IN THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

OCTOBER 4, 2016

To limit the application of the doctrine of contributory negligence in cases of collisions between non-motorized users of public highways and motor vehicles.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this act may be cited as the "Motor Vehicle Collision Recovery Act of 2016".

Sec. 2. Definitions.

For the purposes of this act, the term:

(1) "Motor vehicle" shall have the same meaning as provided in section 2(d) of the Motor Vehicle Safety Responsibility Act of the District of Columbia, approved May 25, 1954 (68 Stat. 120; D.C. Official Code § 50-1301.02(4)).

(2) "Non-motorized user" means an individual using a skateboard, non-motorized scooter, Segway, tricycle, and other similar non-powered transportation devices.

(3) "Pedestrian" shall have the same meaning as provided in 18 DCMR § 9901.1.

(4) "Public highway" shall have the same meaning as provided in section 2(i) of the Motor Vehicle Safety Responsibility Act of the District of Columbia, approved May 25, 1954 (68 Stat. 120; D.C. Official Code § 50-1301.02(9)).

Sec. 3. Contributory negligence limitation.

(a) The negligence of a pedestrian, bicyclist, or other non-motorized user of a public highway involved in a collision with a motor vehicle shall not bar the plaintiff's recovery in any civil action unless the plaintiff's negligence is:

(1) A proximate cause of the plaintiff's injury; and

(2) Greater than the aggregated total amount of negligence of all of the defendants that proximately caused the plaintiff's injury.

(b) Nothing in this act shall be construed to:

(1) Change or affect the doctrine of joint and several liability or the last clear chance doctrine; or

(2) Reduce the legal protections provided to pedestrians and cyclists under:

(A) Section 3 of An Act To enable the blind and the otherwise physically disabled to participate fully in the social and economic life of the District of Columbia, approved October 21, 1972 (86 Stat. 971; D.C. Official Code § 7-1004); or

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(B) Section 7 of the District of Columbia Comprehensive Bicycle Transportation and Safety Act of 1984, effective May 23, 2000 (D.C. Law 13-112; D.C. Official Code § 50-1606).

Sec. 4. Non-severability.

If any provision of this act or its application to any person or circumstance is held to be unconstitutional, beyond the statutory authority of the Council, or otherwise invalid, then all provisions of this act shall be deemed invalid.

Sec. 5. Fiscal impact statement.

The Council adopts the fiscal impact statement in the committee report as the fiscal impact statement required by section 4a of the General Legislative Procedures Act of 1975, approved October 16, 2006 (120 Stat. 2038; D.C. Official Code § 1-301.47a).

Sec. 6. Effective date.

This act shall take effect following approval by the Mayor (or in the event of veto by the Mayor, action by the Council to override the veto), a 30-day period of congressional review as provided in section 602(c)(1) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act, approved December 24, 1973 (87 Stat. 813; D.C. Official Code § 1-206.02(c)(1)), and publication in the District of Columbia Register.

OCTOBER 4, 2016

To establish a home accessibility modification grant program to aid qualified residents with the cost of making modifications to their homes that improve accessibility and enhance independent living; and to amend section 47-1803.02 of the District of Columbia Official Code to make a conforming amendment.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this act may be cited as the "Safe at Home Act of 2016".

Sec. 2. Home accessibility modification grant program.

(a) For the purposes of this act, the term:

(1) "Accessibility modification" means the construction or modification of a principal place of residence to enable or increase independent living for a person with a disability or who is 60 years of age or more.

(2) "Disability" shall have the same meaning as provided in section 2(4) of the Disability Rights Protection Act of 2006, effective March 8, 2007 (D.C. Law 16-239; D.C. Official Code § 2-1431.01(4)).

(3) "Dwelling unit" means any room or group of rooms forming a single unit that is used or intended to be used for living, sleeping, and the preparation or eating of meals that is located within a building that is wholly or partially used or intended to be used for living and sleeping by a human occupant.

(4) "Principal place of residence" means a dwelling unit in the District of Columbia in which an individual lives more than 50% of the calendar year.

(b) There is established a home accessibility modification grant program, the Safe at Home Program, to be administered by the Mayor for the purpose of assisting eligible residents to reduce risks of falls and to help ameliorate mobility issues by providing accessibility modifications to their principle places of residence. The Mayor may issue grants up to \$10,000 per residence and the grants shall be exempt from District income taxation.

(c) Accessibility modifications may include:

- (1) Furniture risers;
- (2) Handrails;
- (3) Grab bars;
- (4) Shower seats;
- (5) Stair lifts;

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- (6) Ramps;
 - (7) Doors usable by a person in a wheelchair; and
 - (8) Other modifications to improve accessibility and enhance independent living.
- (d) To be eligible for the Safe at Home Program, an applicant shall:
- (1) Be a resident of the District of Columbia;
 - (2) Provide proof of the applicant's principal place of residence and proof that the applicant owns the principal place of residence, or that the owner of the principal place of residence has given the applicant permission to make an accessibility modification to the property;
 - (3) Provide proof of a disability; except, that a person 60 years of age or more shall be exempt from this requirement; and
 - (4) Meet household income-eligibility limitations, as prescribed by the Mayor by rule.
- (e) The Mayor shall:
- (1) Develop a grant application form specific to the Safe at Home Program that shall require the minimum information and documentation necessary to determine eligibility for the program;
 - (2) Provide written notification to an applicant of approval or denial of a grant application within 60 days after receipt of a completed application, and if denied, include the reason for the denial and the process for reconsideration;
 - (3) Ensure that only fully licensed, certified contractors perform work authorized by the Safe at Home Program; and
 - (4) Within 180 days of the effective date of this act, pursuant to Title I of the District of Columbia Administrative Procedure Act, approved October 21, 1968 (82 Stat. 1204; D.C. Official Code § 2-501 *et seq.*), issue rules to implement the provisions of this act, which shall include:
 - (A) Household income-eligibility limitations;
 - (B) Guidelines for installation projects consistent with current ADA Accessibility Guidelines (28 CFR part 36, subpart D and 36 CFR 1191, appendices B and D) as published in *Guidance on the 2010 ADA Standards for Accessible Design*, Department of Justice, September 15, 2010; and
 - (C) Standards to ensure that the accessibility modifications authorized by the grant meet the needs of the applicant.

Sec. 3. Section 47-1803.02(a)(2) of the District of Columbia Official Code is amended by adding a new subparagraph (CC) to read as follows:

“(CC) The amount received by a taxpayer pursuant to section 2(b) of the Safe at Home Act of 2016, passed on 2nd reading on September 20, 2016 (Enrolled version of Bill 21-316).”.

Sec. 4. Applicability.

- (a) This act shall apply upon the date of inclusion of its fiscal effect in an approved

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budget and financial plan.

(b) The Chief Financial Officer shall certify the date of the inclusion of the fiscal effect in an approved budget and financial plan, and provide notice to the Budget Director of the Council of the certification.

(c)(1) The Budget Director shall cause the notice of the certification to be published in the District of Columbia Register.


(2) The date of publication of the notice of the certification shall not affect the applicability of this act.



To amend, on a temporary basis, the Rental Housing Act of 1985 to limit the amount of a hardship petition conditional rent increase to 5% of the rent charged, and to require that a rent adjustment be repaid by a housing provider to a tenant within 21 days of a conditional increase being amended.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this act may be cited as the "Rent Control Hardship Petition Limitation Temporary Amendment Act of 2016".

Sec. 2. The Rental Housing Act of 1985, effective July 17, 1985 (D.C. Law 6-10; D.C. Official Code § 42-3501.01 *et seq.*), is amended as follows:

(a) Section 206(c) (D.C. Official Code § 42-3502.06(c)) is amended to read as follows:

"(c)(1) At the housing provider's election, instead of any adjustment authorized by subsection (b) of this section, the rent charged for an accommodation may be adjusted through a hardship petition under section 212. The petition shall be clearly identified as an election instead of the general adjustments authorized by subsection (b) of this section. The Rent Administrator shall accord an expedited review process for these petitions and shall issue and publish a final decision within 90 days after the petition has been filed.

"(2) In the case of any petition filed under this subsection as to which a final decision has not been rendered by the Rent Administrator at the end of 90 days from the date of filing of the petition and as to which the housing provider is not in default in complying with any information request made under section 216, the rent charged adjustment requested in the petition may be conditionally implemented by the housing provider at the end of the 90-day period; provided, that the conditional rent increase for an affected unit shall not exceed 5% of the rent charged.

"(3) A conditional rent charged adjustment shall be subject to subsequent modification by the final decision of the Rent Administrator on the petition. If a hearing has been held on the petition, the Rent Administrator shall, by order served upon the parties at least 10 days before the expiration of the 90 days, make a provisional finding as to the rent charged adjustment justified by the order, if any. Except to the extent modified by this section, the adjustment procedures of section 216 shall apply to any adjustment.

"(4) If the Rent Administrator denies the requested rent increase or approves a

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rent increase that is less than the amount of the conditional rent increase charged by the housing provider, the housing provider shall refund to the tenant within 21 days of the Rent Administrator's order any rent paid in excess of the amount approved by the Rent Administrator, except that the tenant may elect within 14 days of the Rent Administrator's order to apply the amount of the refund as a credit against future rental payments."

(b) Section 212(c) (D.C. Official Code § 42-3502.12(c)) is amended to read as follows:

"(c)(1) At the housing provider's election, instead of any adjustment authorized by section 206(b), the rent charged for an accommodation may be adjusted through a hardship petition under this section. The petition shall be clearly identified as an election instead of the general adjustments authorized by section 206(b). The Rent Administrator shall accord an expedited review process for these petitions and shall issue and publish a final decision within 90 days after the petition has been filed.

"(2) In the case of any petition filed under this section as to which a final decision has not been rendered by the Rent Administrator at the end of 90 days from the date of filing of the petition and as to which the housing provider is not in default in complying with any information request made under section 216, the rent charged adjustment requested in the petition may be conditionally implemented by the housing provider at the end of the 90-day period; provided, that the conditional rent increase for an affected unit shall not exceed 5% of the rent charged.

"(3) A conditional rent charged adjustment shall be subject to subsequent modification by the final decision of the Rent Administrator on the petition. If a hearing has been held on the petition, the Rent Administrator shall, by order served upon the parties at least 10 days before the expiration of the 90 days, make a provisional finding as to the rent charged adjustment justified by the order, if any. Except to the extent modified by this section, the adjustment procedures of section 216 shall apply to any adjustment.

"(4) If the Rent Administrator denies the requested rent increase or approves a rent increase that is less than the amount of the conditional rent increase charged by the housing provider, the housing provider shall refund to the tenant within 21 days of the Rent Administrator's order any rent paid in excess of the amount approved by the Rent Administrator, except that the tenant may elect within 14 days of the Rent Administrator's order to apply the amount of the refund as a credit against future rental payments."

To amend, on a temporary basis, An Act To provide for the payment and collection of wages in the District of Columbia to clarify who may bring an action on behalf of an employee and when a general contractor and subcontractor or a general contractor and temporary staffing firm will be jointly and severally liable for violations, to revise criminal penalties for violations of the act, and to authorize the Mayor to issue rules to implement the provisions of the act; to amend the Minimum Wage Act Revision Act of 1992 to clarify the time period for retention of payroll records, when a general contractor and subcontractor or a general contractor and temporary staffing firm will be jointly and severally liable for violations, and how the Mayor shall make certain information available to employers; and to amend the Wage Theft Prevention Amendment Act of 2014 to repeal a retroactive applicability provision.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this act may be cited as the “Wage Theft Prevention Correction and Clarification Temporary Amendment Act of 2016”.

