedure of OAH set forth in Chapter 28 of Title 1 of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations; and
- (e) Information notifying the respondent of any scheduled hearing date or of any actions necessary to obtain a hearing, and the consequences of failure to comply with the suspension or immediate revocation, if applicable.

1528.3 The beekeeper shall have fifteen (15) calendar days from the date of service of the notice to deny, suspend, modify, or revoke the registration, to request a hearing with the OAH to show cause why the registration should not be denied, suspended, modified, or revoked.

1528.4 The Department may serve a notice of denial, suspension, modification, or revocation in addition to any other administrative or judicial penalty, sanction, or remedy authorized by law.

1528.5 The Department shall not reissue a registration to any person whose registration has been revoked until the applicant has submitted a new application, and complies with the requirements in Sections 1520 to 1527.

1528.6 An appeal to OAH pursuant to this section shall be subject to the requirements of Section 1530.

1529 URBAN APICULTURE: ENFORCEMENT AND PENALTIES

- 1529.1 A person who violates any provision in §§ 1520 to 1529 shall be subject to civil fines and penalties under the schedule of fines for a class 4 infraction, pursuant to the Department of Consumer and Regulatory Affairs Civil Infractions Act of 1985 (D.C. Official Code §§ 2-1801, *et seq.*), and the enforcement procedures in this section.
- 1529.2 Each day that a violation occurs is a separate offense.
- 1529.3 Each colony shall constitute a single offense or count.
- 1529.4 The Department may also pursue administrative enforcement through:
- (a) Notices of violation;
 - (b) Compliance orders;
 - (c) Notices of violation combined with an immediate compliance order;
 - (d) Denial, modification, suspension, or revocation of registration;
 - (e) Notices of infraction; or
 - (f) Any other order necessary to protect public health, safety, or welfare or the environment.
- 1529.5 An administrative enforcement action shall:
- (a) Include a statement of the facts and the nature of the alleged violation;
 - (b) Allow a reasonable time for compliance with the order, consistent with the likelihood of any harm and the need to protect the public health, safety, or welfare or the environment;
 - (c) Advise the respondent that the respondent has the right to request an administrative hearing and at the respondent's expense, the right to legal representation at the hearing;
 - (d) Inform the respondent of any scheduled hearing date, or of any actions necessary to obtain a hearing, and the consequences of failure to comply with the compliance order or failure to request a hearing;
 - (e) State the action that the respondent is required to take, or the activity or activities that the respondent is required to cease to comply with the order; and

- (f) State that civil infraction fines, penalties, or costs may be assessed for failure to comply with the order.

1530 URBAN APICULTURE: ADMINISTRATIVE APPEALS AND JUDICIAL REVIEW

- 1530.1 A person adversely affected or aggrieved by an enforcement action of the Department shall exhaust administrative remedies by timely filing an administrative appeal with, and requesting a hearing, the OAH, established pursuant to the Office of Administrative Hearings Establishment Act of 2001, effective March 6, 2002 (D.C. Law 14-76; DC official Code §§ 2-1831.01 *et seq.*), or OAH's successor.
- 1530.2 The appeal to OAH shall be filed in writing within the following time period:
- (a) Within fifteen (15) calendar days of service of the notice of the action; or
- (b) Another period of time stated specifically in the section for an identified Department action.
- 1530.3 OAH shall:
- (a) Resolve an appeal or a notice of infraction by:
- (1) Affirming, modifying, or setting aside the Department's action complained of, in whole or in part;
- (2) Remanding for Department action or further proceedings, consistent with OAH's order; or
- (3) Providing such relief as the governing statutes, regulations and rules support.
- (b) Act with the same jurisdiction, power, and authority as the Department may have for the matter before OAH; and
- (c) By its final decision, render a final agency action which will be subject to judicial review.
- 1530.4 The filing of an administrative appeal shall not in itself stay enforcement of an action except that a person may request a stay according to the rules of OAH.
- 1530.5 The burden of production in an appeal of an action of the Department shall be allocated to the person who appeals the action, except that it shall be allocated:

- (a) To the Department when a party challenges the Department's denial, suspension, modification, or revocation of a registration;
- (b) To the party who asserts an affirmative defense; or
- (c) To the party who asserts an exception to the requirements or prohibitions of a statute or rule.

1530.6 The final OAH decision on an administrative appeal shall thereafter constitute the final, reviewable action of the Department, and shall be subject to the applicable statutes and rules of judicial review for OAH final orders.

1530.7 Judicial review of a final OAH decision shall not be done de novo, but shall be a review of the administrative record alone and shall not duplicate agency proceedings or consider additional evidence.

1599 DEFINITIONS

Africanized bee - a hybrid variety of *Apis mellifera* produced by the cross-breeding of the aggressive African honey bee *Apis mellifera scutellata* with a European honey bee subspecies.

American foulbrood – also known as Paenibacillus larvae is a rod-shaped, spore-forming bacterium that affects bee larvae

Apiary - a place where a colony is kept.

Bee disease - an abnormal condition resulting from action by a parasite, predator, or infectious agent.

Beekeeper - a person who maintains a honey bee colony.

Brood - the embryo and egg, larva, and pupa stages of a bee.

Certificate of Apiary Inspection - certification required to transport a colony, portion of a colony, bees on combs, empty used combs, or used hives out of the District.

Colony - a hive and its equipment and appurtenances, including bees, brood, comb, pollen, and honey.

Comb - the assemblage of cells containing a living stage of a bee at a time prior to emergence as an adult.

Department - the District Department of the Environment.

Director - the Director of the District Department of the Environment.

Domestic animal - any animal that is kept by humans for food, work, or as a pet that depends on a human for food, shelter, and water. Including, but not limited to dogs, cats, sheep, chickens, goats, horses, rabbits, and ferrets.

Flway barrier - barrier to encourage bees leaving and entering their colony to fly upward, minimizing unwanted human contact.

Hive - a container used for the housing of a colony.

Honey bee or bee - *Apis mellifera* or another species designated as suitable for an urban environment by the Director of the District Department of the Environment.

Langstroth-type hive - standard bee hive used in beekeeping with removable four-sided frames.

Multi-unit building - a building with at least four (4) separate housing units.

Non-residential property - any property which does not house a residential building, including but not limited to office or retail buildings, shopping centers, industrial parks, churches, hotels, school learning centers, hospitals, sports arenas, retail stores, and transportation terminals.

Nuisance - conditions such as aggressive bee behavior, colony placement or movement that interferes with pedestrian traffic or causes a substantial or unreasonable interference with the right to property, comfort, or safety of persons residing on or adjacent to the hive premises, and overcrowded, deceased, or abandoned hives.

Person - an individual, partnership, corporation, trust, association, firm, joint stock company, organization, commission, or any other legal entity.

Property - a parcel of land where an apiary is located.

Quarantine - a period of enforced isolation to contain and prevent the spread of disease. During this time bees, bee colonies, or bee equipment may not be moved from the quarantined property without the permission of the Department.

Resident - a person who resides in the District of Columbia.

Top bar hives - a bee hive that consists of an array of hexagonal cells with bars that honey bees attach and hang wax comb.

Undeveloped land - idle land that has not been improved and is not in the process of being improved, and has no structures, facilities, or improvements intended for human use or occupancy. This includes land used exclusively for streets, highways, or commercial agriculture.

All persons desiring to comment on the proposed District of Columbia Sustainable Urban Agriculture Apiculture regulations should file comments in writing not later than thirty (30) days after the publication of this notice in the *D.C. Register*. All comments will be treated as public documents and will be made available for public viewing on the Department's website at www.ddoe.dc.gov. DEPARTMENT OF YOUTH REHABILITATION SERVICES

NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULEMAKING

The Director of the District of Columbia Department of Youth Rehabilitation Services (“DYRS”), pursuant to the authority set forth in Section 108(h)(3) of the Department of Youth Rehabilitation Services Establishment Act of 2004, effective April 12, 2005 (D.C. Law 15-335; D.C. Official Code § 2-1515.08(h)(3) (2012 Repl.)), hereby gives notice of intent to amend Chapter 12 (Community Placement of Youth) of Title 29 (Public Welfare) of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations (DCMR).

The purpose of the rulemaking is as follows:

- (1) To clarify that these regulations do not limit DYRS’ authority to act in accordance with those statutorily mandated duties and responsibilities related to ensuring the safety and well-being of youth in DYRS custody enumerated in D.C. Official Code §§ 2-1515 *et seq.*;
- (2) To change the title of “Community Release Agreement” to “Community Placement Agreement,” consistent with current DYRS practice;
- (3) To add “responsible adult” in every section referencing parent, guardian, or responsible adult;
- (4) To add and remove crimes in Subsection 1202.2 to ensure consistency with legal definitions;
- (5) To give the DYRS Director the final approval of all placement decisions made by the Community Status Review Hearing Officer;
- (6) To delete wording related to appealing the DYRS Director’s final written determination;
- (7) To add wording allowing a secure detention order from the court to establish probable cause to securely hold a youth pending a community status review hearing;
- (9) To add a section on waivers;
- (10) To add a section to address hearing procedures in those instances when DYRS is seeking to remove a youth from the community for reasons other than violations of the Community Placement Agreement.

The Director also gives notice of the intent to adopt these rules as final, in not less than thirty (30) days after publication of this notice in the *D.C. Register*.

Chapter 12, COMMUNITY PLACEMENT OF YOUTH, of Title 29 DCMR, PUBLIC WELFARE, is amended as follows:

1200 GENERAL PROVISIONS

- 1200.1 The Department of Youth Rehabilitation Services (DYRS) shall administer community service programs for delinquents and persons in need of supervision (PINS) who are committed to the legal custody of DYRS by the D.C. Superior Court.

- 1200.2 The provisions of this chapter apply to the supervision and treatment of youth in community placements including: group homes, therapeutic group homes, the youth's own home, a foster home, or similar community placements.
- 1200.3 DYRS retains jurisdiction over the community placement status of youth committed to the agency's custody until one (1) of the following occurs:
- (a) The commitment is terminated by DYRS;
 - (b) The commitment expires; or
 - (c) The Court terminates its jurisdiction.
- 1200.4 Nothing in these regulations shall be deemed to limit DYRS' authority to act in accordance with those statutorily mandated responsibilities outlined in the Department of Youth Rehabilitation Services Establishment Act of 2005, effective April 12, 2005 (D.C. Law 15-335; D.C. Official Code §§ 2-1515.01 *et seq.*), and specifically Section 2(h) of the Act (D.C. Official Code § 2-1515.05(h)), which authorizes DYRS to take any action necessary to ensure the safety and well-being of youth in the Department's custody. DYRS shall have sole discretion to make specific placement decisions for youth committed to its custody. *In the Matter of J.M.W.*, 411 A.2d 345 (D.C. 1980) and *In Re P.S.*, 821 A.2d 905 (D.C. 2003).
- 1200.5 The community placement program shall be an alternative to placement in a secure facility. The program consists of placing youth in the least restrictive environment consistent with the youth's needs and public safety while being closely supervised by trained DYRS staff.
- 1200.6 Not all youth will benefit from a community placement, and a certain number will commit additional offenses or breaches of their Community Placement Agreement that warrant a thorough review of their community status. In addition, some youth may need a review of their community status for reasons other than for behavior contrary to public safety or breaches of the terms of their Community Placement Agreement.
- 1200.7 This chapter establishes a review process to determine whether continued community placement best services the youth's needs and public safety.
- 1200.8 DYRS shall follow the procedures set forth in this chapter when reviewing a youth's community placement.
- 1200.9 This chapter sets forth the process for:
- (a) Reviewing the status of youth in community placement; and
 - (b) Determining whether to place a youth in a secure facility or another more restrictive placement;

- (c) Permitting the youth to remain in the community under conditions articulated in a revised Community Placement Agreement; or
- (d) Temporarily removing a youth from the community without a hearing with the youth's consent when necessary for safety reasons or while awaiting placement in another facility or setting.

1200.10 A youth who is non-English speaking, deaf, or because of a hearing or other communication impediment cannot readily understand or communicate by spoken English may request that the agency appoint a qualified interpreter. Upon such a request, the agency will provide a qualified interpreter.

1200.11 A parent, guardian, or responsible adult who is non-English speaking, deaf, or because of a hearing or other communication impediment cannot readily understand or communicate by spoken English may request that the agency appoint a qualified interpreter. The agency's decision whether or not to appoint a qualified interpreter does not provide the parent, guardian, or responsible adult any rights or remedies not otherwise available by law.

1200.12 Unless the delay would result in undue prejudice to the youth, a failure of DYRS to meet any of the deadlines established within any part of these regulations shall not affect the agency's decision to conduct a community status review and/or community status review hearing.

1201 COMMUNITY PLACEMENT AGREEMENTS

1201.1 DYRS shall only place youth in a community placement after a determination that such a placement is the least restrictive environment consistent with public safety and with the Department of Youth Rehabilitation Services Establishment Act of 2005, effective April 12, 2005 (D.C. Law 15-335; D.C. Official Code §§ 2-1515.01 *et seq.*), and D.C. Official Code § 16-2301.02.

1201.2 DYRS case workers shall work closely with youth in a community placement and their families and/or responsible adult(s) to provide those services necessary for rehabilitation to take place.

1201.3 Each youth shall adhere to the specific terms of his/her Community Placement Agreement (CPA). The terms shall include, but not be limited to, the following:

- (a) Attending school or work regularly;
- (b) Meeting curfews;
- (c) Refraining from the illegal use of controlled substances;
- (d) Complying with all federal, state and local laws, rules and regulations; and
- (e) Abiding by all court orders and directives of DYRS case management staff.

- 1201.4 The DYRS Case Worker shall thoroughly explain the terms of the CPA to the youth and the youth shall sign the CPA as a condition of DYRS placing the youth in the community.
- 1201.5 The DYRS Case Worker shall make reasonable efforts to discuss the agreement with the youth's family or the responsible adult and/or counsel of record.
- 1201.6 Counsel of record or alternate counsel may sign the CPA after consultation with the youth if the parent, guardian or responsible adult is unavailable. Counsel shall not be called as a witness against the youth if the youth is later alleged to have violated the agreement.
- 1201.7 Where the youth's community placement is a private residence, the DYRS Case Worker shall thoroughly explain the terms of the agreement with the youth and his or her parent or guardian if the youth will reside at home or the responsible adult if the youth will reside in an alternate private residence.
- 1201.8 The youth and parent, guardian, or responsible adult shall sign the CPA as a condition of DYRS placing the youth in a private residence.
- 1201.9 The youth shall sign a new CPA whenever the level of restrictiveness is changed. Failure to sign the new CPA will result in a secure placement.
- 1201.10 Failure to comply with terms of the CPA may result in the youth being placed in an alternative community placement and/or the youth's community placement being rescinded.

1202 RESCISSION OF COMMUNITY PLACEMENT STATUS

- 1202.1 DYRS shall hold youth who have entered into a CPA accountable for behavior contrary to public safety or the terms of the CPA.
- 1202.2 DYRS shall initiate a review of a youth's community placement status within three (3) business days of the Agency receiving notification that a committed youth has been arrested and shall convene a Community Status Review Hearing when DYRS becomes aware that a committed youth has been arrested for the commission, attempted commission, or conspiracy to commit any of the following:
- (a) Homicide or assault with intent to commit homicide;
 - (b) Sexual abuse in the 1st or 2nd degree, child sexual abuse, or assault with intent to commit one of these offenses;
 - (c) Robbery, robbery while armed, assault with intent to commit robbery while armed;
 - (d) Carjacking; Armed Carjacking

- (e) Escape;
- (f) Burglary;
- (g) Kidnapping;
- (h) Arson;
- (i) Malicious disfigurement; or
- (j) Mayhem.

1202.3 DYRS shall initiate a review of the youth’s community status within three (3) business days of learning of any of the below violations and may convene a Community Status Review Hearing if:

- (a) DYRS becomes aware that a youth has violated two or more terms of his/her CPA;
- (b) DYRS becomes aware that a youth has violated a single term of his/her CPA at least twice;
- (c) DYRS becomes aware that a youth has unjustifiably absconded from the placement specified in the CPA;
- (d) The DYRS Case Worker determines, based upon a complete evaluation of the youth's performance under the CPA, that he or she should initiate the Community Status Review process; or
- (e) A youth is unsuccessfully discharged from a Community Placement.

1203 COMMUNITY STATUS REVIEW

1203.1 The DYRS Case Worker responsible for the youth who is charged with any offense cited in Subsection 1202.2, shall process the documentation for a Community Status Review Hearing within five (5) business days of notification of the youth being arrested or the latest CPA violation.

1203.2 During the five (5) business days mentioned in Subsection 1203.1, the DYRS Case Worker shall complete all documentation, including a recommendation for the Community Status Review Hearing, and meet with the appropriate supervisor.

1203.3 If a police report is provided, it shall also be included in the transmitted documentation. If the case worker does not have a copy of a police report, the documentation shall indicate the source of the information upon which the Case Worker is relying.

1203.4 The DYRS Case Worker Supervisor or designee shall review services provided to the youth and the basis for the Case Worker’s recommendation.

- 1203.5 The DYRS Case Worker Supervisor or designee, after his or her review, may recommend that:
- (a) The DYRS Case Worker implement additional services;
 - (b) A Team Decision Making (TDM) Meeting be held; or
 - (c) The youth's status be reviewed at a Community Status Review Hearing.
- 1203.6 The DYRS Case Worker Supervisor or designee shall transmit all of the documentation to the Case Management Division Program Manager or designee. This documentation shall detail the circumstances of the arrest, charges, or violations of the Community Release Agreement including:
- (a) The date and time of the offense(s) or violation(s);
 - (b) The report of the arresting officer, if applicable;
 - (c) The nature and seriousness of the charge(s), arrest, or CPA violation(s);
 - (d) The progress of the youth in community placement before the offense or CPA violation took place;
 - (e) A copy of the CPA with required signatures; and
 - (f) The Case Worker's effort to identify and secure additional or alternative services that might be provided to the youth in the community, if applicable.
- 1203.7 The DYRS Case Worker Supervisor or designee shall send the documentation to the Case Management Division Program Manager or designee explaining the decision to convene a Community Status Review Hearing within one (1) business day of the DYRS Case Worker meeting with the appropriate supervisor. The DYRS Case Worker shall place the documentation in the youth's case file. No more than six (6) business days should pass between the time DYRS is informed of the charge or violation and when the case manager transmits the documentation to the Case Management Division Program Manager or designee.

1204 EMERGENCY REMOVALS

- 1204.1 The following procedures shall apply to Emergency Removals Without the Youth's Consent:
- (a) The DYRS Case Worker shall remove the youth from his or her placement, and place the youth in a secure DYRS facility, emergency shelter, in-patient drug treatment or appropriate medical or mental health facility when a youth in a community placement presents a clear and present danger to himself, herself, or others, or an imminent risk of flight and requires immediate removal from a community placement.

- (b) The DYRS Case Worker shall request a custody order from the court for the youth so that the Metropolitan Police Department (“MPD”) has the authority to take the youth into custody if the youth is unwilling to be removed by the DYRS Case Worker.
- (c) The Case Worker shall provide the Head of the Case Management Division or designee with a summary of the basis for the youth’s removal.
- (d) The Head of the Case Management Division or designee shall make an independent probable cause determination based on the DYRS Case Worker’s documentation within one (1) business day of the youth being removed.
- (e) A court order mandating that a youth be securely detained in a new case establishes probable cause that the youth failed to comply with all federal, state and local laws, rules and regulations as required by the CPA and no additional hearing need be held by DYRS to determine whether the youth violated the terms of his or her CPA. Rather, a hearing will be held only to determine the appropriate level of placement based upon the violation.
- (f) If there is no court order mandating that a youth be securely detained in a new case, a Community Status Review Hearing shall convene within five (5) business days of a youth’s emergency removal if the Head of the Case Management Division or designee determines that there is probable cause to believe that the youth violated the terms of his or her CPA and that he or she is a clear and present danger and requires immediate removal from a community placement.
- (g) DYRS shall provide notice of the Community Status Review Hearing on level of placement to the youth and counsel of record, or if counsel of record is unavailable, then alternate counsel, in any manner reasonably calculated to put the receiving party on notice, including, but not limited to, actual notice; notice by hand-delivery; electronic mail; facsimile; registered or certified mail, overnight express delivery; or return receipt requested.
- (h) DYRS shall return the youth to his or her community placement if the Head of the Case Management Division or designee determines that there is no probable cause to securely confine the youth.
- (i) The Case Worker may request a Community Status Review Hearing in accordance with Subsection 1202.3, in cases where the Head of Case Management or designee has found that there is not a need for the youth to be immediately removed from a community placement pending a community status review hearing.
- (j) Where DYRS has placed a youth with a parent(s), guardian(s), or responsible adult(s), DYRS shall make all reasonable efforts to provide

notice of the Community Status Review Hearing to the youth's parent(s), guardian(s), or responsible adult(s).

- (k) DYRS shall make a note in the youth's case file indicating who provided notice to the youth and counsel, and in what manner such notice was provided.
- (l) DYRS shall notify the Office of the Attorney General, Juvenile Section of the emergency removal and the date and time of the hearing.
- (m) DYRS may continue the hearing for up to an additional five (5) business days if either the counsel of record or alternate counsel or requisite DYRS representative are unavailable at the date and time for which the hearing is scheduled.

1204.2 The following procedures shall apply to Emergency Removals with the Youth's Consent:

- (a) With the consent of a youth who requires in-patient drug treatment, medical or mental health treatment, or who presents a clear and present danger to himself, herself, or others, the DYRS Case Worker shall remove the youth from his or her placement, and place the youth in a secure DYRS facility, emergency shelter, in-patient drug treatment or appropriate medical or mental health facility. Youth must be given an opportunity to consult with counsel of record, or alternate counsel, if counsel of record is unavailable prior to signing a written waiver indicating consent.
- (b) If a youth is removed from his or her community placement pursuant to Subsection 1204.2(a), and is admitted to an in-patient drug, medical, mental health facility or similar in-patient facility for treatment, the DYRS Case Worker, the youth, and parent, guardian, or responsible adult, or counsel of record, or alternate counsel, if the youth's counsel of record is unavailable, shall sign a written waiver of a Community Status Review Hearing.
- (c) Waivers should be obtained by the DYRS Case Worker in accordance with those procedures outlined in Subsection 1213.
- (d) The Case Worker shall place the signed waiver form, in the youth's case file.
- (e) Upon the youth's successful discharge from the above-described placement, a youth's community placement status is not revoked. The youth shall:
 - (1) Return to the placement he or she enjoyed immediately prior to the treatment; or

(2) Return to a placement with the same or lower level of restrictiveness.

(f) If the youth is not successfully discharged from the above-described placement, the youth is subject to a review of his/her community placement status and may face rescission of such status.

1205 RECOMMENDATION OF CASE MANAGEMENT DIVISION PROGRAM MANAGER

1205.1 A Case Management Division Program Manager or designee shall review the request for Community Status Review Hearing and accompanying documents, and make an independent decision regarding the need for a hearing.

1205.2 If the Case Management Division Program Manager or designee concurs with the basis for convening a Community Status Review Hearing, he or she may recommend to the Head of the Case Management Division that there is a sufficient basis to schedule a Community Status Review Hearing.

1205.3 If the Case Management Division Program Manager or designee disagrees with the basis for initiating the Community Status Review Hearing, he or she may use discretion to request that the Case Worker convene a Team Decision Making meeting or make referrals for the youth for alternative community services.

1205.4 The Case Management Division Program Manager or designee shall document the basis for the conclusion that he or she reaches under §§ 1205.1 or 1205.2 and shall include that documentation in the youth's case file.

1206 RECOMMENDATION OF DYRS CASE MANAGEMENT DIVISION

1206.1 The final decision to schedule a Community Status Review Hearing shall be made by the Head of the Case Management Division or designee. After receiving the recommendation from the Case Management Division Program Manager or designee, the Head of the Case Management Division or designee shall make a determination. A notation should be made in the youth's record indicating the final decision of the Head of the Case Management Division.

1206.2 If the Head of the Case Management Division or designee concurs, he or she shall contact the Community Status Review Specialist or designee the same business day and follow the procedures set forth in §§ 1207, 1208, 1210 and 1211.

1206.3 If the Head of the Case Management Division or designee disagrees with the recommendation to schedule a Community Status Review Hearing, he or she shall notify the Office of the Attorney General; and in instances of serious charges and emergency removal, the youth and the youth's counsel. After consultation, the Head of the Case Management Division or designee may use his or her discretion to require the Case Worker to convene a Team Decision Making Meeting or implement alternative community services.

1207 NOTICE OF COMMUNITY STATUS REVIEW HEARING

- 1207.1 After receiving the recommendation of the Head of the Case Management Division or designee, an official notice of the time, place and location of the Community Status Review Hearing shall be provided to the youth, the youth's parent(s), guardian(s), or responsible adult(s), and counsel of record, or alternate counsel, if counsel is unavailable, by the Community Status Review Specialist.
- 1207.2 The Community Status Review Specialist or designee shall also send a copy of the police report, if applicable, the CPA, the DYRS Case Worker's recommendation, the decision to proceed with the hearing, and any relevant reports included in the request for a hearing packet to the youth's counsel or representative.
- 1207.3 Upon request of the youth, the counsel of record or alternate counsel may review the youth's case file in accordance with Section 106 of the Department of Youth Rehabilitation Services Establishment Act of 2005, effective April 12, 2005 (D.C. Law 15-335; D.C. Official Code § 2-1515.06), and D.C. Official Code Sections 16-2331, 16-2332 and 16-2333.
- 1207.4 The notice to those specified in Subsection 1207.1 may be made in any manner reasonably calculated to put the receiving party on notice of the hearing, and may include, but is not limited to actual notice; notice by hand-delivery; electronic mail; facsimile; registered or certified mail, overnight express delivery, or return receipt requested.
- 1207.5 DYRS shall make a note in the youth's case file indicating who provided notice to the youth and counsel, and in what manner such notice was provided.
- 1207.6 Notice of any Community Status Review Hearing shall be sent to the Juvenile Section Chief for the Office of the Attorney General when:
- (a) The youth is already committed to DYRS for any felony offense as defined in D.C. Official Code § 23-1331(3) or D.C. Official Code § 23-1331(4); or
 - (b) The youth has been charged with any felony offense as a juvenile or as an adult as defined in D.C. Official Code § 23-1331(3) and D.C. Official Code § 23-1331(4).
- 1207.7 A youth may be represented at the hearing by parents, legal counsel, or any other adult who is not employed by DYRS.
- 1207.8 If a youth requests that counsel be provided, the hearing officer shall review the request and, in its discretion, decide whether counsel will be provided.

- 1207.9 If the hearing officer decides that counsel will not be provided, it shall state its reasons in writing and provide a copy to the youth and his or her parent, guardian, or responsible adult.
- 1207.10 The hearing officer will only consider evidence which is relevant to the charges or violations that have made the hearing necessary and appropriate level of placement.
- 1207.11 The preponderance of the evidence shall be the standard of proof the hearing officer shall use in weighing testimony about the charges or violations.
- 1207.13 After all testimony has been heard, the hearing officer shall weigh the evidence and arguments, if any, and reach a decision.
- 1207.14 If the hearing officer finds that a youth violated his or her CPA, the officer shall consider all relevant information to assist in making a determination as to the appropriate sanction and/or level of placement.

1208 FAILURE TO APPEAR AT A HEARING AND ABSCONDENCE

- 1208.1 After receiving notice in accordance with § 1207, if the youth fails to appear for a Community Status Review Hearing at the stated time and place specified, the DYRS Case Worker responsible for the youth shall do the following:
- (a) Request a custody order for the apprehension and return of the youth to the appropriate facility for failing to comply with official notice to appear at a given time and location;
 - (b) Note in the youth's next progress report that the youth violated the CPA by failing to appear at the hearing; and
 - (c) Begin intensive efforts to locate the youth and return him or her to the appropriate facility. The DYRS Case Manager may ask for police assistance in apprehending the youth.
- 1208.2 After having received notice, in accordance with § 1207, if a youth fails to appear at the stated time and place for a Community Status Review Hearing, the hearing officer shall proceed even in the youth's absence.
- 1208.3 If the hearing officer proceeds with a hearing and rescinds the youth's community status, and if a youth properly requests a second hearing, the hearing officer shall proceed in accordance with § 1209.
- 1208.4 The time limitations imposed by Subsections 1202.2 and 1202.3 shall be tolled by the youth's failure to appear for the scheduled hearing.
- 1208.5 If a youth absconds from a DYRS community placement, the DYRS Case Worker shall inform the Head of the Case Management Division or designee and request a custody order.