Sec. 2. An Act To provide for the payment and collection of wages in the District of Columbia, approved August 3, 1956 (70 Stat. 976; D.C. Official Code § 32-1301 *et seq.*), is amended as follows:

(a) Section 3 (D.C. Official Code § 32-1303) is amended as follows:

(1) Paragraph (5) is amended as follows:

(A) Strike the word “alleged” and insert the word “found” in its place.

(B) Strike the phrase “Act.” and insert the phrase “Act, except as otherwise provided in a contract between the contractor and subcontractor in effect on the effective date of the Wage Theft Prevention Amendment Act of 2014, effective February 26, 2015 (D.C. Law 20-157; 61 DCR 10157).” in its place.

(2) Paragraph (6) is amended by striking the phrase “District.” and inserting the phrase “District, except as otherwise provided in a contract between the temporary staffing firm and the employer in effect on the effective date of the Wage Theft Prevention Amendment Act of 2014, effective February 26, 2015 (D.C. Law 20-157; 61 DCR 10157).” in its place.

(b) Section 7(a) (D.C. Official Code § 32-1307(a)) is amended to read as follows:

ENROLLED ORIGINAL

“(a)(1) Any employer who negligently fails to comply with the provisions of this act or the Living Wage Act shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, shall be fined:

“(A) For the first offense, an amount per affected employee of not more than \$2,500;

“(B) For any subsequent offense, an amount per affected employee of not more than \$5,000.

“(2) Any employer who willfully fails to comply with the provisions of this act or the Living Wage Act shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, shall:

“(A) For the first offense, be fined not more than \$5,000, or imprisoned not more than 30 days, or both; or

“(B) For any subsequent offense, be fined not more than \$10,000, or imprisoned not more than 90 days, or both.

“(3) The fines set forth in paragraphs (1) and (2) of this subsection shall not be limited by section 101 of the Criminal Fine Proportionality Amendment Act of 2012, effective June 11, 2013 (D.C. Law 19-317; D.C. Official Code § 22-3571.01).”.

(c) Section 8(a) (D.C. Official Code § 32-1308(a)) is amended by striking the phrase “, or any entity a member of which is aggrieved by a violation of this act, the Minimum Wage Revision Act, the Sick and Safe Leave Act, or the Living Wage Act”.

(d) A new section 10b is added to read as follows:

“Sec. 10b. Rules.

“The Mayor, pursuant to Title I of the District of Columbia Administrative Procedure Act, approved October 21, 1068 (82 Stat. 1204; D.C. Official Code § 2-501 *et seq.*), may issue rules to implement the provisions of this act.”.

Sec. 3. The Minimum Wage Act Revision Act of 1992, effective March 25, 1993 (D.C. Law 9-248; D.C. Official Code § 32-1001 *et seq.*), is amended as follows:

(a) Section 9(a)(1) (D.C. Official Code § 32-1008(a)(1)) is amended by striking the phrase “3 years or whatever the prevailing federal standard is, whichever is greater” and inserting the phrase “3 years or the prevailing federal standard, if identified in regulations issued pursuant to this act, whichever is greater” in its place.

(b) Section 10(c) (D.C. Official Code § 32-1009(c)) is amended to read as follows:

“(c) The Mayor shall make copies or summaries of this act publicly available on the District government’s website or by some other appropriate method within 60 days of the effective date of the Wage Theft Prevention Amendment Act of 2014, effective February 26, 2015 (D.C. Law 20-157; 61 DCR 10157). An employer shall not be liable for failure to post notice if the Mayor has failed to provide to the employer the notice required by this section.”.

(c) Section 12(d)(1)(C) (D.C. Official Code § 32-1011(d)(1)(C)) is amended by striking the phrase “3 years or whatever the prevailing federal standard is, whichever is greater” and inserting the phrase “3 years or the prevailing federal standard, if identified in regulations issued pursuant to this act, whichever is greater” in its place.

(d) Section 13 (D.C. Official Code § 32-1012) is amended as follows:

(2) Subsection (f) is amended by striking the phrase "District." and inserting the phrase "District, except as otherwise provided in a contract between the temporary staffing firm and the employer in effect on the effective date of the Wage Theft Prevention Amendment Act of 2014, effective February 26, 2015 (D.C. Law 20-157; 61 DCR 10157)." in its place.

Sec. 4. Section 7 of the Wage Theft Prevention Amendment Act of 2014, effective February 26, 2015 (D.C. Law 20-157; 61 DCR 10157), is repealed.



OCTOBER 6, 2016

To amend, on a temporary basis, section 3209 of Title 17 of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations to create an exception to the requirement that an individual engaged in the practice of interior design be licensed for individuals participating in certain charitable fundraising events.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this act may be cited as the “Interior Design Charitable Event Regulation Temporary Amendment Act of 2016”.

Sec. 2. Section 3209 of Title 17 of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations (17 DCMR § 3209) is amended by adding a new subsection 3209.4 to read as follows:

“3209.4 (a) This chapter shall not require a license for, or restrict or prohibit an individual from engaging in, any activity or service described in § 3209.1 of this chapter, if:

- “(1) The individual is participating in a nonprofit organization’s fundraising event;
- “(2) The fundraising event is managed by at least one licensed interior designer;
- “(3) At least 85% of the funds raised at the fundraising event support a charitable activity; and
- “(4) The individual participates in the fundraising event without compensation.

“(b) An individual may rely on the exemption provided by paragraph (a) of this subsection no more than once per calendar year.”.

Sec. 3. Fiscal impact statement.



To amend, on an emergency basis, the District of Columbia Election Code of 1955 to allow registered voters who moved within the District of Columbia, but did not notify the District of Columbia Board of Elections of their change of address before the deadline, to vote at the precinct serving their current address.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this act may be cited as the “Election Day Change of Address Emergency Amendment Act of 2016”.

Sec. 2. The District of Columbia Election Code of 1955, approved August 12, 1955 (69 Stat. 699; D.C. Official Code § 1-1001.01 *et seq.*), is amended as follows:

(a) Section 7 (D.C. Official Code § 1-1001.07(i)(4)) is amended as follows:

(1) Subparagraph (A) is amended by striking the phrase “at the polling place serving the former residence address, subject to the requirements of section 302 of the Help America Vote Act, approved October 29, 2002 (116 Stat. 1706; 42 U.S.C. § 15483)” and insert the phrase “at the polling place serving the current residence address” in its place.

(2) Subparagraph (C) is amended by striking the phrase “only within the polling place assigned by the Board before election day” and inserting the phrase “at the polling place serving the current residence address or at the accessible polling place assigned by the Board pursuant to section 9(b)(3)” in its place.

(b) Section 9(b)(3) (D.C. Official Code § 1-1001.09(b)(3)) is amended by striking the phrase “Except pursuant to section 7(i)(4), no” and inserting the phrase “No” in its place.

Sec. 3. Fiscal impact statement.





BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this act may be cited as the “Ward 5 Paint Spray Booth Conditional Moratorium Emergency Act of 2016”.

Sec. 2. Paint spray booth moratorium.

(a) The Mayor shall not issue a permit for the construction or operation of an automobile paint spray booth in Ward 5.

(b) The Mayor shall not issue a renewal permit for the operation of an automobile paint spray booth in Ward 5.

(c) For the purposes of this act, the term “automobile paint spray booth” means a facility related to an auto body paint shop for which the applicant must obtain a minor source air pollutant permit from the Department of Energy and Environment.

Sec. 3. Scope of moratorium.

(a) Section 2 shall not apply to a permit for the construction of or the operation of, or a renewal permit for the operation of, an automobile paint spray booth that contains conditions at least as restrictive as the following:

(1) Automobile coating for motor vehicle and mobile equipment non-assembly line refinishing and recoating, as applied, shall not contain volatile organic compounds in excess of the specified limit for each of the following coating types:

(A) Adhesion promoters: 540 grams per liter (4.5 pounds per gallon);

(B) Automotive pretreatment coating: 660 grams per liter (5.5 pounds per gallon);

(C) Automotive primer: 250 grams per liter (2.1 pounds per gallon);

(D) Clear coating: 250 grams per liter (2.1 pounds per gallon);

(E) Color coating, including metallic/iridescent color coating: 420 grams per liter (3.5 pounds per gallon);

- (F) Multicolor coating: 680 grams per liter (5.7 pounds per gallon);
(G) Other automotive coating type: 250 grams per liter (2.1 pounds per gallon);
(H) Single-stage coating, including single-stage metallic/iridescent coating: 340 grams per liter (2.8 pounds per gallon);
(I) Temporary protective coating: 60 grams per liter (0.50 pounds per gallon);
(J) Truck bed liner coating: 200 grams per liter (1.7 pounds per gallon);
and
(K) Underbody coating: 430 grams per liter (3.6 pounds per gallon); and
(2) Cleaning solvent used shall not exceed a volatile organic compound content of 25 grams per liter (0.21 pounds per gallon) except for:
(A) Cleaning solvent used as a bug and tar remover; provided, that the volatile organic compound content of the cleaning solvent shall not exceed 350 grams per liter (2.9 pounds per gallon), and usage shall be limited as follows:
(i) No more than 20 gallons in any consecutive 12-month period for facilities and operations using 400 gallons or more of coating during the 12-month period ending at the end of the previous calendar month;
(ii) No more than 15 gallons in any consecutive 12-month period for facilities and operations using 150 gallons or more, but less than 400 gallons, of coating during the 12-month period ending at the end of the previous calendar month; or
(iii) No more than 10 gallons in any consecutive 12-month period for facilities and operations using less than 150 gallons of coating during the 12-month period ending at the end of the previous calendar month.
(B) Cleaning solvent used to clean plastic parts immediately before coating or for the removal of wax and grease; provided, that:
(i) Non-aerosol, hand-held spray bottles are used to apply the cleaning solvent;
(ii) The volatile organic compound content of the cleaning solvent shall not exceed 780 grams per liter (6.51 pounds per gallon); and
(iii) No more than 20 gallons of the cleaning solvent are used in any consecutive 12-month period in any one business location;
(C) Aerosol cleaning solvent; provided, that 160 ounces or less are used per day per business location; or
(D) Cleaning solvent with a volatile organic compound content no greater than 350 grams per liter (2.92 pounds per gallon), used at a volume equal to or less than 2.5% of the preceding calendar year's annual coating usage, up to a maximum of 15 gallons per calendar year.
(b) The limits in subsection (a)(1) of this section shall represent the weight of volatile organic compound per volume of coating, prepared to the manufacturer's recommended maximum volatile organic compound content, exclusive of water and non-volatile organic compound solvents.





PerStar M Street Partners, LLC originally filed the request as a Consent Calendar minor modification to Z.C. Order No. 07-21B; however, the Commission voted to set down the modification request for a public hearing. HHLP Georgetown II Associates, LLC, the successor owner of the Subject Property and “Applicant” in this case, provided its prehearing statement on August 11, 2016.

The Subject Property has a land area of approximately 15,588 square feet and is located at the northwest corner of 22nd and M Streets, N.W. Square 50 is bounded by N Street to the north, 22nd Street to the east, M Street to the south, and 23rd Street to the west.

Pursuant to Z.C. Order No. 07-21, dated May 12, 2008, the Zoning Commission approved a PUD for the Subject Property to be developed as a new hotel with a restaurant on the ground floor. Pursuant to Z.C. Order No. 07-21A, dated May 10, 2010, the Commission granted a two-year extension of the original PUD approval, and pursuant to Z.C. Order No. 07-21B, dated November 28, 2011, the Commission granted modifications to the approved PUD for a revised hotel design.

The Department of For-Hire Vehicles, formerly the District of Columbia Taxicab Commission (“Commission”),¹ pursuant to the authority set forth in Sections 8(c) (2), (3), (5), (7), (10), (12), (15), and (19), 14, and 20 of the District of Columbia Taxicab Commission Establishment Act of 1985 (“Establishment Act”), effective March 25, 1986 (D.C. Law 6-97; D.C. Official Code §§ 50-301.07(c)(2) (3), (5), (7), (10), (12), (15), and (19), 50-301.13, and 50-301.19 (2014 Repl. & 2015 Supp.)), and D.C. Official Code § 47-2829 (b), (d), (e), (e-1), and (i) (2015 Repl.)), hereby gives notice of its intent to adopt amendments to Chapter 10 (Public Vehicles for Hire) of Title 31 (Taxicabs and Public Vehicles For Hire) of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations (DCMR).

This final rulemaking amends Chapter 10, consistent with the Commission’s authority under the Establishment Act, to: (1) require that applicants for new DCTC operator’s licenses complete disability sensitivity training; and (2) allow the Office of Taxicabs to place certain conditions on owners who are issued new DCTC vehicle licenses, at such times when the Office of Taxicabs issues such licenses.

Proposed rulemaking was adopted by the Commission on December 9, 2015, and published in the *D.C. Register* on March 25, 2016 at 63 DCR 004467. The Commission received one comment, from a taxicab operators’ representative, during the comment period which expired on April 25, 2016. The commenter recommended creating an exemption from the Office’s authority to impose conditions on new DCTC vehicle licenses for applicants who had previously held such licenses. The Commission did not make any changes in response to this comment, as the Commission has adopted another proposed rulemaking to specifically address the concerns raised by the commenter (another pathway for new DCTC vehicle licenses for those who surrendered licenses as early as two years before or one year following the imposition of the “H tag moratorium”). Changes were made to correct typographical errors and grammar, and to clarify the Commission’s intent, and Subsection 1010.21 was renumbered to 1010.20 to ensure conformity with current rules. No substantial changes were made.

The Commission voted to adopt this rulemaking as final on May 11, 2016, and it will become effective upon publication in the *D.C. Register*.

Chapter 10, PUBLIC VEHICLES FOR HIRE, of Title 31 DCMR, TAXICABS AND PUBLIC VEHICLES FOR HIRE, is amended to read as follows:

Section 1004, INVESTIGATION AND EXAMINATION OF APPLICANTS, is amended as follows:

Subsection 1004.6 is amended to read as follows:

1004.6 Each applicant for a new DCTC operator’s license shall provide proof of completion of a disability sensitivity training course approved by the Office.

A new Subsection 1004.7 is added as follows:

1004.7 Following successful completion of the operator education course and passage of the written examination administered by the Office, an applicant shall have six (6) months from the date of notification to file an application for licensure.

Section 1010, ISSUANCE OF DCTC VEHICLE LICENSE, is amended as follows:

A new Subsection 1010.21 is added as follows:

1010.21 The Office may issue a new DCTC vehicle license to each applicant that meets the applicable requirements of this title and other applicable laws. In addition, each applicant may be required by the Office to:

- (a) Purchase or lease a vehicle that uses electric or other efficient means of propulsion, and/or is wheelchair accessible;
- (b) Provide service in underserved areas of the District, as identified by the Office; or
- (d) Meet other requirements to enhance safety and consumer protection, to improve customer service, or to achieve other lawful purposes within the jurisdiction of the Commission, as determined by the Office in an administrative issuance.

UNIVERSITY OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

NOTICE OF FINAL RULEMAKING

The Board of Trustees of the University of the District of Columbia, pursuant to the authority set forth under the District of Columbia Public Postsecondary Education Reorganization Act Amendments (“Act”), effective January 2, 1976 (D.C. Law 1-36; D.C. Official Code §§ 38-1202.01(a); 38-1202.06 (2012 Repl.)), hereby gives notice of an amendment to Chapter 6 (Campus Life) of Subtitle B (University of the District of Columbia) of Title 8 (Higher Education) of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations (DCMR).

The purpose of the rule is to comply with the requirements of the Drug-Free Schools and Communities Act Amendments of 1989. This policy expands the current University Alcohol Policy statement as it exists in the Student Code of Conduct.

The substance of the rules adopted herein was published in the *D.C. Register* on May 20, 2016 at 63 DCR 7756 for a period of public comment of not less than thirty (30) days, in accordance with D.C. Official Code § 2-505(a).

No public comment was received by the Board within the public comment period. The policy was adopted by the Board of Trustees on May 5, 2016 and will become effective upon publication of this notice in the *D.C. Register*.

Chapter 6, CAMPUS LIFE, of Title 8-B DCMR, UNIVERSITY OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, is amended as follows:

Section 616, ALCOHOL AND DRUG POLICY, Subtitle 616.11, is amended to read as follows:

616.11 The sale of alcoholic beverages on University property shall be strictly limited to approved locations with special permission from the Office of the President.

OFFICE OF THE CITY ADMINISTRATOR**NOTICE OF SECOND PROPOSED RULEMAKING**

The City Administrator, on behalf of the Mayor, pursuant to the authority under the second paragraph under the section titled “FOR METROPOLITAN POLICE” of An Act Making appropriations to provide for the expenses of the government of the District of Columbia for the fiscal year ending June thirtieth, nineteen hundred, and for other purposes, approved March 3, 1899 (30 Stat. 1057; D.C. Official Code § 5-129.02 (2012 Repl.)), and Mayor’s Order 2015-36, dated January 9, 2015, hereby gives notice of the intent to adopt amendments to Chapter 11 (Special Police) of Title 6 (Personnel), Subtitle A (Police Personnel), and Chapter 21 (Security Officers and Security Agencies) of Title 17 (Business, Occupations, and Professionals) of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations (DCMR), in not less than thirty (30) days from the publication of this notice in the *D.C. Register*.

This rulemaking modifies the eligibility and training requirements for commissioned special police officers and licensed security officers, and creates requirements for approved individuals to provide the training; a summary of the proposed rulemaking follows.

These amendments were published as a Notice of Proposed Rulemaking in the *D.C. Register* on July 1, 2016 at 63 DCR 9113. In response to public comments, the following changes have been made to the proposed rulemaking:

First, § 1100.7 has been amended to clarify the dates by which on-the-job, annual in-service, and firearms training must be started; clarify that the training may include higher standards than what is required in the regulations; and eliminate the requirement for special police officers to be trained in the record and arrest management system of the Metropolitan Police Department.

Second, § 1100 has been amended to clarify that approved special police officer and security officer instructors may hire certified trainers to provide instruction in cardiopulmonary resuscitation, automated external defibrillators, and first aid. It also makes clear that firearms training instructors must meet the requirements of Title 24 of the DCMR.

Third, § 1102 has been amended to allow security agencies that work with minors and vulnerable adult populations to apply higher standards when assessing criminal histories of agency employees.

Finally, minor grammatical edits were made throughout.

Summary of the Proposed Regulatory Action

This rulemaking ensures special police officers (SPOs) and security officers (SOs) meet increased eligibility requirements, including more comprehensive training, so as to be better qualified, trained, and responsive to community concerns. It also creates requirements for individuals seeking to provide the training, including professional experience and review of the curriculum.

Eligibility

The rulemaking strengthens applicant eligibility requirements so that a person convicted of misdemeanor sexual abuse is prohibited from applying to be a special police officer for ten (10) years and a security officer for two (2) years. This doubles the current length of time of ineligibility for SPOs and SOs, and is consistent with prohibitions for felonies. While those with prior convictions should not be automatically precluded from new career opportunities, this rulemaking seeks to lessen the risk of negative interactions between SPOs, SOs, and residents. Given the violation of trust between parties in sexual abuse cases and the trust expected of SPOs and SOs in the community, it is important that any applicant convicted of misdemeanor sexual abuse remains ineligible for an extended time before being put in a position of responsibility.

Training Requirements

The rulemaking increases training requirements for both incoming and current SPOs. By increasing pre-assignment training to at least eighty (80) hours, which is double the current requirement, SPOs will receive more comprehensive training and be better equipped to respond to potential emergency situations, while protecting the rights of individuals. The training will expand to include active shooter, emergency response, individuals in health or mental health crisis, de-escalation procedures, and biased-based policing. The use of force curriculum will specify the types of force to be addressed (*e.g.*, carotid neck restraint techniques, knees in back, and positional asphyxia).

Newly-assigned SPOs will be required to meet an increased standard of twenty-four (24) hours of on-the-job training within their first 80 hours with a special police officer who has at least one year experience. This will allow SPOs to be better equipped to conduct their job effectively. Additional in-service training from the current eight (8)-hour requirement to 24-hours annually will ensure SPOs are regularly informed and updated as to changes in laws and procedures.

The rulemaking requires at least forty (40) hours of firearms training and at least eight (8) hours of requalification training twice a year to ensure SPOs are meeting appropriate standards of responsible firearms use, storage, and maintenance. It also ensures SPOs are required to receive the same amount of annual firearms requalification as Metropolitan Police Department (MPD) officers.

To ensure these new standards are met, the rulemaking requires security agencies to pay for the costs of the training and maintain records of all training provided to their SPO and SO employees. This will allow all parties to be held accountable and to reduce the potential of employer liability concerns.

Under this rulemaking, there would be an additional sixty-four (64) hours of training added to the current SPO training requirements (seventy-two (72) hours of training for armed SPOs). The chart below provides a comparison of the current training requirements and the training requirements from this rulemaking.

Outside Employment

To increase accountability, the rulemaking clarifies that SPOs cannot work for more than one security agency at a time. An SPO must be accountable to a single security agency and its policies and practices; this ensures that both the public and MPD can readily identify the agency that is responsible for the actions of an SPO.

Uniforms

The rulemaking specifies that SPO uniforms be consistent in appearance among all SPOs. This will present a level of professionalism and accountability so as to not confuse the public.

Physical/Psychological Fitness

In 2006, the regulations for SOs were amended to specify standards for physical and psychological fitness for duty. This rulemaking adopts the same clear standards for SPOs so as to ensure they perform effectively in a demanding position.

Material Misstatements

The rulemaking clarifies that any false statement or omission in an application for SPO commission or SO license application is a material misstatement and grounds for MPD denying the application or revoking the SPO commission or SO license. This clarification is needed due to several cases where the Office of Administrative Hearings overturned a commission or license

denial or revocation by MPD and held that a person failing to disclose their arrest history in their commission or license application was not a material misstatement.

Approved Trainers

The rulemaking specifies that a qualified SPO instructor should have demonstrated relevant knowledge and experience. An instructor may meet that requirement as a resigned or retired full-duty status officer in good standing or having served as a special police officer for at least four (4) years. Alternatively, an instructor may have specific knowledge of the District demonstrated through two (2) years as in full-duty status resigned or retired or as a current member of the District of Columbia Bar. An instructor may hire a trainer who is certified by an outside authority to provide instruction in CPR, AED, or First Aid. Outside instructors for other courses may be approved on an individual basis as a part of the curriculum review process.

Pursuant to D.C. Official Code § 5-129.02(c), this rulemaking shall be submitted to the Council of the District of Columbia for a forty-five (45)-day period of review, excluding Saturdays, Sundays, legal holidays, and days of Council recess.