- 1208.6 Upon the youth's return to DYRS custody from abscondence, the DYRS Case Worker shall determine whether or not the youth's community status should be reviewed at a hearing. If the youth is returned to DYRS after an arrest on a new charge, the Case Worker may take into account the decision of the Court concerning release status with respect to any new charges.
- 1208.7 Even if the DYRS Case Worker determines that the youth should return to his or her community placement, the Case Worker shall determine whether to request a Community Status Review Hearing.
- 1208.8 If the DYRS Case Worker determines that the youth who had absconded should be held in secure custody, the DYRS Case Worker shall provide the Head of the Case Management Division or designee with documentation in support of his or her recommendation that the youth be securely held.
- 1208.9 DYRS shall make a probable cause determination about whether a youth should be securely held. A court order mandating that a youth be securely detained in a new case establishes probable cause that the youth failed to comply with all federal, state and local laws, rules and regulations such that no additional determination need be made by DYRS that the youth violated the terms of his or her Community Placement Agreement. In the absence of a secure detention order, the Head of the Case Management Division or designee shall make a probable cause determination within one (1) business day, based on the DYRS Case Worker's documentation.
- 1208.10 If the Head of the Case Management Division or designee determines that there is probable cause to believe that the youth violated the terms of his or her Community Placement Agreement and that he or she is a clear and present danger and requires immediate removal from a non-secure placement, DYRS shall conduct the Community Status Review Hearing within five (5) business days of the youth's return from abscondence.
- 1208.11 If the Head of the Case Management Division determines that there is no probable cause to securely confine the youth, DYRS shall return the youth to his or her community placement.
- 1208.12 In cases where there is a no probable cause determination, the Case Worker may request a Community Status Review Hearing in accordance with Subsection 1202.3.
- 1208.13 The Community Status Review Specialist shall provide notice of the time, place and location of the Community Status Review Hearing to the youth, parent(s), guardian(s), or responsible adult(s), and counsel of record or alternate counsel, consistent with § 1207.

1209 HEARING UPON YOUTH'S RETURN FROM ABSCONDENCE

- 1209.1 In cases where the youth fails to appear for a Community Status Review Hearing and the hearing proceeded in his or her absence, the youth may request a second hearing within seventy-two (72) hours of his or her return.
- 1209.2 The post-custody hearing shall occur within five (5) business days of the youth's request for a second hearing upon his or her return if the youth is securely detained pursuant to §§ 1204 or 1208. If the youth is not securely detained, a post-custody hearing shall occur within a reasonable amount of time.
- 1209.3 Proper notification pursuant to § 1207 shall be sent to the youth's parent (s), guardian(s), or responsible adult(s), and counsel of record indicating the date, time and place of this hearing.
- 1209.4 All conditions of §§ 1208, 1210 and 1211 shall apply to this hearing.

1210 COMMUNITY STATUS REVIEW HEARINGS

- 1210.1 All hearings shall be held at the time, place and location shown on the notice to appear before the Community Status Review Hearing form, unless otherwise notified.
- 1210.2 All Community Status Review Hearings under these Regulations shall be recorded and stored in an electronic or other medium.
- 1210.3 The Community Status Review hearing officer shall be an attorney employed by DYRS and trained in the Community Status review regulations, policies, and procedures.
- 1210.4 No one shall serve as hearing officer who is in any way involved with the case being heard or has worked with the youth whose community status is being reviewed.
- 1210.5 The youth may be represented at the hearing by parents, legal counsel, or any other adult whom the youth may designate.
- 1210.6 DYRS employees, contractors or agents are prohibited from representing a youth.
- 1210.7 At the hearing, the hearing officer shall inform the youth of his or her right to have counsel of record present, alternate counsel, parent, guardian, responsible adult, or other representative with him or her.
- 1210.8 Either party to the hearing may request one (1) brief continuance. All subsequent continuances shall only be provided upon a showing of good cause or extreme hardship.
- 1210.9 The hearing officer, youth, attorney of record, alternate counsel, or representative may seek to resolve the case by stipulation, agreed settlement, or consent order.

- 1210.10 Except as set forth in Subsection 1210.11, the hearing officer shall not be responsible in any way for providing witnesses on behalf of the youth whose case is being heard.
- 1210.11 Upon adequate notification by the youth that a witness' presence is necessary, DYRS shall bring a witness within DYRS' control, including youth committed to its care, to the review hearing.
- 1210.12 The youth may bring any other witnesses to the hearing who may assist in putting forth his or her position.
- 1210.13 The youth may question any witnesses or challenge any documents introduced as evidence at the hearing.
- 1210.14 Only evidence that is material to the charges or violations that have made the hearing necessary shall be admitted at the hearing.
- 1210.15 The hearing officer shall not interview or question the youth about substantive matters concerning any pending criminal or delinquency matters.
- 1210.16 Any information unrelated to the charges or violations shall be disregarded by the hearing officer in reaching his decision about whether the youth violated the CPA.
- 1210.17 The hearing officer may consider information unrelated to the charges or violations in its decision on the level of restrictiveness.
- 1210.18 After all testimony has been heard and evidence presented, the hearing officer shall retire to weigh the evidence and statements, and reach a decision.
- 1210.19 The preponderance of the evidence shall be the standard of proof the hearing officer shall use in weighing testimony and other evidence about the charges or violations.
- 1210.20 The hearing officer shall issue written findings within seven (7) business days.
- 1210.21 The hearing officer shall notify the counsel of record of all hearings where counsel is not present or counsel's presence is waived.

1211 HEARING DECISION, DISPOSITION AND APPEAL

- 1211.1 All hearing decisions shall be read to the youth. The Community Status Review Specialist or designee shall provide the written findings to the youth, his or her parent(s) or guardian(s), or responsible adult, the attorney of record or alternate counsel, and the Chief of the Juvenile Section of the Office of Attorney General within five (5) business days of its issuance. The hearing officer's decision will become final at the end of five (5) business days should the Director not exercise his right to review the hearing officer's decision.

- 1211.2 If the hearing officer's decision is to continue the youth in community status, the youth shall be returned to the same level of placement he or she enjoyed before the hearing was held under either the conditions of the existing CPA or conditions of a new agreement, consistent with Subsection 1202.3.
- 1211.3 If the hearing officer finds that the youth violated the CPA, he/she may decide to permit the youth to remain in the community, but under different conditions spelled out in a new CPA, consistent with Subsection 1202.3.
- 1211.4 If the hearing officer finds that the youth violated the CPA, and decides to terminate the youth's community status, he or she shall determine the youth's level of restrictiveness.
- 1211.5 The Case Worker shall make efforts to identify an appropriate placement, consistent with the youth's level of restrictiveness, and make appropriate referrals within a reasonable time after the Community Status Review Hearing.
- 1211.6 The Director may review any placement decision.
- 1211.7 The youth may appeal the results of the Community Status Review Hearing, to the DYRS Director within seven (7) business days from receipt of the written findings.
- 1211.8 The DYRS Director shall review the request for appeal and make a final written determination within ten (10) business days.
- 1211.9 When an appeal is made, the appropriate papers, including, but not limited to, the basis for appeal, community status review packet, and written finding shall be forwarded to the Director, who may affirm or modify the findings and/or placement determination. The Director may impose a higher level of placement than that recommended by the hearing officer.

1212 ALTERNATIVE COMMUNITY STATUS REVIEW

- 1212.1 The following procedures apply in any instance in which DYRS is seeking to review a youth's community placement status because the youth is at risk of imminent flight; awaiting placement; or due to safety concerns.
- 1212.2 DYRS shall initiate a review of the youth's community placement status within three (3) business days of the youth being securely detained and shall convene a Community Status Review Hearing.
- 1212.3 If the youth remains in the community during the pendency of the review, DYRS shall follow procedures outlined in Section 1203.
- 1212.4 If the youth is temporarily placed in secure placement pending review of the youth's community placement status, DYRS shall follow those procedures outlined in Section 1204.

1213 WAIVERS

- 1213.1 Youth may waive their right to a community status review hearing after having an opportunity to consult with counsel of record or alternate counsel.
- 1213.2 The DYRS case worker shall discuss with the youth any violations of the Community Placement Agreement and/or reasons for removal from community placement status; the possibility of waiving a community status review hearing; what the youth's level of restrictiveness will be if he or she waives the hearing; and what the potential placement of the youth will be, if known.
- 1213.3 If the youth decides to waive his or her rights, the DYRS case worker shall fully fill out the waiver form listing the youth's violations of the Community Placement Agreement, current level of restrictiveness and new level of restrictiveness before giving the waiver to the youth and/or youth's attorney of record or alternate counsel to review.
- 1213.4 The youth shall have the opportunity to consult with counsel of record or alternate counsel in advance of signing the waiver. Should the youth refuse the right to consult with an attorney, the youth should write such refusal on the waiver form and sign and date the form.
- 1213.5 After the youth has had the opportunity to review the waiver with his or her attorney of record or alternate counsel, the DYRS case worker, youth and attorney, if applicable, should sign the waiver.
- 1213.6 If the youth is waiving his or her right to a Community Status Review Hearing pursuant to Subsection 1204.2, the DYRS case worker shall document that the removal of the community is for those purposes outlined in Subsection 1204.2 and then follow the procedures outlined in that subsection.
- 1213.7 The DYRS case worker shall place a copy of the fully signed waiver in the youth's case file.

1299 DEFINITIONS

- 1299.1 As used in this chapter, the following terms and phrases shall have the meanings ascribed:

“Abscondence”: when a youth, without approval, willfully leaves a required DYRS placement or does not return to a DYRS placement.

“Business day”: a day of the week consisting of Monday through Friday, and excludes Saturday, Sunday, any legal holiday, or inclement weather that results in a day in which the Court is closed. In addition, a business day is calculated beginning on the day after the triggering event occurs.

“Case Management Division Program Manager”: a DYRS employee who supervises all of the managers who supervise DYRS Case Workers.

“Chief of the Juvenile Section of the Office of Attorney General”: supervisory Attorney responsible for oversight of the Attorney General’s Office’s Juvenile section.

“Clear and Present Danger”: the absence of basic necessities such as food, shelter, or clothing; suicidal actions, tendencies or threats of suicide; serious decompensating emotional character and mental health; seriously destructive behavior creating an imminent danger to one’s life or health; or engaging in abusive or threatening or other dangerous conduct thereby creating an imminent danger to self or others.

“Commitment”: when a youth adjudicated delinquent or as a person in need of supervision is ordered into the custody of DYRS.

“Community Placement Agreement” (CPA): an agreement between the youth and DYRS, that the youth and his or her parent, guardian, or responsible adult will agree to certain rules in exchange for being released to the community. This agreement was formerly called an aftercare agreement.

“Community Placement or Community Status”: a status conferred upon a youth who has been committed to the legal custody of DYRS and housed in the community in a non-secure placement.

“Community Status Review Hearing”: an administrative process to evaluate recommendations for modifying a youth’s community placement.

“Community Status Review Hearing Officer”: an impartial DYRS employee responsible for conducting Community Status Review Hearings.

“Delinquent”: a youth who has committed a delinquent act *and* is in need of care or rehabilitation.

“DYRS Case Worker”: a DYRS employee who provides case management services to a case load of youth committed to DYRS by the courts.

“DYRS Case Worker Supervisor”: a DYRS employee who supervises a unit of DYRS Case Workers.

“Emergency Removal”: immediate removal from the community and subsequent placement in a more restrictive setting after a determination has been made that the youth presents a clear and present danger to himself or others.

“Guardian”: a natural or adoptive parent whose parental rights have not been judicially terminated, a person appointed by the court, or legal custodian.

“Head of the Case Management Division”: a DYRS employee who oversees the DYRS Case Management Division.

“Non-Secure Placement”: a community placement which is not locked and which allows for unsupervised movement in and out of the placement and allows youth to participate in various community activities, such as school, employment or other activities consistent with the youth’s Community Placement Agreement.

“Person in need of supervision (PINS)”: a child in need of supervision who is in need of care or rehabilitation and either: is subject to compulsory school attendance and habitually truant from school without justification; has committed an offense committable only by children; or is habitually disobedient of the reasonable and lawful commands of his parent, guardian, or other custodian and is ungovernable.

“Probable Cause”: a reasonable belief that an event or action occurred or existed, or is likely to occur or exist.

“Responsible adult”: an adult in the community with whom a youth is placed and who is responsible for supervising youth to ensure compliance with the terms of the youth’s Community Placement Agreement.

“Secure detention order”: a court order mandating that a youth be securely detained.

“Secure Facility”: a locked residential placement which provides treatment and/or educational programs within the facility and does not allow for unsupervised movement within or outside of the facility.

“Secure placement”: a placement which is locked, movements in and out of the placement are supervised, and allows youth to participate in various activities within the placement.

“Team Decision Making Meeting”: a meeting of a group of relevant individuals, as identified by the DYRS Team Decision Making Coordinator, involved in the case planning for the purposes of developing comprehensive, rehabilitative treatment and educational plans for the youth and family.

“Violation”: an act that is non-compliant with the terms of the Community Placement Agreement.

BOARD OF ETHICS AND GOVERNMENT ACCOUNTABILITY**NOTICE OF EMERGENCY AND PROPOSED RULEMAKING**

The Board of Ethics and Government Accountability (“Ethics Board”), pursuant to the authority set forth in Section 209 of the Board of Ethics and Government Accountability Establishment and Comprehensive Ethics Reform Amendment Act of 2011, effective April 27, 2012 (D.C. Law 19-124; D.C. Official Code § 1-1162.09 (2014 Repl.)), hereby gives notice of its adoption, on an emergency basis, of the following rulemaking to amend Chapter 57 (Financial Disclosures and Honoraria), and Chapter 58 (Registration of Lobbyists) of Title 3 (Elections and Ethics) of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations (“DCMR”).

D.C. Official Code § 1-1162.11(8) provides that the Director of Government Ethics shall have the power to “require any person to submit through an electronic format or medium a report required pursuant to this title [subchapter].” This rulemaking will amend Subsections 5702.1 and 5702.2 to require, except upon the granting of a waiver for good cause shown, electronic filing of Public Financial Disclosure Statements by Public Officials, and Subsection 5704.4 to require, except upon the granting of a waiver for good cause shown, electronic filing of Public Financial Disclosure Certifications by Advisory Neighborhood Commissioners. The rulemaking also will amend Subsection 5803.3 and add Subsections 5803.4 through 5803.8 to require, except upon the granting of a waiver for good cause shown, electronic filing of Lobbyist Registration and Lobbyist Activity Reports.

Emergency action is necessary to reduce paper filings, make filings more accessible, and increase efficiency at the Ethics Board. The emergency rulemaking was adopted on June 1, 2015, and became effective immediately on that date. The emergency rules shall remain in effect for one hundred and twenty (120) days or until October 1, 2015 unless superseded by publication of a Notice of Final Rulemaking in the *D.C. Register*.

The Ethics Board also gives notice of the intent to take final rulemaking action to adopt these proposed rules in not less than thirty (30) days after the date of publication on this notice in the *D.C. Register*.

Chapter 57, FINANCIAL DISCLOSURES AND HONORARIA, of Title 3 DCMR, ELECTIONS AND ETHICS, is amended as follows:

Section 5702, FILING AND PUBLICATION REQUIREMENTS, is amended as follows:

Subsections 5702.1 and 5702.2 are amended to read as follows:

5702.1 The FDS shall be filed electronically at the Board of Ethics and Government Accountability (Board) website. The FDS shall be deemed timely filed electronically no later than midnight on May 15th of each year for the prior calendar year in which the public official served.

5702.2 A public official may request a waiver of the requirement to file electronically.

Waiver requests shall be submitted in writing, to the Director, no later than midnight on May 5th of each year. The Director may grant a waiver of the requirement to file electronically on good cause shown as to why the public official is unable to file electronically as follows:

- (a) A waiver granted by the Director shall be in writing and provided to the requestor.
- (b) If the waiver is granted, the FDS shall be filed in hard copy, in person or by first class mail. The FDS shall be deemed timely filed if received in the office of the Board no later than 5:00 pm on May 15th.
- (c) A denial of the waiver of the requirement to file electronically is appealable to the Board. An appeal is timely filed if submitted to the Board Chairperson and the Director, in writing, in hard copy or electronically, no later than two (2) business days after the date of the Director's decision. The decision of the Board is final and shall be provided in writing to the requestor.

Subsection 5704.4 is repealed.

A new Section 5705 is added to read as follows:

5705 CONFIDENTIAL FINANCIAL DISCLOSURE FILINGS BY ADVISORY NEIGHBORHOOD COMMISSIONERS AND CANDIDATES

5705.1 Advisory Neighborhood Commissioners in office for at least thirty (30) days shall electronically file a financial disclosure certification required by Section 224(a)(1)(G) of the Act for the preceding year.

- (a) The certification shall be due no later than midnight of May 15th of each year;
- (b) The certification shall be filed electronically with the Board at the Board website;
- (c) The certification shall be publicly filed; and
- (d) An Advisory Neighborhood Commissioner, or candidate as defined in D.C. Official Code § 1-1161.01(6), may request a waiver of the requirement to file electronically. Waiver requests shall be submitted in writing, to the Director, no later than midnight on May 5th of each year. The Director may grant a waiver of the requirement to file electronically for good cause shown as to why the public official is unable to file electronically.

- (i) A waiver granted by the Director shall be in writing and provided to the requestor.
- (ii) If the waiver is granted, the public financial disclosure certification shall be filed in hard copy, in person or by first class mail. The public financial disclosure certification shall be deemed timely filed if received in the office of the Board no later than 5:00 pm on May 15th.
- (iii) A denial of the waiver of the requirement to file electronically is appealable to the Board. An appeal is timely filed if submitted to the Board Chairperson and the Director, in writing, in hard copy or electronically, no later than two (2) business days after the date of the Director's decision. The decision of the Board is final and shall be provided in writing to the requestor.

Chapter 58, REGISTRATION OF LOBBYISTS, is amended as follows:

Subsection 5803.3 is amended to read as follows:

5803.3 Lobbyist Activity Reports shall be filed in electronic format at the Board website and shall be considered timely if filed by midnight on the date due.

New Subsections 5803.4 through 5803.8 are added to read as follows:

5803.4 Lobbyist Registration forms filed on or before January 15th of each year shall be filed in electronic format on the Board website and will be considered timely if filed by midnight on the date due.

5803.5 First-time Lobbyist Registration forms filed pursuant to Subsection 5803.1(a) of this section shall be filed electronically at the Board website and shall be considered timely if filed by midnight on the due date.

5803.6 A lobbyist may request a waiver of the requirement to electronically file a Lobbyist Registration form or a Lobbyist Activity Report. Waiver requests shall be submitted in writing, to the Director, no later than midnight on January 1st for January Lobbyist Registration and Lobbyist Activity report filings and July 1st for July Lobbyist Activity Report filings.

5803.7 The Director may grant a waiver of the requirement to file electronically for good cause shown as to why the Lobbyist is unable to file electronically as follows:

- (a) A waiver granted by the Director shall be in writing and provided to the requestor.
- (b) If the waiver is granted, the filings shall be filed in hard copy, in person or

by first class mail. The filing shall be deemed timely filed if received in the office of the Board no later than 5:00 pm on the due date.

- (c) A denial of the waiver of the requirement to file electronically is appealable to the Board. An appeal is timely filed if submitted to the Board Chairperson and the Director, in writing, in hard copy or electronically, no later than two (2) business days after the date of the Director's decision. The decision of the Board is final and shall be provided in writing to the requestor.

BOARD OF ETHICS AND GOVERNMENT ACCOUNTABILITY**NOTICE OF EMERGENCY AND PROPOSED RULEMAKING**

The Board of Ethics and Government Accountability (“Ethics Board”), pursuant to the authority set forth in Sections 209 and 230 of the Board of Ethics and Government Accountability Establishment and Comprehensive Ethics Reform Amendment Act of 2011, effective April 27, 2012 (D.C. Law 19-124; D.C. Official Code §§ 1-1162.09 and 1-1162.30 (2014 Repl.)), hereby gives notice of its adoption, on an emergency basis, of the following rulemaking amending Chapter 58 (Registration of Lobbyists) to Title 3 (Elections and Ethics) of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations (“DCMR”).

Section 2(b) of the Campaign Finance Reform and Transparency Amendment Act of 2013, effective February 22, 2014 (D.C. Law 20-79; D.C. Official Code § 1-1162.30(a)(7)), provides that Lobbyist Activity Reports shall include “[a]ll bundled contributions in accordance with rules promulgated by the Ethics Board.” This rulemaking will amend Subsection 5802.2 to include information on bundled contributions on Lobbyist Activity Reports, and to require lobbyists to provide more specific information concerning their communications with public officials.

Emergency action is necessary to comply with D.C. Law 20-79, and to ensure transparency related to the campaign contributions of registered lobbyists and their employers. The emergency rulemaking was adopted on June 1, 2015, and became effective immediately on that date. The emergency rules shall remain in effect for one hundred and twenty (120) days or until October 1, 2015, unless superseded by publication of a Notice of Final Rulemaking in the *D.C. Register*.

The Ethics Board also gives notice of the intent to take final rulemaking action to adopt these proposed rules in not less than thirty (30) days after the date of publication of this notice in the *D.C. Register*.

Chapter 58, REGISTRATION OF LOBBYISTS, of Title 3 DCMR, ELECTIONS AND ETHICS, is amended as follows:**Section 5802, ACTIVITY REPORTS, Subsection 5802.2 is amended as follows:****Paragraph (f) is amended to read as follows:**

- (f) Each official in the executive or legislative branch with whom the registrant has had written or oral communications, including electronic mail, text messages, or any other form of communication, during the reporting periods related to lobbying activities conducted by the registrant shall also be included in the report, identifying:
 - (i) The official with whom the communication was made;
 - (ii) The specific date on which the communication was made to a specific official;

- (iii) The type of communication; and
- (iv) The nature and purpose of communication.

Paragraph (g) is amended by striking the period at the end and inserting the phrase “; and” in its place.

A new paragraph (h) is added to read as follows:

- (h) All bundled campaign contributions forwarded or arranged to be forwarded from two (2) or more persons, including:
 - (i) The name of each contributor;
 - (ii) Address, and employer of each person from whom the contributions were received, and
 - (iii) The name of the candidate or committee for whom the contributions were collected.

NOTICE OF EMERGENCY AND PROPOSED RULEMAKING

The Director of the Department of Health, pursuant to Section 14 of the Legalization of Marijuana for Medical Treatment Amendment Act of 2010 (Act), effective July 27, 2010 (D.C. Law 18-210; D.C. Official Code § 7-1671.13 (2012 Repl.)), and Mayor's Order 2011-71, dated April 13, 2011, hereby gives notice of the adoption of, on an emergency basis, the following amendments to Chapter 53 (General Registration Requirements) of Title 22 (Health), Subtitle C (Medical Marijuana) of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations (DCMR).

This emergency action is necessary to protect the public by ensuring that there are a sufficient number of cultivation centers and dispensaries open for business to adequately supply the needs of the District's registered patients. The Department of Health's Medical Marijuana Program has completed two (2) application rounds since the program began. Presently, ten (10) cultivation center applicants have been notified that they are eligible to complete the remaining requirements for registration. However, to date, only five (5) of the cultivation center applicants have actually opened for business, and only three (3) of those applicants are currently producing medical marijuana. Likewise, after completing two (2) application rounds, only three (3) of the six (6) applicants eligible for dispensary registrations have actually opened for business.

The Department is currently registering an average of 200 new qualified patients per month, and this number is expected to continue to increase. This emergency action will help to ensure that applicants which have been approved and deemed eligible for registration proceed expeditiously to open their facilities for business.

This emergency rule was adopted on May 19, 2015, and became effective immediately on that date. The emergency rule will expire one hundred twenty (120) days from the date of adoption (September 16, 2015), or upon publication of a Notice of Final Rulemaking in the *D.C. Register*, whichever occurs first.

The Director of the Department of Health also gives notice of her intent to adopt this rule as final in not less than thirty (30) days from the date of publication of this notice in the *D.C. Register*, and upon completion of the thirty (30) day Council period of review if the Council does not act earlier to adopt a resolution approving the rules.

Chapter 53, GENERAL REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS, of Title 22-C DCMR, MEDICAL MARIJUANA, is amended as follows:

Section 5303, FAILURE TO OPEN OR OPERATE, is amended to read as follows:

5303 FAILURE TO OPEN OR OPERATE

5303.1 For purposes of this section, "deemed eligible" shall mean:

- (a) The applicant has met all application prerequisites;

- (b) The applicant has been selected by the Director for registration; and
- (c) The applicant is only pending the remaining necessary approvals required under this title from MPD, DCRA, OTR, and the Department, including passing the pre-opening inspection.

5303.2 Being “deemed eligible” does not guarantee that an applicant will receive a registration, or create a contract between the applicant and the Department. The medical marijuana laws of the District of Columbia and the federal government are subject to change at any time and that the District of Columbia shall not be liable as a result of these changes.

5303.3 Any applicant for a dispensary registration that was notified on or before June 11, 2014, that it was deemed eligible to register for a dispensary registration shall:

- (a) Within thirty (30) days after the effective date of these regulations, submit a detailed, written plan to the Department clearly outlining how the applicant will obtain the final necessary approvals required under this title for registration, including passing the pre-opening inspection, and open for business within sixty (60) days from the effective date of these regulations; and
- (b) Obtain a registration and open for business within sixty (60) days from the effective date of these regulations.

5303.4 Except as provided in § 5303.5 of this chapter, any applicant for a dispensary registration that is subject to the requirements of § 5303.3 of this chapter that fails to meet the requirements of § 5303.3, shall be deemed no longer eligible for registration, effective as of sixty-one (61) days from the effective date of these regulations, and the Department shall notify the applicant that it is no longer eligible for registration. If a registration has been issued, the registrant shall surrender and return the registration to the Department.

5303.5 Any applicant for a cultivation center registration that is authorized to relocate pursuant to the Medical Marijuana Cultivation Center Emergency Amendment Act of 2015, effective March 30, 2015 (D.C. Act 21-36), shall not be subject to the provisions of § 5303.6 of this chapter.

5303.6 Any applicant for a cultivation center registration that was notified on or before July 25, 2014, that it was deemed eligible to register for a cultivation center registration shall:

- (a) Within thirty (30) days after the effective date of these regulations, submit a detailed, written plan to the Department clearly outlining how the applicant will obtain the final necessary approvals required under this title

for registration, including passing the pre-opening inspection, and begin growing within sixty (60) days from the effective date of these regulations; and

- (b) Obtain a registration and begin growing within sixty (60) days from the effective date of these regulations.

- 5303.7 Except as provided in § 5303.8 of this chapter, any applicant for a cultivation center registration that is subject to the requirements of § 5303.6 of this chapter that fails to meet the requirements of § 5303.6, shall be deemed no longer eligible for registration, effective as of sixty-one (61) days from the effective date of these regulations, and the Department shall notify the applicant that it is no longer eligible for registration. If a registration has been issued, the registrant shall surrender and return the registration to the Department.
- 5303.8 Any applicant for a cultivation center registration that passed its pre-opening inspection prior to the effective date of these regulations shall not be subject to the provisions of § 5303.6 of this chapter.
- 5303.9 For purposes of this section, to “begin growing” shall mean the registrant has planted, in a suitable medium, at least ten percent (10%) of the number of cannabis plants the registrant is authorized by law to grow.
- 5303.10 A registration for a dispensary or cultivation center shall be returned to the Director if the dispensary or cultivation center fails to operate for any reason for more than sixty (60) days after it has opened for business.
- 5303.11 Once a registration has been returned to the Department, the Director may select the next highest scoring applicant to receive the registration. If there are no applicants pending, the Director may open the application process to select a replacement dispensary or cultivation center applicant.