Chapter 11, SPECIAL POLICE, of Title 6-A DCMR, POLICE PERSONNEL, is amended as follows:

Section 1100, APPOINTMENT: GENERAL PROVISIONS, is amended as follows:

Subsection 1100.7 is amended to read as follows:

1100.7 No person shall be appointed as a special police officer under D.C. Official Code §§ 5-129.02 or 5-129.03 unless he or she meets the following requirements:

- (a) Have reached the age of twenty-one (21) years;
- (b) Be a citizen of the United States;
- (c) Be of good moral character;
- (d) Be approved for appointment by the Chief of Police; possess a high school diploma or a general equivalency diploma or one (1) year of experience as a special police officer in the District of Columbia; be able to read, write, and speak English; and be certified by a licensed physician as physically and psychologically fit to perform the duties of a special police officer in compliance with § 1111;
- (e) Shall not have been dishonorably discharged from the U.S. armed forces;
- (f) Satisfactorily complete the following pre-assignment training prescribed and approved by the Mayor, on-the-job training, and in-service training programs covering emerging issues or issues specific to the industry in which the licensee is providing security:

- (1) No later than May 31, 2018, pre-assignment training shall include at least thirty-two (32) hours of training on arrest powers, search and seizure laws, the District of Columbia Official Code, and the use of force, including carotid neck restraint techniques, knees in back, and positional asphyxia. Pre-assignment training shall include an additional forty-eight (48) hours of training generally relating to the special police officer's duties and specifically including:
 - (A) Terrorism awareness, including building evacuation, unattended packages, and unknown substances;
 - (B) Emergency procedures, including evacuation, cardio-pulmonary (CPR) and automated external defibrillator (AED) training, and a First Aid program;
 - (C) Cultural competency and individual rights, including the Human Rights Act of 1977, effective December 13, 1977 (D.C. Law 2-38; D.C. Official Code §§ 2-1401.01 *et seq.*), and the Bias-Related Crime Act 1989, effective May 8, 1990 (D.C. Law 8-121; D.C. Official Code §§ 22-3701 *et seq.*);
 - (D) Active shooter;
 - (E) Individuals in health and mental health crisis;
 - (F) De-escalation procedures;
 - (G) Biased-based policing; and
 - (H) Community policing, if there is the possibility of being assigned to a park, recreation center, residential building or community.
- (2) No later than July 1, 2017, a newly hired special police officer shall satisfactorily complete, within eighty (80) working hours following employment and before being assigned to a post by themselves, twenty-four (24) hours of on-the-job training with a special police officer who has at least one (1) year experience.
- (3) During the June 1, 2017 through May 31, 2018 licensing year, and for each subsequent licensing year that commences June 1 and ends May 31, a special police officer must satisfactorily complete twenty-four (24) hours in annual in-service training courses.
- (4) After completing at least forty (40) hours of initial firearms training, a special police officer shall satisfactorily complete, beginning June 1, 2017 through May 31, 2018 and each licensing

year thereafter, at least eight (8) hours of requalification training twice a year, representing sixteen (16) total hours.

- (5) Special police officers shall complete all additional initial and requalification training standards for other equipment, as applicable.
- (g) Nothing herein shall be construed to prohibit a security agency from voluntarily providing training programs and courses which exceed the minimum requirements of this chapter, or that reflect higher standards for security in a particular industry. Upon satisfactory completion of a required training course, a special police officer shall receive from his or her employer a signed certificate of completion, including the date completed and course title(s). A security agency must also maintain records of all training provided to its special police officer employees.

New Subsections 1100.8, 1100.9, and 1100.10 are added to read as follows:

1100.8 In order to provide the training required by § 1100.7, an instructor must obtain certification from the Department of Consumer and Regulatory Affairs.

1100.9 To be considered for approval as an instructor who can provide training pursuant to § 1100.7, a person shall:

- (a) Have reached the age of twenty-one (21) years;
- (b) Be a citizen of the United States;
- (c) Be of good moral character;
- (d) Possess a high school diploma or a general equivalency diploma and be able to read, write, and speak English;
- (e) Not have been dishonorably discharged from the U.S. Armed Forces;
- (f) Undergo a criminal background check pursuant to the standards and procedures set forth in § 1102.1;
- (g) Possess at least four (4) years of experience within the last seven (7) years in at least one of the following positions:
 - (1) Served in a full-duty status with a full-service police department in a municipality or state or served in a federal or military agency and have resigned or retired in good standing; or
 - (2) Served as a special police officer continuously employed by a Licensed security agency; and
- (h) Possess demonstrated knowledge of District laws pertaining to law enforcement through either:

- (1) At least twenty-four (24) months of service as a police officer or special police officer in the District of Columbia with the experience described in 6-A DCMR § 1100.9(g)(1) or (g)(2); or
- (2) As a current member of the District of Columbia Bar with at least three (3) years of significant experience in law enforcement or criminal justice.

1100.10 An approved instructor may hire a trainer with demonstrated expertise in a specific topic to provide instruction in:

- (a) Cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR), automated external defibrillator (AED), and First Aid pursuant to § 1100.7(f)(1)(B) if the trainer has satisfactorily demonstrated to the instructor that the trainer is certified by an outside authority, such as the Red Cross or the American Heart Association; and
- (b) Other courses as requested and submitted with the curriculum description, so long as at least seventy-five percent (75%) of required courses are taught by a District certified instructor.

1100.11 Notwithstanding § 1100.9, instructors providing firearms training shall meet the Firearms Training Instructor Certification requirements pursuant to § 2347 of Title 24 (Public Space and Safety) DCMR.

Section 1101, APPOINTMENTS, is amended as follows:

Subsection 1101.4 is amended to read as follows:

1101.4 The name of the agency shall be specified upon the face of the commission issued to those special police officers.

Subsection 1101.7 is amended to read as follows:

1101.7 The property which any special police officer shall be appointed to protect pursuant to § 1101.5 shall be located within the geographical limits of the District of Columbia.

Subsection 1101.14 is amended to read as follows:

1101.14 No special police officer may, at the same time, hold a special police officer commission under more than one (1) security agency located in the District of Columbia.

Section 1102, CRIMINAL HISTORY, is amended to read as follows:

1102.1 No person shall be commissioned or employed as a special police officer, nor shall an existing special police officer have a commission renewed, until the Mayor has conducted a criminal history check of the applicant through the record

systems of the Federal Bureau of Investigation and the Metropolitan Police Department.

- 1102.2 An applicant shall be ineligible to be commissioned as a special police officer if that applicant has ever been convicted of, pled guilty or *nolo contendere* to, or been given probation before judgment for any offense in any jurisdiction that would be a crime of violence, as defined in D.C. Official Code § 23-1331(4), if committed in the District of Columbia.
- 1102.3 If an applicant has ever been convicted of, pled guilty or *nolo contendere* to, or been given probation before judgment for any offense, other than a crime of violence, as defined in D.C. Official Code § 23-1331(4), in any jurisdiction that would be a felony if committed in the District of Columbia, the applicant shall be ineligible to be commissioned as a special police officer for ten (10) years following the applicant's release from incarceration and the conclusion of any court-ordered parole, probation, or supervision relating to that offense.
- 1102.4 If an applicant has ever been convicted of, pled guilty or *nolo contendere* to, or been given probation before judgment for any offense, other than a crime of violence, as defined in D.C. Official Code § 23-1331(4), or traffic offense, in any jurisdiction that would be a misdemeanor if committed in the District of Columbia, the applicant shall be ineligible to be commissioned as a special police officer for five (5) years following the applicant's release from incarceration and the conclusion of any court-ordered parole, probation, or supervision relating to that offense.
- 1102.5 If an applicant has ever been convicted of, pled guilty or *nolo contendere* to, or been given probation before judgment for any offense, in any jurisdiction that would be a misdemeanor sexual abuse if committed in the District of Columbia, the applicant shall be ineligible to be commissioned as a special police officer for ten (10) years following the applicant's release from incarceration and the conclusion of any court-ordered parole, probation, or supervision relating to that offense.
- 1102.6 In evaluating an application for a special police officer commission, the Mayor shall also consider:
- (a) An applicant's arrest history;
 - (b) An applicant's conviction history;
 - (c) Any court finding of an applicant's mental incompetence that has not been removed or expunged;
 - (d) An applicant's history of criminal traffic offenses;
 - (e) The bearing, if any, the criminal offense for which the person was previously convicted will have on his or her fitness or ability to perform one or more duties or responsibilities of a special police officer;

- (f) The time that has elapsed since the occurrence of the criminal offense or court finding of mental incompetence;
- (g) The age of the applicant at the time of the occurrence of the criminal offense or court finding of mental incompetence;
- (h) The frequency and seriousness of the criminal offense;
- (i) Any information produced by the applicant, or produced on his or her behalf, in regard to his or her rehabilitation and good conduct since the occurrence of the criminal offense or court finding of mental incompetence; and
- (j) Any material misstatement, including, but not limited to, a false statement or omission in the commission application. A commission shall be subject to denial, suspension, or revocation for any such material misstatement.

1102.7 If a special police officer is arrested, the special police officer shall report the arrest to the Mayor within two (2) business days. The commission of such special police officer shall be suspended immediately, and the security agency shall be notified of such suspension immediately, pending further disposition. If a special police officer fails to report an arrest as required, the special police officer's commission shall be summarily revoked.

1102.8 The Mayor shall conduct random criminal history checks of special police officers through the record systems of the Metropolitan Police Department. The commission of any special police officer whose record indicates an unreported arrest or conviction shall be summarily revoked, and the security agency shall be notified of such revocation immediately. The commission of any special police officer whose record indicates an outstanding warrant shall be suspended immediately, and the security agency shall be notified of such suspension immediately, pending further disposition.

1102.9 Notwithstanding any other law or regulation, the information obtained from criminal history checks conducted pursuant to this chapter and considered by the Mayor shall not be limited by the date of the offense nor shall the information obtained and considered be limited to arrests resulting in conviction.

1102.10 Nothing in this section shall be construed as prohibiting a security agency that provides security services and works closely with minors or vulnerable adult populations as defined in 6-B DCMR § 499 from making permanently ineligible any person seeking an SPO commission who has pled guilty or *nolo contendere*, or been given probation in their criminal history.

Subsection 1105.3 of Section 1105, APPLICATIONS, is amended to read as follows:

1105.3 Each application shall be accompanied by eighty-four dollars (\$84), which includes sixty-five dollars (\$65) for the application and nineteen dollars (\$19) for licensing. Additionally, an applicant must pay a thirty-five dollar (\$35) fee for

fingerprints. The eighty-four dollar (\$84) fee is refundable in the event of a final denial.

Section 1106, SECURITY AGENCY RESPONSIBILITIES, is amended as follows:

New Subsections 1106.9, 1106.10, 1106.11, and 1106.12 are added to read as follows:

- 1106.9 A special police officer shall not work, in his or her capacity as a special police officer, for more than one (1) security agency at any time located in the District of Columbia.
- 1106.10 In reviewing an employment application for a special police officer previously employed by another security agency and who received that other security agency's pre-assignment training, a security agency shall review and certify that the previously received pre-assignment training meets the requirements of § 1100.7(f).
- 1106.11 A security agency shall maintain records of all training certification documents.
- 1106.12 A security agency shall pay the costs of the pre-assignment training, on-the-job and in-service training, including any required firearms requalification training, required by § 1100.7(f).

Subsection 1109.1 of Section 1109, UNIFORMS, is amended to read as follows:

- 1109.1 Special police officers shall, while on duty, wear distinctive uniforms. Uniform waivers for armed special police officers are prohibited.

A new Section 1111, ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS – HEALTH, is added to read as follows:

- 1111.1 Each applicant for commission shall be required to submit a physician's certificate stating, to the best of the physician's knowledge after examining the applicant, the following:
- (a) The applicant is not presently addicted to drugs or alcohol;
 - (b) The applicant is not suffering from any debilitating mental defect or disorder; and
 - (c) The applicant is not suffering from serious heart disease, severe epilepsy, or other physical defect which might cause substantial loss of control in situations of severe stress.
- 1111.2 When testing for epilepsy or other physical defects which might involve substantial costs to determine, the doctor may rely upon the sworn statement of

the applicant, under oath. The doctor must give his or her affirmation to the same effect.

- 1111.3 In cases where commission is requested concurrent with or as a condition of employment with a security agency or an employer, the security agency or employer shall certify the health of the applicant.
- 1111.4 Each applicant shall be required to pass a drug screening administered by the security agency or employer upon initial application and upon application for commission renewal.
- 1111.5 Special police officers shall be subject to reasonable suspicion drug and alcohol testing by the security agency or employer. For the purposes of this subsection, the term “reasonable suspicion” means the officer is impaired while on duty.
- 1111.6 Security agencies or employers shall immediately notify the Mayor of any unexplained positive tests.
- 1111.7 The certification of a special police officer who fails a reasonable suspicion drug or alcohol test shall be summarily revoked. For the purposes of this section, the term “fails” means:
- (a) The officer’s blood contained more than .03%, by weight, of alcohol, or the officer’s urine contained more than .04%, by weight, of alcohol, or that at the time of the test more than .14 micrograms of alcohol were contained in one (1) milliliter of his or her breath, consisting of substantially alveolar air; or
 - (b) The drug test detected the presence of a controlled substance in the officer’s blood or urine.

Chapter 21, SECURITY OFFICERS AND SECURITY AGENCIES, of Title 17 DCMR, BUSINESS, OCCUPATIONS, AND PROFESSIONALS, is amended as follows:

Section 2101, DUTY OF SECURITY AGENCY OR EMPLOYER, is amended as follows:

New Subsections 2101.5 and 2101.6 are added to read as follows:

- 2101.5 A security agency shall use an instructor approved by the Department of Consumer and Regulatory Affairs to provide the training required by § 2108.4 and 6-A DCMR § 1100.7(f).
- 2101.6 A security agency shall pay the costs of the pre-assignment training, on-the-job and in-service training, including any required firearms requalification training, required by 6-A DCMR § 1100.7(f).

Subsection 2104.1 of Section 2104, ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS – CRIMINAL CONVICTIONS, is amended to read as follows:

2104.1

- (a) A person who is in any of the following categories shall not be eligible for certification as a security officer unless he or she meets the burden of proving to the Office of Administrative Hearings that he or she is not a significant safety risk to the community and meets all other requirements for certification:
 - (1) A person who has been released from incarceration for a felony conviction in any jurisdiction in the United States within two (2) years prior to the date of filing an application for certification; or
 - (2) A person who has been released from incarceration for a misdemeanor conviction in any jurisdiction in the United States involving larceny or involving the illegal use, carrying, or concealment of a dangerous weapon within one (1) year prior to the date of filing an application for certification.
 - (3) A person who has been released from incarceration for a misdemeanor conviction in any jurisdiction in the United States involving sexual abuse within two (2) years prior to the date of filing an application for certification.
- (b) The provisions of this section do not preclude a security company from imposing stricter standards or from requiring a longer period of ineligibility for a felony or misdemeanor.

Section 2108, EXAMINATION AND TRAINING, is amended as follows:

Subsection 2108.4 is amended to read as follows:

2108.4 To qualify for certification as a security officer, an individual shall meet the eligibility and training requirements established in this chapter and be an employee or an applicant for employment with a security firm.

Subsection 2108.7 is amended to read as follows:

2108.7 Security officers shall be required to satisfactorily complete pre-assignment, on-the-job, and in-service training programs that meet the requirements of this chapter.

Subsection 2108.8 is amended to read as follows:

- 2108.8 Pre-assignment training shall include at least twenty-four (24) hours of training generally relating to the security officer's duties and specifically including:
- (a) Terrorism awareness, including building evacuation, unattended packages, and unknown substances;
 - (b) Emergency procedures, including evacuation, cardio-pulmonary (CPR) and automated external defibrillator (AED) training, and a First Aid program;
 - (c) Cultural competency and individual rights, including the Human Rights Act of 1977, effective December 13, 1977 (D.C. Law 2-38; D.C. Official Code §§ 2-1401.01 *et seq.*), and the Bias-Related Crime Act 1989, effective May 8, 1990 (D.C. Law 8-121; D.C. Official Code §§ 22-3701 *et seq.*);
 - (d) Active shooter;
 - (e) Individuals in health and mental health crisis;
 - (f) De-escalation procedures;
 - (g) Biased-based policing; and
 - (h) Community policing, if there is the possibility of being assigned to a park, recreation center, residential building or community.

Subsection 2108.9 is amended to read as follows:

- 2108.9 Security officers shall satisfactorily complete a sixteen- (16-) hour, on-the-job training course within thirty (30) working days following employment, and an eight- (8-) hour annual in-service training course.

Subsection 2108.12 is amended to read as follows:

- 2108.12 The training requirements in § 2108.8 and § 2108.9 shall apply as of May 1, 2018.

A new Subsection 2108.13 is added to read as follows:

- 2108.13 A security agency shall maintain records of all training provided to its security officer employees.

A new Subsection 2108.14 is added to read as follows:

- 2108.14 To be considered for approval as an instructor to provide training pursuant to § 2108.4, a person shall:
- (a) Possess a valid security officer's license;

- (b) Possess a high school diploma or its equivalent;
- (c) Undergo a criminal background check pursuant to the procedures set forth in 6-A DCMR § 1102;
- (d) Possess at least thirty-six (36) months of experience, at least eighteen (18) of which is in the District of Columbia, as any combination of the following:
 - (1) A full-duty status with a full-service police department in a municipality or state or served in a federal or military agency and have resigned or retired in good standing;
 - (2) A security officer employed by a licensed security agency or a series of security agencies;
 - (3) A trainer employed by a licensed security agency or series of security agencies to train security officers; or
 - (4) The owner or manager of a security agency.

A new Subsection 2108.15 is added to read as follows:

- 2108.15 An approved instructor may hire a trainer to provide instruction in:
- (a) Cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR), automated external defibrillator (AED), and First Aid pursuant to § 2108.8(b) if the trainer has satisfactorily demonstrated to the instructor that the trainer is certified by an outside authority, such as the Red Cross or the American Heart Association; and
 - (b) Other courses as requested and submitted with the curriculum description, so long as at least seventy-five percent (75%) of required courses are taught by a District certified instructor with demonstrated expertise in a specific topic.

A new Subsection 2108.15 is added to read as follows:

- 2108.15 The Department of Consumer and Regulatory Affairs shall publish on its website a regularly updated list of the instructors approved under this section.

Section 2120, DENIAL, SUSPENSION, AND REVOCATION OF CERTIFICATION, is amended to read as follows:

- 2120.1 Certification of a security officer shall be subject to denial, suspension, or revocation for any of the following reasons:
- (a) Any material misstatement, including but not limited to a false statement or omission, in the license application;
 - (b) Violation of requirements pertaining to identifications cards, uniforms, badges, advertising, and displays as set forth in §§ 2110, 2111, 2112, and 2113;
 - (c) Failure or refusal to comply with any statute or regulation governing security officers, or the willful and fraudulent circumvention of any statute or regulation;
 - (d) Conviction of a felony while employed as a security officer; provided, that denial, suspension, or revocation for this reason shall not prevent a person from reapplying for certification;
 - (e) Conviction for a misdemeanor involving theft, fraudulent conduct, assault, or false arrest or imprisonment;
 - (f) Conviction of any offense arising out of or based on employment as a security officer which involved a breach of trust or an invasion of privacy; or
 - (g) Carrying a deadly weapon, handcuffs, or an aerosol chemical dispenser in the course of employment. This does not prohibit the carrying of a night stick constructed solely of wood.

The Director of the Department of Energy and Environment (DOEE or Department), in accordance with the authority set forth in the Department of Consumer and Regulatory Affairs Civil Infractions Act of 1985, effective October 5, 1985 (D.C. Law 6-42; D.C. Official Code § 2-1801.04 (2012 Repl.)); the District Department of the Environment Establishment Act of 2005, effective February 15, 2006 (D.C. Law 16-51; D.C. Official Code §§ 8-151.01 *et seq.* (2013 Repl.)); the Paint Stewardship Act of 2014, effective March 11, 2015 (D.C. Law 20-205; D.C. Official Code §§ 8-233.01 *et seq.* (2016 Supp.)); Mayor’s Order 2006-61, dated June 14, 2006; and Mayor’s Order 2015-229, dated October 7, 2015; hereby gives notice of the intent to amend Title 16 (Consumers, Commercial Practices, and Civil Infractions) of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations (DCMR) by adopting the following amendment to Chapter 40 (Department of Environment (DDOE) Infractions).

The proposed rulemaking establishes a schedule of civil infractions for violations of the District’s Paint Stewardship Program.

After careful consideration of comments, the proposed rules will be submitted to the Council of the District of Columbia for review and approval, in accordance with D.C. Official Code § 2-1801.04. The rules will become final upon Council approval, or thirty (30) days after submission, if the Council has not earlier disapproved the proposed rules, and following publication of the final rules in the *D.C. Register*.

Chapter 40, DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENT (DDOE) INFRACTIONS, of Title 16 DCMR, CONSUMERS, COMMERCIAL PRACTICES, AND CIVIL INFRACTIONS, is amended as follows:

A new Section 4012, PAINT STEWARDSHIP PROGRAM INFRACTIONS, is added to read as follows:

4012 PAINT STEWARDSHIP PROGRAM INFRACTIONS

4012.1 [RESERVED]

4012.2 [RESERVED]

4012.3 Violation of any of the following provisions shall be a Class 3 infraction:

- (a) D.C. Official Code § 8-233.02(c) (failure to implement an approved paint stewardship program plan);

- (b) D.C. Official Code § 8-233.03(b) (participating as a paint collection point not pursuant to an approved paint stewardship program);
- (c) 20 DCMR § 4003.1(a) (failure to operate a collection location pursuant to a contract with a producer or representative organization);
- (d) 20 DCMR § 4003.1(c) (collecting oil-based paint from an entity that is not a household or a conditionally exempt small quantity generator); or
- (e) 20 DCMR § 4003.1(d) (collecting oil-based paint that is not in liquid form and in its original packaging or in a closed container that is properly labeled).

4012.4 Violation of any of the following provisions shall be a Class 4 infraction:

- (a) D.C. Official Code § 8-233.02(b)(1) (failure to add the paint stewardship assessment to the purchase price of paint sold);
- (b) D.C. Official Code § 8-233.02(d) (selling or offering for sale paint not covered under a product stewardship plan);
- (c) D.C. Official Code § 8-233.02(f) or 20 DCMR § 4002.1 (failure to submit an annual paint stewardship program report with the required elements);
- (d) D.C. Official Code § 8-233.03(a) (selling or offering for sale unapproved paint not listed on DOEE's webpage);
- (e) D.C. Official Code § 8-233.04(c) (failure to comply with a modified plan);
or
- (f) 20 DCMR § 4001.2 (failure to submit a modified plan).

4012.5 Violation of the following provision shall be a Class 5 infraction:

- (a) D.C. Official Code § 8-233.02(e) (failure to provide consumers with the specified educational materials).

NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULEMAKING

The Director of the Department of Health, pursuant to the authority set forth in Section 2 of the Cottage Food Amendment Act of 2013, effective January 25, 2014 (D.C. Law 20-63; D.C. Official Code §§ 7-742.01 *et seq.* (2016 Supp.)) (Act); Sections 4902(a) and (b) of the Department of Health Functions Clarification Act of 2001, effective October 3, 2001 (D.C. Law 14-28; D.C. Official Code §§ 7-731 *et seq.* (2012 Repl. & 2016 Supp.)); and Mayor’s Order 2007-63, dated March 8, 2007; hereby gives notice of the intent to adopt new cottage food regulations in a new Subtitle K (Cottage Food Regulations) of Title 25 (Food Operations and Community Hygiene Facilities) of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations (DCMR).