- A. The Strike Force shall consist of no more than 18 members, comprised of officials from District agencies and community housing stakeholders including

tenant advocates, preservation policy researchers, developers, architects, banks and other intermediary financial institutions.

B. The Director of DHCD, on behalf of the Mayor, shall appoint members of the Strike Force.

V. SUNSET

The Strike Force shall remain active for one year from the date of this Order. The Strike Force is expected to produce reports addressing the current preservation situations including programs such as Museum Square, Brookland Manor and Mt Vernon Plaza, by December 31, 2015 and a final report, on or before, April 30, 2016 .

Monthly average emissions shall be calculated by determining the amount of ink used in the LEPE press in a given month, in pounds, multiplying that value by the percent of the ink used that is emitted as VOC emissions per the most current valid data available, and dividing the result by the number of hours of operation of the press that month. - b. VOC emissions from any cleaning solvents used shall not exceed 0.57 pounds per press hour. Except when tested on a one-time basis in accordance with Condition IV(f) of the permit, compliance with this condition may be determined on a monthly average basis. Monthly average emissions shall be calculated by determining the amount of each cleaning solvent used by the LEPE press in a given month, in pounds, multiplying that by the percent of the solvent used that is emitted, based on the most current data available, and dividing the result by the number of hours of operation of the press. [20 DCMR 201]
- c. The total annual VOC emitted from the ink and cleaning solvent as a result of operation of the press shall not exceed 1.92 tons per year. [20 DCMR 201]
- d. Visible emissions shall not be emitted into the outdoor atmosphere from the printing press. [20 DCMR 107 and 606]
- e. An emission into the atmosphere of odorous or other air pollutants from any source in any quantity and of any characteristic, and duration which is, or is likely to be injurious to the public health or welfare, or which interferes with the reasonable enjoyment of life or property is prohibited. MEDICAID FEE SCHEDULE UPDATES FOR ANESTHESIA SERVICES

The Department of Health Care Finance (DHCF), pursuant to the requirements set forth in Section 988 of Chapter 9 Title 29 of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations, published on May 22, 2015 (62 DCR 6692), announces changes to the Medicaid reimbursement rates governing anesthesia services billed by professional providers. Professional providers are health care providers who submit claims for reimbursement to DC Medicaid on a CMS-1500 claim form. The changes set forth below will become effective on August 1, 2015.

Under the District of Columbia's State Plan for Medical Assistance, anesthesia services are reimbursed at eighty percent (80%) of the Medicare rate as established by the federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services. As a result, DHCF is updating the anesthesia payment parameters with the following changes in order to ensure the rates are eighty percent (80%) of Medicare reimbursement rates: (1) the conversion factor will be reduced to eighty percent (80%) of Medicare, which amounts to \$19.73; (2) the discounting percentage for anesthesia modifiers QK and QZ will be updated to fifty percent (50%) and one hundred percent (100%), respectively; and (3) anesthesia base unit values will be updated with the Medicare values, which result in the following base unit values:

The Maximum Purchase Price and Maximum Allowable Rent is based on the Washington Metropolitan Statistical Area 2015 Area Median Income of one hundred nine thousand two hundred dollars (\$109,200) for a family of four (4) as published by the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development on March 6, 2015. The Price and Rent Calculations take into account an ability to pay thirty percent (30%) of the benchmark income towards the housing cost.

An Inclusionary Development Owner may lower the rents or sale prices in order to market the Inclusionary Units to a larger band of incomes and increase marketability.

1. The Public Service Commission of the District of Columbia (Commission) pursuant to Section 34-802 of the District of Columbia Code and in accordance with Section 2-505 of the District of Columbia Code,¹ hereby gives notice of its intent to act upon the Rights-of-Way (ROW) Use Fee Compliance Filing for 2015 of Verizon Washington, DC Inc. (Verizon or the Company)² in the above-captioned matter in not less than thirty (30) days after the date of publication of this Notice of Proposed Tariff (NOPT) in the *D.C. Register*.

2. On May 1, 2015, Verizon filed its ROW Compliance Filing for 2015, in accordance with D.C. Code § 10-1141.06.³ The ROW Compliance Filing describes the process Verizon uses to recover from its customers the District of Columbia Public ROW fees it pays to the District of Columbia Government. Moreover, Verizon's ROW Compliance Filing contains the most recent calculations and updated rates for the Company's ROW surcharges, in accordance with the following tariff page:⁴

3. In the ROW Compliance Filing, Verizon compares the current ROW surcharges and the updated ROW surcharges for the ROW Surcharge Rider.⁵ Specifically, the ROW Compliance Filing indicates that the ROW Surcharge Rider will increase by \$0.04, from \$3.95 to the updated rate of \$3.99, for Non-Centrex lines and increase by \$0.01, from \$0.49 to the updated rate of \$0.50 for Centrex lines.⁶ According to Verizon, the increase in the 2015 true-up

rates is a result of the estimated net under recovery of payments during the period from July 2014 to June 2015, plus the forecasted loss in assessed lines during the coming year, based on the loss experienced in past years.⁷ Verizon adds that the 2015 true-up rates continue to reflect the change in methodology discussed in Verizon's 2014 letters to the District Department of Transportation (DDOT).⁸ Verizon states that DDOT and Verizon have been in discussions regarding this change in methodology, but DDOT has not yet issued a response to Verizon's analysis. Verizon states that, in the event that its payments made to DDOT during this coming year (July 2015-June 2016) vary enough from its forecast to result in a material difference to the surcharge amounts requested in this 2015 ROW Compliance Filing, Verizon will file an update prior to the 2016 annual true-up.⁹

4. According to the ROW Compliance Filing, Verizon seeks to implement the updated surcharge rates on August 1, 2015, in order to maintain the timing of past annual true-up filings for the ROW Surcharge Rider.¹⁰ To that end, Verizon requests that the Commission implement an expedited review of its 2015 ROW Compliance Filing and issue an order approving it by July 17, 2015 to allow time for system changes to be made to implement the new rates by the requested effective date of August 1, 2015.¹¹

5. The Company has a statutory right to implement its filed surcharges. However, if the Commission discovers any inaccuracies in the calculation of the proposed surcharge, Verizon could be subject to reconciliation of the surcharges. The General Regulations Tariff and the proposed revisions are on file with the Commission and may be reviewed at the Office of the Commission Secretary, Public Service Commission of the District of Columbia, 1333 H Street, N.W., Second Floor, West Tower, Washington, D.C. 20005, between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 5:30 p.m., Monday through Friday or on the Commission's website at www.dcpssc.org. Copies of the tariff are also available upon request, at a per-page reproduction cost.

Bowser's initiatives to achieve self-determination, budget and legislative autonomy, full voting rights in the United States Congress, and, ultimately, statehood for the District of Columbia. This RFA will be open for the period of June 12, 2015 and will close on June 30, 2015 at noon.

Background

The residents of the District of Columbia serve in the military and pay federal taxes but continue to lack full democracy and the rights that residents of other states and municipalities enjoy, including autonomy from congressional oversight, voting representation in Congress and statehood.

The District of Columbia Home Rule Act of 1973 provided limited "Home Rule" for the District by allowing election of a Mayor and Council of the District of Columbia. Since then, the District's elected officials and various groups have pursued strategies to raise awareness and work towards achieving voting representation in the U.S. House of Representatives and U.S. Senate and autonomy from congressional oversight. Yet democracy for DC has been derailed by the Charter itself, the courts, non-germane proposals restricting the District on must-pass Congressional legislation, riders on appropriations bills, and insufficient support for enactment of various budget autonomy and statehood proposals in the United States Congress.

For over a decade, the District has allocated funds to nonprofit organizations for educating citizens around the nation and pursuing strategies that highlight the continued lack of full democracy in the nation's capital. In addition, since 1990, District residents have elected a "shadow" delegation to Congress in order to promote statehood, and District residents have voted for, and the Mayor has supported, amending the Charter to allow for budget autonomy.

The Office of the Secretary is charged with responsibility for managing the funds allocated for statehood initiatives for DC residents. The Fiscal Year 2015 Budget authorized \$200,000 for the Office of the Secretary to issue competitive grants to promote voting rights and statehood.

Purpose of Program

The objective of this grant is to strengthen support for District representation in Congress and autonomy for the District of Columbia. This will require outreach, canvassing, and measurement of support of elected officials and residents across the country and visitors to the nation's capital. The ultimate goal of this program is that the grantee(s) increase congressional and nationwide support for self-determination for the District of Columbia including, but not limited to, voting rights in Congress, legislative and budget autonomy, and DC statehood.

This program is funded with FY2015 funds, which must be expended by September 30, 2015, with a full accounting provided to the Office of the Secretary no later than December 31, 2015.

SECTION II: AWARD INFORMATION

\$200,000 in District funds will be available on a competitive basis.

- A. This year, 50% or \$100,000.00 of the funds will be awarded on a competitive basis to an organization or organizations dedicated specifically to engaging youth (high school, college students and/or graduate students or other young adults) in civics, government, and/or voting rights in innovative ways by raising awareness through campaigns that include a branding and messaging strategy that include new media, social media and other fresh ideas. Such dedication can be evidenced by the organization's purpose, or through dedicated programming within the organization aimed at youth engagement.
- B. The other 50% of the funds will be awarded to a non-profit organization or organizations that engage in general or targeted public education, organizing, or legal strategy to advance DC voting rights and autonomy. The release date of this Request for Applications (RFA) is 14 days after the date the Notice of Funding Availability was published in the DC Register on Friday, June 12, 2015. This grant process conforms to the guidelines established in the District's City-Wide and Sourcebook (which is available at <http://opgs.dc.gov>).

All funds will be disbursed upon award of the grant, with a report and budget accounting required July 30, September 30, and, if not already submitted in September, a final report due no later than December 31, 2015. All proposals must include a detailed description of how the funds will be spent, as well as a project plan. Creative proposals are encouraged.

SECTION III: ELIGIBILITY INFORMATION

Eligibility for this grant is restricted to:

- A. Non-profit organizations with a 501(c) (3) certification, a current District of Columbia license, a "Clean Hands" certification that the organization does not owe any money to the District or Federal government, and no outstanding or overdue final reports for grants received from the District government for similar purposes; and
- B. Organizations with a history of advocating for democracy and self-determination for DC including, but not limited to, DC voting rights, legislative and budget autonomy, and/or statehood.
- C. Organizations must have a financial track record and cannot be reliant on another organization under a fiscal agent arrangement. Audited financial statements, or other documents listed in Section VI, item 4, must be submitted with the application.

1. All proposals must be written in clear, concise, and grammatically correct language. Narratives shall not exceed 2,500 words and must include answers to all the requirements specified in this Request for Applications.
2. There is no set form on which applications must be written but brevity and clarity are appreciated.
3. The grant applicant shall focus efforts on education and outreach to residents of the states, not just members of Congress, and funds shall not be used to lobby, directly or through grassroots advocacy, for or against particular pieces of legislation.
4. Grant applicants' efforts shall not consist in large part of paid media advertisements.
5. Proposal must be specific as to how funds will be expended including:
 - a. Names of all staff or consultants proposed to work on this program;
 - b. Justification of the need for grant funds.
 - c. Specific activities for which funds will be used.
 - d. Proposed line item budget.
 - e. Agreement to submit all deliverables listed in section VI.

(Square 1816, Lot 824).

**ORDER DISMISSING APPEAL AS UNTIMELY IN PART AND
REVERSING THE DETERMINATION OF THE
ZONING ADMINISTRATOR IN PART**

This appeal was submitted on July 11, 2014 by Dr. Joan Evelyn Kinlan (the “Appellant”) to challenge a decision of the Zoning Administrator, at the Department of Consumer and Regulatory Affairs, made May 16, 2014, that an existing child development center and other uses not permitted as a matter of right in the R-1 zone may continue on the subject property, a church building located at 3855 Massachusetts Avenue, N.W. (Square 1816, Lot 824). Following a public hearing, the Board of Zoning Adjustment (“Board”) voted on December 16, 2014 to dismiss the appeal in part as untimely and to reverse the determination of the Zoning Administrator in part.

PRELIMINARY MATTERS

Notice of Appeal and Notice of Hearing. By memoranda dated July 11, 2014, the Office of Zoning provided notice of the appeal to the Zoning Administrator, at the Department of Consumer and Regulatory Affairs (“DCRA”); the Office of Planning; the Councilmember for Ward 3; Advisory Neighborhood Commission (“ANC”) 3C, the ANC in which the subject property is located; and Single Member District/ANC 3C07. Pursuant to 11 DCMR § 3112.14, on July 23, 2014 the Office of Zoning mailed letters providing notice of the hearing to the Appellant; the Zoning Administrator; Embassy Church, the owner of the property that is the subject of the appeal; and ANC 3C. Notice was published in the *D.C. Register* on July 25, 2014 (61 DCR 7421).

Party Status. Parties in this proceeding are the DCRA, ANC 3C, and Embassy Church, the owner of the property that is the subject of the appeal (“Property Owner” or “Church”). There were no other requests for party status.¹

¹ Embassy Church, represented by Pastor Dave Owens, submitted a request for party status. (Exhibit 16.) However, Embassy Church was not required to seek party status because parties to an appeal include the “owner ... of the property involved in the administrative decision, if not the appellant.” (11 DCMR § 3199.)

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Appellant's Case. The Appellant challenged the decision of the Zoning Administrator to allow the alleged "continued illegal use of a child development center" at the subject property as well "the continued use of the Subject Property as a religious or clerical residence for at least thirty (30) persons without a certificate of occupancy, and without the required special exception or variance relief, and to allow the use of the Subject Property as a residence by a non-clerical family." (Exhibit 4.) The Appellant owns and resides in a dwelling adjacent to the subject property and asserted that use of the subject property as a child development center and religious/clerical residence for a youth missionary program and related staff "results in a substantial and direct adverse impact on the Appellant's use and enjoyment of her home and property, due to noise, traffic, parking, and other dangerous and unsafe conditions resulting from the illegal use."

According to the Appellant, the decisions of the Zoning Administrator not to revoke a certificate of occupancy issued for the child development center and not to "halt the illegal uses taking place at the Subject Property were made in error and in clear violation of the Zoning Regulations." The Appellant asserted that the appeal was timely filed within 60 days of the date when the Appellant had notice or knowledge of the decision complained of, since the Appellant became aware on May 16, 2014 of the Zoning Administrator's decision not to revoke the existing certificate of occupancy for the child development center or to halt other uses on the property that do not have separate certificates of occupancy.