The purpose of this proposed rulemaking is to provide regulatory oversight of cottage food businesses, determine which non-potentially hazardous foods are safe to produce, package, or sell as a cottage food product, and protect public health and safety by conducting pre-operational and complaint-based inspections.

The Director also gives notice of her intent to take final rulemaking action to adopt the proposed rules in not less than thirty (30) days from the date of publication of this notice in the *D.C. Register*. Further, pursuant to Section 2(e) of the Act, the proposed rulemaking shall be submitted to the Council for a sixty (60) day period of review, excluding Saturdays, Sundays, legal holidays, and days of Council recess. If the Council does not approve or disapprove the proposed rulemaking, in whole or in part, by resolution within this sixty (60) day review period, the proposed rules shall be deemed approved. The proposed rules shall not become effective until a Notice of Final Rulemaking is published in the *D.C. Register*.

**CHAPTER 1 REGISTRATION PROCEDURES, MENU,
AND REQUIREMENTS**

100 TITLE

100.1 These provisions shall be known as the Cottage Food Regulations, hereinafter referred to as “these Regulations”.

101 INTENT AND SCOPE

101.1 The purpose of these regulations is to: (1) regulate cottage food businesses operating in the District of Columbia; (2) identify food items that are approved for sale in cottage food businesses; (3) identify food items and specialized food processes that are prohibited in cottage food businesses; (4) ensure cottage food businesses comply with storage and labeling requirements; and (5) authorize the Department to conduct initial inspections of cottage food businesses before selling any food items, as well as complaint inspections.

101.2 Cottage food products shall only be sold at farmer’s markets and public events in accordance with Section 4931(3) of Section 2 of the Cottage Food Amendment Act of 2013, effective January 25, 2014 (D.C. Law 20-63; D.C. Official Code § 7-742.01(3) (2016 Supp.)).

101.3 Pursuant to Section 4932(a) of Section 2 of the Cottage Food Amendment Act of 2013 (D.C. Official Code § 7-742.02(a) (2016 Supp.)), these regulations do not:

- (a) Apply to a food establishment that is required to have a food establishment license under Department regulations; or
- (b) Exempt a cottage food business from any applicable District or federal tax laws.

102 APPLICATION PROCEDURES AND REQUIREMENTS

102.1 No one shall operate as a cottage food business or produce, package, store, or sell cottage food products without first obtaining a Cottage Food Business Registry Identification Number and Certificate issued by the Department.

102.2 To qualify as cottage food business, an applicant for a cottage food business shall complete a registry application on a form provided by the Department and submit the following documentation together to the Department for review and approval:

- (a) A Home Occupancy Permit issued by the Department of Consumer and Regulatory Affairs (DCRA) (original only);

- (b) For food sold by weight, proof of calibrated scales that comply with DCRA regulations;
- (c) Proof of successfully passing a nationally accredited Certified Food Protection Manager Course approved by the Department;
- (d) A District-issued Certified Food Protection Manager Certificate, obtained by the owner(s) of the cottage food business, which shall be valid for three (3) years from the date of exam;
- (e) A list of food products the cottage food business intends to produce, package, and sell, as specified in Subsection 103.5 of this chapter. The Department may request a copy of recipes if deemed necessary;
- (f) Packaging labels with the information specified in Section 104 of this chapter for each food product; and
- (g) A registration fee in the amount of fifty dollars (\$50) for one (1) Cottage Food Business Registration Certificate that is valid for a two (2) year period.

102.3 Additional Cottage Food Business Registration Certificates are available at a cost of five dollars (\$5.00) each.

102.4 In addition to Subsection 102.2, an applicant for a cottage food business attests that, by completing the registry application, he or she:

- (a) Understands that only the cottage food products listed on their registry application are authorized by the Department to be produced, packaged, stored, or sold by the cottage food business;
- (b) Expressly grants the Department of Health right of entry to the premises of the cottage food business during normal business hours or at other reasonable times, to determine compliance with these regulations or Department Directives, and to investigate consumer complaints alleging violations of these regulations, foodborne outbreaks, or other public health emergencies, including but not limited to operating in an unsanitary manner; and;
- (c) Understands that refusing to allow the Department of Health entry during normal business hours or at other reasonable times, or failing to comply with Orders to Cease and Desist or any Department Directive, shall result in immediate suspension or removal of the cottage food business from the Department's Cottage Food Business Registry Identification Number.

- 102.5 The Department shall approve or deny a Cottage Food Registry Application within thirty (30) business days of receiving a properly completed application, as specified in Subsections 102.2 and 102.4.
- 102.6 If a registry application is approved, the Department shall conduct a preoperational inspection of the applicant's premises within fourteen (14) business days of application approval.
- 102.7 If the applicant for the cottage food business passes the preoperational inspection, the Department shall:
- (a) Assign the cottage food business an identification number which shall be valid for two (2) years from the passing date of the food safety inspection;
 - (b) Add the cottage food business to the Department's Cottage Food Business Registry; and
 - (c) Issue a Cottage Food Business Registration Certificate to the Owner with the following information:
 - (1) Registry Identification Number;
 - (2) The cottage food products submitted by the applicant and approved by the Department; and
 - (3) An expiration date.
- 102.8 Each cottage food business shall have an original Cottage Food Business Registration Certificate in a conspicuous location at each event.
- 102.9 If a registration application is denied, the Department shall provide the applicant in writing of the following:
- (a) The reason(s) for the denial; and
 - (b) Actions, if any, the applicant can take to qualify for a registration.

103 APPROVED FOOD PRODUCT LIST

- 103.1 A cottage food business is authorized to produce, package, and sell certain non-potentially hazardous food products identified in Subsection 103.5 that do not support the rapid growth of bacteria that could lead to a foodborne illness when held outside of refrigerated temperatures.
- 103.2 The list identified in Subsection 103.5 will be maintained and updated by the Department each quarter, if necessary, through the rulemaking process. When the

Department adds or deletes food products from the approved list in Subsection 103.5, the Department shall state the:

- (a) Reason for the change;
- (b) Authority for the change; and
- (c) Nature of the change to the approved food products list in Subsection 103.5.

103.3 If an owner of a cottage food business requests to produce, package, or sell a recipe or food product that is not on the approved list of foods in Subsection 103.5, the owner of a cottage food business shall submit confirmation of the food product's pH value and water activity from any state accredited laboratory to the Department for review.

103.4 The Department will determine if the recipe or food product is safe to produce, package, or sell as a cottage food product based on the laboratory analyses required in Subsection 103.3.

103.5 The Department approves the sale of the following non-potentially hazardous products by cottage food businesses at farmers' markets or public events within the District of Columbia:

- (a) Baked goods, without cream, custard, cheese, or meat fillings, such as breads, biscuits, churros, muffins, rolls, scones, and sweet breads;
- (b) Unfilled, baked donuts;
- (c) Waffle cones;
- (d) Pizzelles;
- (e) Roasted coffee, whole beans or ground;
- (f) Cakes, including celebration cakes (birthday, anniversary, and wedding);
- (g) Cereals, trail mixes, and granola;
- (h) Candies, such as brittles, toffee, chocolates, cotton candy, fudge, truffles, and confections;
- (i) Pastries, pies, brownies, cookies, and tortillas;
- (j) Snacks such as caramel corn, chocolate-covered nonperishable foods, nuts and dried fruits, crackers, pretzels, seeds, popcorn, or popcorn balls;

- (k) Fruit pies, fruit empanadas, and fruit tamales;
- (l) Dried pasta;
- (m) Dry herbs, herb blends, and seasonings blends;
- (n) Dry tea blends;
- (o) Dry baking mixes; and
- (p) Vinegar and flavored vinegars.

104 COTTAGE FOOD PRODUCT LABELING REQUIREMENTS

104.1 A cottage food business shall label each food product in accordance with Section 4932(c)(2) of Section 2 of the Cottage Food Amendment Act of 2013 (D.C. Official Code § 7-742.02(c)(2) (2016 Supp.)), and in accordance with 21 C.F.R. Part 101 (2016), Food Labeling.

104.2 A cottage food business shall sell only approved cottage food products that are:

- (a) Stored on the premises of the cottage food business; and
- (b) Prepackaged with a label that contains the following information:
 - (1) The cottage food business identification number;
 - (2) The name of the cottage food product;
 - (3) The ingredients of the cottage food product in descending order of the amount of each ingredient by weight;
 - (4) The net weight or net volume of the cottage food product;
 - (5) Allergen information as specified by federal labeling requirements in 21 C.F.R. Part 101, Food Labeling;
 - (6) If any nutritional claim is made, nutritional information as specified by federal labeling requirements in 21 C.F.R. Part 101, Food Labeling and 9 C.F.R. Part 317, subpart B, Nutrition Labeling; and
 - (7) A statement printed in ten (10)-point or larger type letters in a color that provides a clear contrast to the background of the label that reads:

**Made by a cottage food business that is not subject
to the District of Columbia's food safety regulations**

104.3 A label sample is shown below.

105 PROCESSES AND ACTIVITIES THAT ARE NOT ALLOWED

105.1 A cottage food business shall not produce, package, or sell food products which require temperature control for safety. A cottage food business shall not:

- (a) Process potentially hazardous foods;
- (b) Process acidified and low acid canned food;
- (c) Process food using reduced oxygen packaging;
- (d) Smoke or cure food;
- (e) Press juices or vegetables;
- (f) Pasteurize;
- (g) Can any food products, including but not limited to fruits, vegetables, vegetable butters, salsas, and similar foods;
- (h) Hermetically seal food in jars;
- (i) Offer for sale adulterated or misbranded food;

- (j) Produce food products not expressly listed in Subsection 103.5 of these regulations; or
- (k) Sell the cottage food products specified in Subsection 103.5 outside of the District of Columbia.

106 FOODS THAT ARE NOT ALLOWED

106.1 A cottage food business shall not sell potentially hazardous foods as defined in Section 991 below and by the District Food Code Regulations (Title 25-A of the DCMR) including but not limited to the following food:

- (a) Fish or shellfish products;
- (b) Fresh, dried, or dehydrated meat or meat products, including jerkies;
- (c) Fresh, dried, or dehydrated poultry or poultry products;
- (d) Baked goods that require any type of refrigeration such as cream, custard, or meringue pies and cakes or pastries with cream cheese icings or fillings;
- (e) Cheese made with unpasteurized milk;
- (f) Focaccia-style breads with vegetables and/or cheeses;
- (g) Raw-seed sprouts, including but not limited to alfalfa sprouts or bean sprouts;
- (h) Raw cookie dough;
- (i) Canned pickled products such as corn relish, pickles, or sauerkraut;
- (j) Milk and dairy products including hard, soft and cottage cheeses, and yogurt;
- (k) Mushrooms;
- (l) Cut fresh fruits and/or vegetables;
- (m) Food products made from cut fresh fruits or vegetables;
- (n) Food products made with cooked vegetable products;
- (o) Garlic and/or vegetable in oil mixtures;
- (p) Sugar-free jams, jellies, syrups, marmalades and other preserves;

- (q) Pumpkin or fruit butters;
- (r) Ice or ice products;
- (s) Barbeque sauces, ketchups and/or mustards; or
- (t) Foods not intended for human consumption such as pet foods and/or treats.

107 COTTAGE FOOD SAMPLING REQUIREMENT

- 107.1 All food products, including those produced and packaged by a cottage food business, are subject to collection, examination and sampling/testing of food by the Department or an authorized representative, to determine if a food product is misbranded or adulterated. The Department shall collect cottage food products without cost. A component of the food sampling conducted pursuant to this section may include the performance of sample analyses in accordance with Section 4932(d)(4) of Section 2 of the Cottage Food Amendment Act of 2013 (D.C. Official Code § 7-742.02(d)(4) (2016 Supp.)).

108 REQUIRED INSPECTIONS AND ADMINISTRATIVE REMEDIES

- 108.1 When conducting preoperational inspections, the Department shall enter the premises of an applicant requesting a cottage food business on an agreed upon scheduled date and time during normal business hours from Monday through Friday.
- 108.2 The Department shall also inspect the premises of a registered cottage food business in response to a foodborne illness outbreak, consumer complaint, or other public health emergency.
- 108.3 The Department shall inspect during normal business hours, or at other reasonable times, whenever the Department has reason to believe the cottage food business is operating in violation of these regulations or is operating in an unsanitary manner.
- 108.4 A Department representative shall present official credentials and request to enter a cottage food business upon the Department's receipt of a complaint to investigate the cottage food business' compliance with these regulations, in accordance with Sections 4932(d)(1) and (2) of Section 2 of the Cottage Food Amendment Act of 2013 (D.C. Official Code § 7-742.02(d)(1) and (2) (2016 Supp.)) and Subsection 108.3 of these regulations.
- 108.5 The owner of a cottage food business shall grant a Department representative who requests entry access to inspect the premises to determine the cottage food business' compliance with these regulations, in accordance with Section

4932(d)(3)(A) of Section 2 of the Cottage Food Amendment Act of 2013 (D.C. Official Code § 7-742.02(d)(3)(A) (2016 Supp.)) and Subsection 108.3 of these regulations.

- 108.6 If the Department representative is unable to gain access to conduct an inspection, the Department shall leave a Notice of Attempt to Conduct an Inspection. The owner of the cottage food business shall be required to contact the Department within seventy-two (72) hours of posting of the Notice of Attempt to Conduct an Inspection.
- 108.7 Failure to contact the Department within the required seventy-two (72) hour period may result in the summary suspension of the Cottage Food Business Registry Identification Number.
- 108.8 The Department shall inspect a cottage food business operation's to ensure that:
- (a) The production, packaging, storage, or sale of cottage food products listed on the cottage food business registry application and approved by the Department are the only food products being produced, packaged, stored, or sold by the cottage food business;
 - (b) Authorized persons other than the owner of the cottage food business, or persons under the direct supervision of the owner, are the only individuals engaged in the processing, preparing, packaging, or handling of any cottage food products, or are the only individuals in the home kitchen during the preparation, packaging, or handling of any cottage food products;
 - (c) Authorized persons involved in the preparation, packaging, or handling of cottage food products:
 - (1) Are not working in the home kitchen when ill;
 - (2) Wash their hands thoroughly before any food preparation and food packaging activities; and
 - (3) Use single-service gloves, bakery papers, tongs, or other utensils to avoid bare hand contact with ready-to-eat foods.
 - (d) The preparation, packaging, or handling of cottage food products is not taking place in the home kitchen at the same time as any domestic activities such as family meal preparation, dishwashing, clothes washing or ironing, kitchen cleaning, or guest entertainment;
 - (e) Infants or small children are not in the home kitchen during the preparation, packaging, or handling of any cottage food products;

- (f) Pets are excluded from the kitchen during the preparation, packaging or handling of cottage food products;
- (g) Only standard, residential (non-commercial) kitchen equipment and utensils are used to produce the cottage food products;
- (h) All food contact surfaces, equipment, and utensils used for the preparation, packaging, or handling of any cottage food products are smooth and easily cleanable, and are washed, rinsed, and sanitized before each use;
- (i) The home kitchen is free from the presence of insects, rodents and other pests, and there are no entry points for insects, rodents and other pests in the home kitchen; and
- (j) All cottage food products and equipment are properly stored.

108.9 The owner of a cottage food business shall not interfere with any inspection by a Department representative of the business, in accordance with Section 4932(d)(3)(B) of Section 2 of the Cottage Food Amendment Act of 2013 (D.C. Official Code § 7-742.02(d)(3)(B) (2016 Supp.)).

108.10 The Department may summarily suspend a Cottage Food Business Registry Identification Number by issuing a Summary Suspension Order if it determines following an inspection that there is a suspected foodborne outbreak or other public health emergency, including but not limited to operating in an unsanitary manner, non-compliance with an Order to Cease and Desist or a Department Directive, or non-compliance with these regulations.

108.11 A summary suspension shall remain in effect until the conditions cited in the Summary Suspension Order no longer exist and abatement of the cited conditions has been confirmed by the Department through re-inspection or other means, as appropriate.

108.12 A Cottage Food Business Registry Identification Number that has been summarily suspended shall be reinstated when the Department determines that the public health hazard cited in the Summary Suspension Order no longer exists. The Department shall provide the owner of the cottage food business with a notice of reinstatement.

108.13 If the owner of a cottage food business does not comply with any provision of these regulations or refuses to comply with an Order to Cease and Desist, Summary Suspension Order, or any Department Directive, the cottage food business shall be removed from the Cottage Food Business Registry and the owner shall be required to file a new application to the Registry.

109 SAFE FOOD PRACTICES

109.1 The owner of a cottage food business should apply, at a minimum, the following safe food practices, which help to limit the potential for foodborne illnesses:

(a) Proper Handwashing

- (1) Authorized persons involved with the preparation, packaging or handling of cottage food products should clean their hands and exposed portions of their arms before starting food processing, and after any activity that might contaminate their hands; and
- (2) Liquid soap, paper towels, and water warm to the touch should be used for handwashing, and should be available at the handwashing sink at all times.

(b) Bare-Hand Contact with Ready-to-Eat Foods

Bare-hand contact with ready-to-eat foods shall be avoided. Single-service gloves, bakery paper, tongs, or other utensils should be used when handling ready-to-eat foods.

(c) Hair Restraint and Clean Outer Garments

Hair restraints and clean outer garments must be worn by all persons in the home kitchen during processing, preparation, packaging, or handling of cottage food products.

(d) Eating, Drinking, or Smoking

Owners of a cottage food business or persons under the owner's direct supervision should not eat, drink, or smoke or engage in any smoking activity (including but not limited to any form of tobacco, any form of hookah, any form of marijuana, or use of any e-cigarette) in the home kitchen during processing, preparation, packaging, or handling of cottage food products.

(e) Preventing Contamination When Tasting

Owners of a cottage food business or persons under the owner's direct supervision should not use a utensil more than once to taste any cottage food product.

(f) Personal Health;

Owners of a cottage food business or persons under the owner's direct supervision should not process, prepare, package or handle cottage food products if they have any of the following symptoms:

- (1) Diarrhea;
- (2) Vomiting;
- (3) Jaundice;
- (4) Sore throat with fever; or
- (5) Lesion containing pus, unless protected by an impermeable cover.

(g) Unauthorized Persons

Owners of a cottage food business or persons under the owner's direct supervision are the only persons authorized to be in the kitchen while producing, packaging or handling cottage food products.

(h) Food Contact Surfaces

The food-contact surfaces of all utensils and equipment should be clean to the sight and touch before beginning processing cottage food products, and cleaned often while in use to limit the potential for contamination of the food or the ingredients.

(i) Proper Storage of Ingredients and Finished Products

Ingredients for cottage food products and the finished food products should be stored separately from all residential foods and food supplies, and in a manner that will prevent contamination from the premises and non-authorized persons.

(j) Proper Use and Storage of Chemicals

- (1) Personal care items, as defined in Section 991, should not be stored or allowed in the home kitchen unless stored in such a manner that does not allow contamination of food products or food-contact surfaces;
- (2) Spray bottles containing cleaning solutions should be labeled with the name of the solution;

(3) Pest control chemicals should not be used or stored in the home kitchen, in order to prevent contamination of food products and food-contact surfaces.

(k) Pests

Pests should not be present in the home kitchen. This area should be kept clean to prevent harborage of pests, and the premises should allow for easy visual inspection of pest activity.

(l) Pets

Pets are not allowed in the home kitchen at any time during the preparation, packaging or handling of cottage food products.

CHAPTER 99 DEFINITIONS

9900 GENERAL PROVISIONS

9900.1 The terms and phrases used in this title shall have the meanings set forth in this chapter, unless the text or context of the particular chapter, section, subsection, or paragraph provide otherwise.

9901 DEFINITIONS

9901.1 As used in this chapter, the following terms and phrases shall have the meanings ascribed:

Authorized premises of cottage food business – the portion of a domestic residence housing the home kitchen where the preparation, packaging, storage, or handling of cottage food production occurs, and that has been inspected and approved by the Department to operate as a cottage food business in compliance with these regulations.

CFBR – the Cottage Food Business Registry within the Department of Health.

Consumer – a person who is a member of the public, takes possession of food, is not functioning in the capacity of an operator of a food sales establishment or food processing plant, and does not offer the food for resale.

Cottage food business – a business that:

(a) Produces or packages cottage food products in a residential kitchen;

- (b) Sells the cottage food products in accordance with Section 4932 of Section 2 of the Cottage Food Amendment Act of 2013, effective January 25, 2014 (D.C. Law 20-63; D.C. Official Code §§ 7-742.01 *et seq.* (2016 Supp.)), and Subsection 103.5 of these regulations;
- (c) Has annual revenues from the sale of cottage food products in an amount not exceeding twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000); and
- (d) Has obtained a home occupancy permit from the Department of Consumer and Regulatory Affairs pursuant to Section 251 of Title 11 (Zoning Regulations of 2016), Subtitle U (Use Permissions), of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations (11-U DCMR § 251).

Cottage food product – a non-potentially hazardous food, as specified in regulations adopted by the Department of Health, that is sold at a farmer’s market or public event in accordance with Section 4932 of Section 2 of the Cottage Food Amendment Act of 2013 (D.C. Official Code § 7-742.02 (2016 Supp.)) and Subsection 103.5 of these regulations.

Department – Department of Health.

Domestic residence – a single-family dwelling or an area within a rental unit where a single person or family actually resides. This term does not include any group or communal residential setting within any type of structure, or any outbuilding, shed, barn, or other similar structure.

Easily cleanable – a characteristic of a surface that:

- (a) Allows effective removal of soil by normal cleaning methods;
- (b) Depends upon the material, design, construction, and installation of the surface; and
- (c) Varies with the likelihood of the surface’s role in introducing pathogenic or toxigenic agents or other contaminants into food based on the surface’s approved placement, purpose, and use.

Equipment – a normal household article that is used in the manufacture of cottage food products such as a freezer, grinder, hood, ice maker, mixer, oven, reach-in refrigerator, scale, sink, slicer, stove, table, temperature measuring device, or warewashing machine. This term does not include industrial or commercial grade equipment that, due to their size, cannot be effectively cleaned in residential sinks or dishwashers.

Food – a raw, cooked, or processed edible substance, ice, beverage, or ingredient used or intended for use or for sale in whole or in part for human consumption, or chewing gum.

Foodborne disease outbreak – the occurrence of two or more cases of a similar illness resulting from the ingestion of a common food.

Hermetically sealed container – a container that is designed and intended to be secure against the entry of microorganisms or, in the case of low acid canned foods, designed and intended to maintain the commercial sterility of its contents after processing.

Home kitchen – a kitchen in a cottage food business owner’s primary domestic residence, with a home occupancy permit from the Department of Consumer and Regulatory Affairs, which contains one or more stoves or ovens designed for residential use only (such as a double oven) and does not include any type of commercial equipment.