DCRA. The Department of Consumer and Regulatory Affairs argued that "the challenge to the Child Development Center is over a year too late" and that the Appellant's "other arguments are without merit because the uses at issue are valid uses of church property." (Exhibit 18.)

Property Owner. The owner of the subject property was represented by Dave Owens, pastor of Embassy Church. He described the use of the subject property by the church, including its youth ministry program and related staff housing, and by the child development center.

ANC Report. By resolution adopted by a vote of 7-1 at a public meeting on July 21, 2013, with a quorum present, ANC 3C "strongly" encouraged the Board to grant the appeal and to require the owner of the subject property to "discontinue the child development center use, the religious/clerical use, and the additional family dwelling use, unless and until the Owner obtains special exception or variance approval from the BZA for such uses." According to the ANC, the property owner had caused the property to be used for certain operations that were not matter-of-right uses in the R-1-B zone, including a child development center that "is not associated with the Embassy Church" and "a housing program with significantly more than fifteen (15) residents." The ANC contended that the Zoning Administrator's decision to consider the child development center a "mere continuation of a previous charter school use on the Subject Property" was "clearly in violation of the use provisions of the Zoning Regulations," and that the lack of a certificate of occupancy to authorize the other uses taking place on the subject property also violated the Zoning Regulations. ANC 3C stated that "the immediate neighbors," not

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limited to the Appellant, were “significantly adversely impacted by the operation of the [child development center] and the multiple residences, in addition to other actions of the Owner.” (Exhibit 15.)

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The property that is the subject of this appeal is located at 3855 Massachusetts Avenue, N.W. (Square 1816, Lot 824). The property is zoned R-1-B and is improved with a building that is owned by Embassy Church and is used as a place of worship and for other purposes.
2. The building has a gross floor area of between 33,000 and 38,000 square feet.² The building area includes a sanctuary, which seats approximately 800 people, a chapel that seats approximately 300, offices, bathrooms, a two-bedroom apartment that houses four staff members, a child development center with five classrooms, and accommodations for a youth missionary program that include a kitchen, a lounge, and shower facilities as well as dormitory space used by participants and staff.
3. The subject property is also used for: “church services (weekly), various Life Group meetings (weekly), bible studies (weekly), bible and life training classes (weekly), English conversation classes (periodic), health screenings (periodic), holiday services and events (seasonal), and weddings, funerals and worship programs (as scheduled).” In addition, the church “engages in outreach related initiatives and activities in the neighborhood, throughout Washington, D.C., and internationally including meal service and distribution, education, counseling, disaster relief, missions support and projects, unity walk, nursing home and assisted care facility outreach, and prayer ministry.” (Exhibit 18.)
4. A certificate of occupancy (No. CO0800311) was issued September 16, 2008 to authorize a “DC public charter school [with] accessory cafeteria (250 Students, 5-8th Grade, with 40 Staff)” at the subject property. The certificate of occupancy was issued to the Corporation of Washington Latin School and allowed the charter school use in 18,856 square feet on the first and second floors of the church building. The occupant load specified on the certificate of occupancy was 200 persons. The charter school use ended at the subject property by mid-2011 or before.
5. A building permit, No. B1105058, was issued on August 12, 2011 for a child development center at the subject property.
6. Embassy Church leases a portion of the first and second floors of the church property to the St. Alban’s Early Childhood Center for the operation of a child care facility. A certificate of occupancy (No. CO1002760) (“COO”) was issued September 1, 2011 to authorize a “child development center, (37) children ages 0-2½ years, (51) children ages 2½ to 5 years, 88

² The Appellant estimated the size of the building at approximately 33,338 square feet, while DCRA’s estimate was approximately 38,000 square feet.

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children total” at the subject property. The certificate of occupancy was issued to St. Albans Early Childhood Center, Inc. and allowed the child development center use in 2,500 square feet on the first and second floors of the building. The occupant load specified on the certificate of occupancy was also 88 persons.

7. The Appellant admitted they knew in 2011 the new childhood center had been issued its COO. The Appellant stated they did not challenge the COO in 2011 because they thought the new childhood center would operate at the same level of the previous Charter School. However, after two years of the childhood center operating, the Appellant realized the childhood center use was more intense, causing a disruption to their peaceful enjoyment of their property. In 2013, they hired an attorney to inquiry about the child development center.
8. By letter dated May 16, 2014 (the “May 16 letter”) to the Appellant’s attorney, the Zoning Administrator responded to zoning issues raised by the Appellant with respect to the use of the subject property. The letter noted the Appellant’s complaints that “the child care facility operating at the church was not granted special exception approval by the Board of Zoning Adjustment and that the residential use and activities by religious organizations other than Embassy Church are occurring on the Church Property without a certificate of occupancy.”
9. With regard to the child development center, the May 16 letter stated that immediately prior to the child care facility use, the same area of the church property (i.e. a portion of the first and second floors of the church property) was occupied by the Washington Latin Charter School for students in 5th through 8th grades. According to the May 16 letter, the building permit issued in August 2011 had indicated that the then existing use of the space by the charter school was the same as the use being proposed by St. Alban’s: education for six or more children over the age of 2½ years. The Zoning Administrator concluded that “[i]t appears, based on the information provided when the building permit and the certificate of occupancy were issued, it was determined that the child care facility did not constitute a change of use from the prior charter school use on the Church Property. Both the child care facility and the charter school use are described on the permit and the certificate of occupancy as education for six or more children over the age of 2½ years. Therefore, special exception approval for the child care facility was not required.”
10. With regard to residential use on the church property, the May 16 letter stated the Zoning Administrator’s “understanding that there is an occupied two-bedroom apartment unit in the back corner of the church, above the church offices. It is well accepted that a dwelling unit for the pastor or minister of a church is deemed to be a typical, appropriate accessory use to a church.” The Zoning Administrator concluded that a certificate of occupancy was not required for the occupancy of the apartment unit on the church property because a rectory is permitted in the R-1 District as a matter of right under § 201.1(1) of the Zoning Regulations, and the apartment unit on the church property constituted a one-family dwelling that was exempted from the requirements of a certificate of occupancy under § 3203.1.

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11. The two-bedroom apartment at the subject property is occupied by two staff couples, including two pastors, who are directors of the youth ministry program. The residents share the apartment's common space, which includes a living room, dining room, and kitchen. The couples pay \$15 per day for lodging but have not signed leases.
12. With regard to missionaries staying at church property and the use of church property by other religious organizations, the May 16 letter stated the Zoning Administrator's "understanding that the 'Youth With a Mission' program is currently operating at the Church Property." Through this program, Embassy Church houses approximately 30 youth who stay at the church in intervals of approximately three months.... [T]he occupied area of the Church Property for this use is 4,568 square feet, or 10.63% of the building." The May 16 letter stated the Zoning Administrator's determination that the "Youth With a Mission" program was "an allowable accessory use of the Embassy Church and is, therefore, permissible under the Zoning Regulations.... [R]eligious activities at the church by other organizations would be allowable accessory uses to the church use that do not require a separate certificate of occupancy."
13. The youth missionary program "provides ministry training and outreach activities for young adults in the US and around the world. The ministry training includes instruction and mentorship in prayer, worship, Bible instruction, communication of Christian love and faith, community development, missions, and various and numerous community service projects." Trainings for groups of approximately 30 students typically last up to three months; the students have classroom training in the morning and participate in ministry activities, typically off-site, in the afternoons and evenings. Participants contribute \$15 per day for meals and lodging. (Exhibit 18.) The youth ministry activity is not limited to Embassy Church but is part of a local, national, and international program. Participants elsewhere are not necessarily housed in church properties. (Hearing Transcript of October 21, 2014, ("Tr."), p. 74.)
14. The May 16 letter concluded that (a) the building permit and the certificate of occupancy for the child care facility were properly issued because it was determined that the conversion of the church space from the charter school to the child care facility did not constitute a change in the use of the subject property; (2) pursuant to § 3203.1 the apartment unit on the church property did not require a certificate of occupancy; and (3) missionary programs and other similar activities by Embassy Church and other religious organizations are permitted as accessory uses to the primary church use and do not require separate certificate of occupancy.³
15. The appeal was filed July 11, 2014, less than 60 days after the Appellant learned of the Zoning Administrator's determination stated in the May 16 letter. The appeal asserts that

³ The May 16 letter also noted that the Appellant had raised several concerns relating to the use of public space by the church, including "the placement of the childcare playground." The letter stated that those concerns had been referred to the Public Space Regulation Administration for investigation.

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The Zoning Administrator has erred in finding that a Child Development Center use is not a change of use from a Charter School use, in violation of 11 DCMR § 199.1 (definitions of Child Development Center and Public School), 11 DCMR § 205 (requiring special exception relief for child development centers), 11 DCMR § 201.1 (listing matter-of-right uses permitted in R-1; that list not including child development centers, religious group residences under 15, or church programs), 11 DCMR § 216 (requiring special exception relief for church programs), and 11 DCMR § 101.5, which provides that “[n]o building, structure, or premises shall be used, and no building, structure, or part of a building or structure shall be constructed, extended, moved, structurally altered, or enlarged except in conformity with this title.”

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW AND OPINION

The Board of Zoning Adjustment (“Board” or “BZA”) is authorized by § 8 of the Zoning Act to “hear and decide appeals where it is alleged by the appellant that there is error in any order, requirement, decision, determination, or refusal” made by any administrative officer in the administration or enforcement of the Zoning Regulations. (D.C. Official Code § 6-641.07(g)(1) (2012 Repl.). *See also* 11 DCMR § 3100.2.) Appeals to the Board of Zoning Adjustment “may be taken by any person aggrieved, or organization authorized to represent that person, ... affected by any decision of an administrative officer...granting or withholding a certificate of occupancy...based in whole or part upon any zoning regulations or map” adopted pursuant to the Zoning Act. D.C. Official Code § 6-641.07(f) (2008 Repl.). (*See also* 11 DCMR § 3200.2.) In an appeal, the Board may “reverse or affirm, wholly or partly; or may modify the order, requirement, decision, determination, or refusal appealed from; or may make any order that may be necessary to carry out its decision or authorization; and to that end shall have all the powers of the officer or body from whom the appeal is taken.” (11 DCMR § 3100.4.)

With regard to timeliness, the Appellant asserted that the appeal was timely filed under 11 DCMR § 3112.2(a) “having been filed within 60 days from the date the Appellant had notice or knowledge of the decision complained of”; that is, the decision of the Zoning Administrator as conveyed in the May 16 letter. (Exhibit 4.) The Appellant emphasized that the decision being appealed was not the original issuance of the certificate of occupancy but “the Zoning Administrator’s refusal to revoke the Certificate of Occupancy after being made aware of the mistake....” (Exhibit 20.) According to the Appellant, the “illegal issuance of a certificate of occupancy is invalid and can be revoked at any time and shall not be construed as an approval of a violation of the Zoning Regulations,” citing *Gorgone v. D.C. Board of Zoning Adjustment*, 973 A.2d 692, 694 (D.C. 2009).

DCRA countered that the certificate of occupancy was issued September 1, 2011 – that is, more than 60 days before the appeal was submitted – and that the May 16 letter from the Zoning Administrator was not an appealable decision because it was not the first issuance of notice that

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the Zoning Administrator would issue a certificate of occupancy for a child development center at the subject property.

The Board concurs with DCRA and concludes that, with respect to the child development center, the appeal must be dismissed as untimely. The zoning decision to allow the child development center use at the subject property was made with the issuance of the building permit on August 12, 2011 and reaffirmed by the issuance of the certificate of occupancy on September 1, 2011. The Appellant knew or could have known of the zoning decision to permit a child development center at the subject property at that time. The Appellant admitted knowledge of both the 2011 building permit and the certificate of occupancy. The Appellant admits they chose not to challenge the issuances of the certificate of occupancy in 2011, believing they would not be affected by the child development center. It was not until two years later, 2013, that the Appellant hired an attorney to challenge the child development center. Additionally, the permit was posted at the property. (Tr., p. 50.) Nevertheless, this appeal was filed well past the 60-day deadline for a timely challenge to the Zoning Administrator's decision to issue a certificate of occupancy for the child development center, and therefore must be dismissed.

The Board heard testimony that the permit was posted at the property, and the Appellant conceded knowing "a couple of years ago" both that the charter school was not continuing at the church property and, soon thereafter, that a child development center had opened there. (Tr., p. 50.) Nevertheless, this appeal was filed well past the 60-day deadline for a timely challenge to the Zoning Administrator's decision to issue a certificate of occupancy for the child development center, and therefore must be dismissed.

The Board also concurs with DCRA that the May 16 letter was not appealable with respect to the issuance of a certificate of occupancy for the child development center because the letter did not provide "the first notice from which an aggrieved person knew or 'reasonably should have ... know[n]' ... of the resolution or decision that the certificate represents...." *Basken v. D.C. Board of Zoning Adjustment*, 946 A.2d 356, 367 (D.C. 2008). The May 16 letter merely reaffirmed the Zoning Administrator's decision that a child development center was permitted at the subject property, as already reflected in the issuance of the building permit and certificate of occupancy almost three years earlier. The May 16 letter did not "start another sixty-day appeal period as to any and all DCRA zoning decisions affecting a project that preceded issuance of the [letter]." *Id.*

The Appellant contends that the appeal challenges not the issuance of the certificate of occupancy but the Zoning Administrator's alleged refusal to revoke a mistakenly issued certificate "after being made aware of the mistake." However, the Zoning Administrator has not found any mistake with respect to the issuance of the certificate of occupancy for the child development center. The Zoning Administrator's reasoning was explained in the May 16 letter, which did not state any mistake in the rationale.

As to the merits of the remaining issues, the Board first concludes the use of the apartment to house the staff of the youth missionary program is not a standalone matter of right residential use

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but is part of the youth ministry program. The May 16 letter described the Zoning Administrator's "understanding that there is an occupied two-bedroom apartment unit" in the church building and that "a dwelling unit for the pastor or minister of a church is ... a typical, appropriate accessory use to a church."

However, in this proceeding, the church pastor described the apartment as being used to house two couples who serve as directors of the youth missionary program. This apartment on the church property goes beyond merely providing a residence for the pastor of the church and therefore cannot be considered a matter of right parsonage/rectory use pursuant to 11 DCMR § 201.1 (l). Nor can the apartment be considered a lawful "one-family dwelling" as the Zoning Administrator seems to have suggested. Only detached one-family dwellings are permitted in an R-1 zone. (11 DCMR § 201.1 (k).) This apartment is not detached but contained within the church building. Permitting a parsonage/rectory in a church building is therefore an exception to the general rule that matter of right residential uses in the R-1 district must be in detached dwellings. And because it is an exception, the interpretation of what constitutes a parsonage/rectory must be narrowly construed.

Because the staff housing on the church property extends beyond merely providing a residence for the pastor, as contemplated by the matter-of-right church use, use of the church property to house the staff of the youth ministry program should be considered to be part of that program and analyzed together as a single use. Therefore, for the purposes of this Order, all further references to "youth missionary program" includes the program as separately described in the record as well as the housing provided in the form of an apartment for two families who serve as the program's directors.

Second, the Board finds no merit in DCRA's claim, raised for the first time in its pre-hearing statement (Exhibit 18), that the youth ministry program is an integral operation of the Church and therefore inseparable from that matter of right use. DCRA cites the Board's decision in Application No. 18418 (*Pilgrim Baptist Church*; order issued May 7, 2013) and claims that "any operations conducted by a church that are performed in support of the church's mission are allowed in the R-1 through R-5 zones as a matter of right." The Board concludes that the facts in *Pilgrim Baptist Church* are distinguishable from those presented in this appeal.

In *Pilgrim Baptist Church* the applicant proposed to expand its administrative functions to provide offices for up to five employees of the church as well as meeting rooms and storage space for files and equipment. All of the activity proposed for the expanded administrative space would be "in support of the Church's operations and all administrative offices [would] be operated by Church employees." In dismissing the application for special exception approval as a church program under § 216, the Board concluded that no zoning relief was needed because the administrative functions were "in integral part of the Church's operations" that could operate as a matter of right as part of the church use.

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The Board does not find that the youth missionary in operation at Embassy Church is an integral part of the church use in the same way as the administrative support function at issue in the *Pilgrim Baptist* case. The program, as described by the pastor and by DCRA, is not an inherent aspect of a church use but is carried out at Embassy Church in addition to the typical operation of a church as a place of worship. The youth ministry program involves the participation of approximately 30 people who live on the premises and carry out activities both on the church property and elsewhere. The participants are not permanent members of the congregation but attend the program for periods of up to three months. The pastor acknowledged at the public hearing that participants in similar programs in other locations do not necessarily live at a church property. The nature of the youth missionary program distinguishes the activity from the typical use of a church or other place of worship.

Finally the Board rejects the Zoning Administrator's original contention, now DCRA's fallback position, that even if the youth missionary program was not allowed as part of the church use, those uses would be allowed as accessory to the church use. The Appellant disputed the rationale stated in the May 16 letter that the program was permitted as accessory to the principal church use since the activity was limited to not more than 10% of the floor area of the church building. The Appellant challenged the likelihood that program participants were "restricted to a portion of the Property which represents only 10% of the floor area of the Building" as "not only improbable, [but] known by the Appellant to be patently false" based on the Appellant's observations. The Appellant disputed that "such an intensive 24-hour a day use by thirty (30) full-time residents is merely accessory to a church use that takes place a few hours a week."

The Appellant is correct. Contrary to DCRA's premise, the percentage to which a use occupies a structure is not dispositive of the issue as to whether the use is subordinate. The Zoning Regulations define an accessory use as "a use customarily incidental and subordinate to the principal use, and located on the same lot with the principal use." (11 DCMR § 199.1.) The definition does not rely on a specific percentage of floor area to determine whether a given use is in fact accessory to a principal use, and thus a use is not necessarily "accessory" even if it is limited to 10% (or any other percentage) of gross floor area. For the reasons stated above, the youth missionary program and the related staff housing are not "customarily incidental" to a church or other place of worship.

For these reasons, the Board concludes that the youth missionary program including the housing for its staff is not a matter of right use in the R-1-B zone. Although the Board is not required to suggest what form of zoning relief might be available, it believes that the use could be characterized as a residence for clerical groups or religious denominations in excess of 15 people, subject to special exception approval under § 215, or a program conducted by a church congregation or group of churches that is subject to special exception approval under § 216.

The Board is required to give "great weight" to the issues and concerns raised by the affected ANC. (Section 13(d) of the Advisory Neighborhood Commissions Act of 1975, effective March 26, 1976 (D.C. Law 1-21; D.C. Official Code § 1-309.10(d) (2001)).) In this case, ANC 3C

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adopted a resolution encouraging the Board to grant the appeal and to require Embassy Church to “discontinue the child development center use, the religious/clerical use, and the additional family dwelling use, unless and until the Owner obtains special exception or variance approval from the BZA for such uses.” For the reasons discussed above, the Board determined that the appeal must be dismissed as untimely with respect to the challenge relating to the child development center, but, with respect to the youth missionary program and the residential use of the subject property, the Board concurs with the ANC that the Zoning Administrator’s determination should be reversed and the uses require review and approval by the Board.

Based on the findings of fact and conclusion of law, the Board concludes that the Appellant has satisfied the burden of proof with respect to the claim of error in the decision of the Zoning Administrator that a youth missionary program and related staff housing are allowed as a matter of right at a property devoted to church use, but not with respect to the claim of error in the issuance of a certificate of occupancy for a child development center at that property, located in the R-1-B zone at 3855 Massachusetts Avenue, N.W. (Square 1816, Lot 824). Accordingly, it is therefore **ORDERED** that the Zoning Administrator’s determination is **SUSTAINED in part and REVERSED in part**.

For the reasons discussed above, the Board does not agree with DCRA’s assertion that the residential use by staff members is permitted as a matter of right as part of the church use.

VOTE: **4-0-1** (Lloyd J. Jordan, S. Kathryn Allen, Marnique Y. Heath, and Jeffrey L. Hinkle voting to Dismiss, as untimely, the appeal with respect to the child development center; Marcie I. Cohen not present, not voting).

VOTE: **5-0-0** (Lloyd J. Jordan, S. Kathryn Allen, Marnique Y. Heath, Jeffrey L. Hinkle, and Marcie I. Cohen (by absentee vote) to Reverse the determination of the Zoning Administrator with respect to the use of the subject property for a youth ministry program and related staff housing).

BY ORDER OF THE D.C. BOARD OF ZONING ADJUSTMENT

A majority of the Board members approved the issuance of this order.

(Square 397, Lot 828).

DECISION AND ORDER

Robert J. Searle (the “Applicant”) submitted this self-certified application on August 29, 2014. The application requests a variance from the Zoning Regulations to allow construction of a third-story rear addition to a row dwelling that does not presently conform with lot occupancy under § 403.2 or open court under § 406.1, thereby resulting in the enlargement of a nonconforming structure as prohibited in § 2001.3. The Applicant is the owner of the property at issue, which is located at 1522 8th Street, N.W. (Square 397, Lot 828) (the “Subject Property”) and is mapped in the R-4 District. Following two public hearings, the Board voted to approve the application.

PRELIMINARY MATTERS

Notice of Application and Notice of Hearing. By memoranda dated July 29, 2013, the Office of Zoning provided notice of the application to the Office of Planning (“OP”); the District Department of Transportation (“DDOT”); the Councilmember for Ward 6; Advisory Neighborhood Commission (“ANC”) 6E, the ANC for the area in which the Subject Property is located; and Single Member District/ANC 6E01. Pursuant to § 3113.13, the Office of Zoning mailed letters on August 7, 2014, providing notice of the hearing to the Applicant, ANC 6E, and the owners of all property within 200 feet of the Subject Property. Notice of the hearing was published in the *D.C. Register* on August 15, 2014. (*See* 61 DCR 8391.)

Party Status. The Applicant and ANC 6E are automatically parties to this proceeding. No other persons requested party status.

Applicant’s Case. The Applicant provided evidence and testimony describing the proposed project. Currently, there is a load-bearing masonry wall in the Applicant’s dwelling, running parallel to street frontage. This wall is in the interior of the cellar, first, and second floors, and it serves as the exterior rear wall for the third floor, which occupies approximately three-fifths of the footprint of the lower floors. The Applicant stated that this wall, which currently carries the load of the third-floor roof, has deteriorated due to lack of maintenance and defective upgrades

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by previous owners, resulting in the wall being structurally unsound. The Applicant proposed to demolish the wall from the first floor up to the roof and expand the third floor to match the lower floor footprint. The expansion of the third floor was necessary to shift the roof load to the exterior rear wall.¹

OP Report. In its reports submitted to the Board (Exhibits 29, 32) and at the Board's hearings, OP opposed approval of the application, contending that it did not meet the requirements for variance relief. OP stated that the practical difficulty alleged by the Applicant arises from the proposal to remove the deteriorated wall and that it is not clear that expanding the third floor is necessary to solve the existing structural deficiency. Specifically, OP suggested that this deficiency could be solved by reconstructing the deteriorated wall rather than removing it permanently. Alternatively, OP suggested reframing the third floor within the existing footprint to redistribute the roof load to the party wall and dog-leg wall. OP concluded that the build-out of the third floor would impair the public good because it could potentially impact the light, air, and privacy of neighboring property owners. Lastly, OP asserted that the intent and purpose of the Zoning Regulations would be harmed if relief was granted because the Applicant failed to show that relief was needed.

DDOT Report. By memorandum dated October 16, 2014, DDOT indicated no objection to approval of the application. (Exhibit 27.)

ANC Report. By letter dated October 20, 2014, ANC 6E indicated that it discussed the application at its regularly scheduled, properly noticed meeting on September 2, 2014, and, with a quorum present, voted 7-0 to support the application. (Exhibit 28.)

Party in opposition. No persons requested party status nor appeared in opposition to the application.

Persons in support. No persons appeared in support of the application. The owner of the adjacent property to the south at 1520 8th Street, N.W. signed a letter in support. (Exhibit 25.)

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Subject Property

1. The Subject Property is an interior, L-shaped lot located on the west side of the street at 1522 8th Street, N.W. between P Street and Q Street N.W. (Square 397, Lot 397).
2. The Subject Property is improved with a three-story row dwelling and a detached garage. The garage occupies the rear yard and abuts an alley to the west.

¹ The Applicant's original plan also added a stairway penthouse and rooftop deck to the dwelling. However, the Applicant revised the plan to exclude these additions for his second hearing on December 2, 2014. (Exhibit 31.)

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3. The Subject Property is zoned R-4, is located in the Shaw Historic District, and is listed on the District of Columbia Inventory of Historic Sites.
4. The adjacent properties to the north and south are both two-story row dwellings.
5. The Subject Property is nonconforming as to lot occupancy. The existing lot occupancy of the Subject Property is 77%. Under § 403.2, the maximum lot occupancy allowed as a matter of right for a row dwelling in the R-4 District is 60%, and up to 70% may be granted by special exception under § 223.3. The row dwelling constitutes 53% of the Subject Property's lot occupancy; the rear garage constitutes the remaining lot occupancy. The footprint of the existing third floor constitutes 32% lot occupancy.
6. The Subject Property is nonconforming as to open court. The Subject Property has an open court with a width of five feet ten inches. Subsection 406.1 requires that open courts in the R-4 District have a minimum width of four inches per foot of height, but not less than six feet.

The Applicant's Project

7. The Applicant proposes to add an addition to the existing structure that would extend the existing third floor to the rear so as to match the footprint of the lower floors. The proposal would not increase the nonconforming lot occupancy but would increase the height and therefore extend the nonconforming court.

The Zoning Relief Required

8. Subsection 2001.3(a) disallows the expansion of any structure that does not conform to lot occupancy even if the nonconforming lot occupancy is not increased. Because the existing lot occupancy of the Subject Property exceeds that which may be permitted by right or granted by special exception, any expansion of the structure requires a variance pursuant to § 2001.3(a).
9. Subsection 2001.3(b)(2) disallows the expansion of any structure that increases or extends any existing, nonconforming aspect of the structure. In this case the extension of the third floor will extend the height of the nonconforming court.

The Exceptional Condition and Practical Difficulty

10. There is a load-bearing masonry wall in the Applicant's dwelling, running parallel to street frontage.
11. This wall is in the interior of the cellar, first, and second floors, and it serves as the exterior rear wall for the third floor, which occupies approximately three-fifths of the footprint of the lower floors.

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12. The wall carries the load of the third-floor roof.
13. The wall is structurally unsound and inadequate to carry the load of the third-floor roof.
14. The wall has deteriorated due to lack of maintenance and defective upgrades by previous owners. This deterioration includes cracks, mortar damage, and bowing.
15. Pursuant to a request made by the Applicant's architect, Mr. Roger Chebib, a structural engineer, visited the Subject Property on November 5, 2014, to examine the wall at issue. Mr. Chebib in a letter dated November 8, 2014, indicated his visual observation and examination "revealed that the wall is in very bad condition." (Exhibit 31C.) Specifically, the letter states that there are eroded mortar joints along the entire wall, as well as out of plane and horizontal movement in several locations throughout the wall.
16. The letter stated Mr. Chebib's strong belief that the wall must be demolished because it "would be extremely difficult to stabilize during construction and may simply collapse during the process."
17. The Applicant therefore proposes to demolish the load-bearing masonry wall from the first floor up and transferring the weight to the exterior load bearing walls by extending the rear of the third floor towards the rear to match the footprint of the floors below.
18. Extending the third floor would shift the roof load to the rear exterior wall of the dwelling and is necessary to account for the lack of support resulting from removal of the deteriorated wall.
19. Demolishing the wall on the ground floor and above would also take the load off of the cellar portion of the wall, thus preventing further deterioration and eliminating the need to conduct demolition in the cellar floor.

The Zone Plan and the Public Good

20. The R-4 District is designed to include areas developed primarily with row dwellings, but within which there have been a substantial number of conversions into dwellings for two or more families. (11 DCMR § 330.1.) The primary purpose of the R-4 District is the stabilization of remaining one-family dwellings. (11 DCMR § 330.2.)
21. The owner of the adjacent property to the south at 1520 8th Street, N.W. indicated in writing the proposed project would not have a substantially adverse effect the owner's use or enjoyment of her home, nor would it affect the owner's light, air, or privacy. (Exhibit 25A.)
22. The owner of the property to the north made a similar verbal representation to the Applicant.

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CONCLUSIONS OF LAW AND OPINION

The Applicant proposes to construct a third-story addition to a row dwelling in the R-4 District. The Subject Property does not meet the zoning requirements for lot occupancy under § 403.2 or open court under § 406.1. Because the structure is nonconforming as to lot occupancy, any enlargement of the structure requires zoning relief. (11 DCMR § 2001.3(a).) In addition, the extension of the nonconforming court separately triggers the need for zoning relief pursuant to § 2001.3(b)(2). Although this is an addition to a one-family dwelling, special exception relief from § 2001.3 is unavailable because the existing lot occupancy exceeds the 70% maximum permitted by § 223.3.

The Board is authorized to grant variances from the strict application of the Zoning Regulations by § 8 of the Zoning Act of 1938, D.C. Official Code § 6-641.07(g)(3) (2012 Repl.). The Zoning Regulations provide that the Board may grant such variances in the following circumstances:

where, by reason of exceptional narrowness, shallowness, or shape of a specific piece of property at the time of the original adoption of the regulations, or by reason of exceptional topographical conditions or other extraordinary or exceptional situation or condition of a specific piece of property, the strict application of any [zoning] regulation . . . would result in peculiar and exceptional practical difficulties to or exceptional and undue hardship upon the owner of such property . . . provided [variance] relief can be granted without substantial detriment to the public good and without substantially impairing the intent, purpose, and integrity of the zone plan as embodied in the Zoning Regulations and Map

(11 DCMR § 3103.2; *see also* D.C. Official Code § 6-641.07(g)(3).)

Variances are classified as area variances or use variances. (11 DCMR § 3103.3.) An area variance is a request to deviate from an area requirement applicable to the zone district in which the property is located. (11 DCMR § 3103.4.) The Applicant seeks an area variance, because it requests a deviation from the “prohibition against certain enlargements and additions to nonconforming structures as stated at § 2001.3.” (11 DCMR § 3103.3.)

The Court of Appeals has interpreted the Zoning Act and Regulations as imposing a three-part test for granting an area variance. The Applicant “must show that (1) there is an extraordinary or exceptional condition affecting the property; (2) practical difficulties will occur if the zoning regulations are strictly enforced; and (3) the requested relief can be granted without substantial detriment to the public good and without substantially impairing the intent, purpose, and integrity of the zone plan.” *Fleischman v. D.C. Bd. of Zoning Adjustment*, 27 A.3d 554, 560 (D.C. 2011) (quoting *Wash. Canoe Club v. D.C. Zoning Comm’n*, 779 A.2d 995, 1000 (D.C. 2005)).

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To demonstrate an exceptional situation or condition, a property owner must demonstrate that there are unique circumstances peculiar to the owners's property and that these circumstances are not merely the general conditions of the neighborhood. *Application of Richard and Janet Barnes*, 61 DCR 9101, 9104, BZA App. No. 18679 (August 2014) (quoting *Palmer v. D.C. Bd. of Zoning Adjustment*, 287 A.2d 535, 539 (D.C. 1972)). The exceptional condition may arise out of the structures existing on the property and need not derive from the condition of the land those structures occupy. *Id.*; see also *Clerics of St. Viator, Inc. v. D.C. Bd. of Zoning Adjustment*, 320 A.2d 291, 294 (D.C. 1974) ("It makes no practical difference whether the [zoning nonconformity] stems from topographical conditions of the land itself or from the existence of a structure on the land.").

In order to prove practical difficulties an applicant must demonstrate both that compliance with the area restriction would be unnecessarily burdensome and that the practical difficulties he would face absent zoning relief are unique to the Subject Property. See *Gilmartin*, 579 A.2d at 1170. There is no rote rule regarding how significant a burden must be in order to qualify as a "practical difficulty." Rather "the nature and extent of the burden which will warrant an area variance is best left to the facts and circumstances of each particular case." *Id.* (citing *Wolf v. D.C. Bd. of Zoning Adjustment*, 397 A.2d 936, 942 (D.C. 1979)).

For the reasons stated below, the Board concludes that the Applicant has met all three prongs of the variance test.

Exceptional Situation or Condition.

The existence of an unsound interior load bearing masonry wall and the need to replace it constitute the exceptional condition on the property. The wall carries the load of the third-floor roof and has deteriorated due to lack of maintenance and defective upgrades by previous owners. This deterioration includes cracks, mortar damage, and bowing resulting in the wall being structurally unsound and inadequate to carry the load of the third-floor roof. The wall must be replaced in order to preserve the structural integrity of the subject property. The unsound condition of the wall and the need to replace it constitutes an exceptional condition.

Practical Difficulties.

Strict compliance with the Zoning Regulations would preclude the Applicant from taking the actions needed to accommodate the shift in load that would result from the demolition of the load bearing wall.

The masonry wall carries the weight of the third-floor roof. In order to compensate for the loss of this support, the Applicant has no choice but to extend the rear of the third floor towards the rear to match the footprint of the floors below. This will shift the roof load to the rear exterior wall of the dwelling. Strict compliance with the Zoning Regulations would prohibit the expansion of the nonconforming structure and therefore rendered the structure unsafe and unusable.

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Impairment to the Public Good and Detriment to the Zoning Plan.

Granting the variances will have no substantial detrimental effect on the public good, nor will it substantially impair the intent, purpose, and integrity of the zone plan.

As to the first issue, the record includes a letter from the owner of the adjacent property to the south stating that the proposed project would not adversely affect the use or enjoyment of her home. Further, the neighbor to the north was consulted and expressed no opposition to the proposed project. The record evidence further supports a finding of no adverse impact on the light, air, or privacy of adjacent properties.

With respect to impairment of the zone plan, the stated purpose for the R-4 District will be unaffected by the proposed project. Pursuant to § 330.2, the primary purpose of that District is the stabilization of remaining one-family dwellings. Here, the structure will remain a row-dwelling after the addition. Further, the relief sought is slight. Indeed, had it not been for the existence of the garage, the Applicant could have applied for court width relief as a special exception pursuant to 11 DCMR § 223.²

Great Weight.

The Board is required under § 13(d) of the Advisory Neighborhood Commissions Act of 1975, effective March 26, 1976 (D.C. Law 1-21; D.C. Official Code § 1-309.10(d) (2102 Repl.)) to give “great weight” to the issues and concerns raised in the written report of the affected ANC, which in this case is ANC 6E. To satisfy the great weight requirement, District agencies must articulate with particularity and precision the reasons why an affected ANC does or does not offer persuasive advice under the circumstances. As noted, the ANC voted to express its support of the application and, for the reasons stated above, the Board finds this advice to be persuasive.

The Board is also required under § 5 of the Office of Zoning Independence Act of 1990, effective September 20, 1990 (D.C. Law 8-163; D.C. Official Code § 6-623.04), to give great weight to OP recommendations. OP recommended denial of the application based on its belief that no practical difficulty had been shown and that granting the variance would cause substantial detriment to the public good and substantially impair the purpose, intent, and integrity of the zone plan.

As to the absence of a practical difficulty, OP believed that alternatives existed to the removal of the masonry wall.

First, OP suggested that the load of the roof could be redistributed to the party walls and dog-leg wall by reframing the third floor within its existing footprint. However, the Applicant provided ample evidence, through the testimony of the project’s architect and the letter of a structural

² The Board rejects as wasteful any suggestion that the Applicant should have demolished the existing garage.

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engineer who inspected the Subject Property, that the wall at issue had deteriorated such that it is structurally unsound and, thus, needs to be demolished.

Second, OP suggested that the Applicant could rebuild the deteriorated wall in lieu of expanding the third floor. However, OP acknowledged at the Board's December 2, 2014, hearing that doing so would require conducting demolition in the newly renovated cellar floor. By contrast, cellar-level demolition could be avoided by removing the wall on the ground floor and above, which would remove the load from the cellar portion of the wall, thus preventing further deterioration.

Thus, the Board concludes that the Applicant has "no feasible alternative method" to resolve the property's structural deficiencies other than to demolish the load bearing walls above the cellar level and expand the third floor to shift the load to the rear. *See Ass'n For Pres. of 1700 Block of N St., N.W., & Vicinity v. D.C. Bd. of Zoning Adjustment*, 384 A.2d 674, 678 (D.C. 1978) (affirming the Board's ruling that a YMCA had no alternatives that would permit parking compliance and still have a full sized pool).

As to the third prong of the variance test, OP expressed concern that the build-out of the third floor could potentially impact the light, air, and privacy of neighboring property owners. This concern is purely speculative and is refuted by the written and verbal statements made respectively by the adjacent property owners to the south and north.

Finally, the OP report asserted that granting the variance would substantially impair the intent, purpose, and integrity of the Zoning Regulations "because the Applicant has not provided sufficient justification as to why the nonconforming structure should be expanded," thus repeating its argument, discussed above, as to the absence of practical difficulty. For the reasons explained above, the Board already found OP's practical difficulty argument unpersuasive. OP presented no independent basis for its conclusion that the zone plan would be substantially impaired by the grant of the relief, and as stated above, the Board concludes that no such basis exists.

Based on these findings of fact and conclusions of law, the Board concludes that the Applicant has satisfied his burden to meet the requirements for the grant of variance relief under § 3103 to allow construction of a third-floor rear addition to a row dwelling not meeting zoning requirements for lot occupancy under § 403.2, open court under § 406.1, and enlargement of a nonconforming structure under § 2001.3 in the R-4 District at 1522 8th Street, N.W. (Square 397, Lot 828). Accordingly, it is **ORDERED** that the application is **GRANTED, SUBJECT TO THE APPROVED PLANS AT EXHIBIT 11, AS REVISED BY EXHIBIT 31.**

SUMMARY ORDER

REVIEW BY THE ZONING ADMINISTRATOR / SELF-CERTIFICATION

The application was accompanied by a memorandum, dated March 10, 2015, from the Zoning Administrator certifying the required relief. (Exhibit 10.) Subsequently, at the hearing, based on a recommendation by the Office of Planning, the Applicant verbally amended his application to add variance relief from the nonconforming structure requirements under § 2001.3. The Board requested the Applicant file a self-certification form to reflect all the relief being requested, including the amended relief. (See Exhibit 27.)

The Board of Zoning Adjustment (the “Board”) provided proper and timely notice of the public hearing on this application by publication in the *D.C. Register* and by mail to the Applicant, Advisory Neighborhood Commission (“ANC”) 4A, and to owners of property within 200 feet of the site. The site of this application is located within the jurisdiction of ANC 4A, which is automatically a party to this application. The ANC did not file a report or testify regarding this application. Nonetheless, the Applicant’s agent testified that she met with the ANC commissioner representing the Single Member District (“SMD”), ANC 4A02, in which the Applicant’s property is located. The agent stated that the SMD commissioner did not indicate that a presentation before the full Advisory Neighborhood Commission was needed.

¹At the hearing, based on a recommendation by the Office of Planning, the Applicant verbally amended his application to add relief from the nonconforming structures requirement under § 2001.3. Although the case was brought through a Zoning Administrator referral letter (Exhibit 10), the Board requested the Applicant file a self-certified form to reflect all the relief being requested, including the amended relief. (See Exhibit 27.) Also at the hearing, the Board requested that the Applicant submit a letter of authorization signed by the agent, to complete the original authorization letter (Exhibit 6) which omitted the agent’s signature. (Exhibit 24.) The caption has been changed to reflect the amended relief accordingly.

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The Office of Planning (“OP”) submitted a timely report and testified at the hearing in support of the application. (Exhibit 23.) The District Department of Transportation (“DDOT”) filed a timely report expressing no objection to the approval of the application. (Exhibit 21.)

As directed by 11 DCMR § 3119.2, the Board required the Applicant to satisfy the burden of proving the elements that are necessary to establish the case for variances under § 3103.2, from the strict application of the rear yard requirements under § 404.1, the accessory building requirements under § 2500, and the non-conforming structure requirements under § 2001.3, to allow the addition of a sunroom to the rear of an existing one-family dwelling in the R-1-B District. No parties appeared at the public hearing in opposition to this application. Accordingly, a decision by the Board to grant this application would not be adverse to any party.

Based upon the record before the Board and having given great weight to the OP report, the Board concludes that the Applicant has met the burden of proof, pursuant to 11 DCMR §§ 3103.2, 404.1, 2500, and 2001.3, that there exists an exceptional or extraordinary situation or condition related to the property that creates a practical difficulty or undue hardship for the owner in complying with the Zoning Regulations, and that the requested relief can be granted without substantial detriment to the public good and without substantially impairing the intent, purpose, and integrity of the zone plan as embodied in the Zoning Regulations and Map.

Pursuant to 11 DCMR § 3100.5, the Board has determined to waive the requirement of 11 DCMR § 3125.3, that the order of the Board be accompanied by findings of fact and conclusions of law. The waiver will not prejudice the rights of any party and is appropriate in this case.

It is therefore **ORDERED** that this application is hereby **GRANTED, SUBJECT TO THE APPROVED PLANS AT EXHIBIT 4.**

On May 29, 2015, the Office of Zoning received an application from Jemal’s CDC, LLC (the “Applicant”) for approval of a consolidated PUD and related map amendment for the above-referenced property.

The property that is the subject of this application consists of Lots 30, 31 32, 33, 142, and 820 in Square 1065 in southeast Washington, D.C. (Ward 6), which is located at 1401 Pennsylvania Avenue, S.E. The property is currently split-zoned C-2-A/R-4. The Applicant proposes a PUD-related map amendment to rezone the property, for the purposes of this project, to C-2-B.

The site is currently improved with an existing one-story fast food restaurant, a two-story vacant commercial office building, and a surface parking lot. The Applicant proposes to redevelop the site with a 148,638-square-foot, mixed-use residential project. The building will contain 170-190 residential units in approximately 123,631 square feet and 22,478 square feet of ground-floor retail space. The maximum height of the building will be approximately 78 feet and the overall density will be 5.29 floor area ratio (“FAR”). The project will be designed to the LEED-Silver standard and contain a substantial green roof.