Non-potentially hazardous foods – foods that do not require temperature control because they are incapable of supporting the rapid and progressive growth of infectious or toxigenic microorganisms.

Owner of a cottage food business – a person who produces cottage food products only in the home kitchen of that person’s primary domestic residence and only for sale directly to the consumer.

Packaged – food contained in a carton, bottled, canned, securely bagged, or securely wrapped, in a cottage food operation. This term does not include a wrapper, carry-out box, or other nondurable container used to containerize food for the purpose of food protection during service or receipt of the food by the consumer.

Personal Care Items – items or substances that may be poisonous, toxic, or a substance of contamination and are used to maintain or enhance a person’s health, hygiene, or appearance; which may include items such as medicines, first aid supplies, cosmetics, and toiletries such as toothpaste and mouthwash.

Potentially hazardous foods – foods requiring temperature control for safety because they are capable of supporting the rapid growth of pathogenic or toxigenic microorganisms, or the growth and toxin production of *Clostridium botulinum*.

Public event – any event open to the general public, including but not limited to farmers markets, exhibitions, fairs, festivals, entertainment, or fundraising activities.

Public market and private market – as regulated by the Department of Consumer and Regulatory Affairs (DCRA) Vending Regulations as codified at Title 24 (Public Space and Safety), Chapter 5 (Vendors) of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations (24 DCMR §§ 500 – 599).

Ready-to-eat food – food that is edible and does not require additional preparation to achieve food safety.

Reduced oxygen packaging – packaging of food using the reduction of the amount of oxygen in a package by mechanically evacuating the oxygen, displacing the oxygen with another gas or combination of gases, or otherwise controlling the oxygen content in a package to a level below that normally found in the surrounding atmosphere (twenty-one percent (21%) oxygen), or a process as specified in this definition that involves a food for which *Clostridium botulinum* or *Listeria monocytogenes* require control in the final packaged form. This term includes any of the following:

- (a) Vacuum packaging, in which air is removed from a package of food and the package is hermetically sealed so that a vacuum remains inside the package, such as *sous vide*;
- (b) Modified atmosphere packaging, in which the atmosphere of a package of food is modified so that its composition is different from air but the atmosphere may change over time due to the permeability of the packaging material or the respiration of the food. Modified atmosphere packaging includes reduction in the proportion of oxygen, total replacement of oxygen, and an increase in the proportion of other gases such as carbon dioxide or nitrogen;
- (c) Controlled atmosphere packaging, in which the atmosphere of a packaged food is modified so that until the package is opened, its composition is different from air, and continuous control of that atmosphere is maintained, such as by using oxygen scavengers or a combination of total replacement of oxygen, non-respiring food, and impermeable packaging material;
- (d) Cook chill packaging, in which cooked food is hot-filled into impermeable bags which have the air expelled and are then sealed or crimped closed. The bagged food is rapidly chilled and refrigerated at temperatures that inhibit the growth of psychotropic pathogens; or
- (e) *Sous vide* packaging, in which raw or partially cooked food is placed in a hermetically sealed, impermeable bag, cooked in the

bag, rapidly chilled, and refrigerated at temperatures that inhibit the growth of psychotropic pathogens.

Smoking or to smoke – pursuant to the Smoking Restriction Amendment Act of 2013, effective December 13, 2013 (D.C. Law 20-48; D.C. Official Code § 7-1702(7)) (2016 Supp.):

- (a) The act of puffing, having in one's possession, holding, or carrying a lighted or smoldering tobacco product, including through the use of smoking equipment of any kind including a pipe, or cigarette papers or tubes; or
- (b) The lighting of a tobacco product, including through the use of smoking equipment of any kind including a pipe, or cigarette papers or tubes.

Special Event – as regulated by the Department of Consumer and Regulatory Affairs (DCRA) Vending Regulations as codified at Title 24 (Public Space and Safety), Chapter 5 (Vendors) of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations (24 DCMR §§ 500 – 599).

Specialized food processes – including but are not limited to:

- (a) Smoking food as a method of food preservation rather than as a method of enhancing flavor;
- (b) Curing food;
- (c) Using food additives or adding components such as vinegar as a method of food preservation rather than as a method of flavor enhancement, or otherwise rendering food so that is not potentially hazardous (time/temperature control for food safety);
- (d) Packaging food using a reduced oxygen method, except where the growth of and toxin formation by *Clostridium botulinum* and the growth of *Listeria monocytogenes* are controlled;
- (e) Operating a molluscan shellfish life-support system display tank used to store or display shellfish that are offered for human consumption;
- (f) Custom processing animals that are for personal use as food and not for sale or service;
- (g) Preparing food by methods not approved by the Department; and

- (h) Sprouting seeds or beans.

The Secretary of the District of Columbia (Secretary), pursuant to the authority set forth in Section 558 of An Act to establish a code of law for the District of Columbia, approved March 3, 1901 (31 Stat. 1189, ch. 854, § 558; D.C. Law 18-223; 57 DCR 6242 (July 23, 2010)); the Notary Public Fee Enhancement Amendment Act of 2016, effective July 1, 2016 (D.C. Law 21-037; 63 DCR 7148 (May 13, 2016)); Section 3(k) of Mayor's Order 97-177, dated October 9, 1997; and Mayor's Order 2016-031, dated March 1, 2016; hereby gives notice of the intent to adopt the following amendments to Chapter 24 (Notaries Public) of Title 17 (Business, Occupations, and Professionals) of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations (DCMR).

The purpose of the rulemaking is to adjust the fees for notarial acts from \$2.00 to \$5.00, to conform with the Notary Public Fee Enhancement Amendment Act of 2016.

Chapter 24, NOTARIES PUBLIC, of Title 17 DCMR, BUSINESS, OCCUPATIONS, AND PROFESSIONALS, is amended as follows:

Subsection 2406.2 of Section 2406, NOTARY PUBLIC PROCEDURES AND FEES, is amended to read as follows:

2406.2 Fees. Notary publics may not charge more than \$5.00 per notarial act.

NOTICE OF PROPOSED RULEMAKING

The Board of Trustees of the University of the District of Columbia, pursuant to the authority set forth under the District of Columbia Public Postsecondary Education Reorganization Act Amendments (Act), effective January 2, 1976 (D.C. Law 1-36; D.C. Official Code §§ 38-1202.01(a); 38-1202.06)(3),(13) (2012 Repl.)), hereby gives notice of its intent to amend Chapter 2 (Administration and Management) of Subtitle B (University of the District of Columbia) of Title 8 (Higher Education) of the District of Columbia Municipal Regulations (DCMR), in not less than thirty (30) days from the date of publication of this notice in the *D.C. Register*.

The purpose of the proposed rule is to change the title of the Provost of the Community College to the Chief Community College Officer.

The Board of Trustees will take final action to adopt these amendments to the University Rules in not less than thirty (30) days from the date of publication of this notice in the *D.C. Register*.

Chapter 2, ADMINISTRATION AND MANAGEMENT, of Title 8-B DCMR, UNIVERSITY OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, is amended as follows:

Section 211, EXECUTIVE APPOINTMENTS: NON-ACADEMIC ADMINISTRATORS, is amended as follows:

211 EXECUTIVE APPOINTMENTS: NON-ACADEMIC ADMINISTRATORS

211.1 The following administrative positions shall be filled by executive appointment and shall be ratified by the majority vote of the Board:

- (a) Chief Operating Officer (COO): The COO has university wide authority over business operations. The COO reports to the President.
- (b) Chief Student Development and Student Success Officer (CSDSSO): The CSDSSO has university wide authority over student support and student success. The CSDSO reports to the President.
- (c) Chief Community College Officer: The University of the District of Columbia Community College is a Branch campus of the University. It offers courses in educational programs leading to an associate's degree or certificate. The administrative head of the Community College is titled the Chief Community College Officer, and reports to the President.

- (e) Chief of Staff: The Chief of Staff has authority over external affairs, coordinates the activities of the Offices of the Board and President, as well as the work of the Cabinet. The Chief of Staff reports to the President.
- (f) General Counsel: The General Counsel provides advice and counsel to the University stakeholders on all legal matters, and directs the activities of outside counsel working on behalf of the University. The General Counsel reports to the President with a dotted line to the Board.
- (g) Internal Auditor: The Internal Auditor is responsible for conducting internal audits of the University's operations. The Internal Auditor reports to the President with a dotted line to the Board.

211.2 The President may designate any position which reports directly to the President or any senior management or legal position of Administrative Salary Grade Level of 2B or higher which reports directly to a vice president to be filled by executive appointment.

211.3 The President, in his or her discretion, may conduct a formal or informal search or provide for a recruitment process to fill a position by executive appointment under this section, except that the President shall provide for a formal search and selection process, including active faculty and Board participation, to fill the position of Chief Community College Officer.

211.4 An employee of the University with permanent status who accepts an executive appointment under this section shall not have reversionary rights to return to the same position upon termination of the executive appointment. However, upon termination of the executive appointment, the former executive appointee shall retain his or her employment status at the University and shall be assigned to a position at the same level that he or she held at the time of the executive appointment.

211.5 A person newly hired under this section may, upon termination of the executive appointment, apply for competitive appointment to a position in the Educational Service for which he or she is qualified.

ORIGINATING AGENCY: Office of the Mayor


By virtue of the authority vested in me as Mayor of the District of Columbia by section 422(11) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act, approved December 23, 1973, 87 Stat. 790, Pub. L. 93-198, D.C. Official Code § 1-204.22(11) (2014 Repl.), it is hereby **ORDERED** that:

1. This Order applies to certain special event activities associated with post-season baseball games that may be held at Nationals Park during the 2016 Major League Baseball season. The potential postseason baseball game dates are between October 4 and November 2, 2016.
2. For the purposes of this Order, the term "post-season baseball game" means a Major League Baseball game held at Nationals Park after the conclusion of the regular Major League Baseball season in order to determine what teams will play in the World Series and a World Series game.
3. On post-season baseball game dates, the land area defined in the Lease Agreement dated March 6, 2006, by and between the Washington Convention and Sports Authority, as successor in interest to the District of Columbia Sports and Entertainment Commission, and the Washington Nationals Stadium, LLC ("**Lessee**"), successor in interest to Baseball Expos, L.P., as the "Baseball Stadium Site" (more particularly defined in Exhibit A to the Lease Agreement as the area of land consisting of approximately nineteen (19) acres, bounded by N Street, S.E., Potomac Avenue, S.E., South Capitol Street, and First Street, S.E.), is designated as a Special Event Area to which the provisions of 19 DCMR § 1301 shall not apply, for the purposes described in this Order.
4. On post-season baseball game dates, N Street, S.E., between South Capitol Street and First Street, S.E., and Half Street, S.E., between M Street, S.E., and N Street, S.E., are designated as Special Event Areas to which the provisions of 19 DCMR § 1301 shall not apply, for the purposes described in this Order.

- 5. Streets within the Special Event Areas designated by paragraph 4 of this Order may be closed to non-emergency vehicular traffic starting eight (8) hours before the commencement of a post-season baseball game, and continuing until three (3) hours after the post-season baseball game ends.
- 6. No sidewalk space within the Special Events Areas designated by paragraphs 3 and 4 may be closed to pedestrian traffic, unless specifically authorized by the City Administrator.
- 7. All building, health, life, and safety requirements shall remain applicable to the Special Event Areas designated by this Order.
- 8. Persons authorized to vend in the Nationals Park Vending Zone pursuant to 24 DCMR 530 shall continue to be authorized to vend in the Special Events Areas designated by paragraph 4 of this Order. In addition, the Department of Consumer and Regulatory Affairs may issue additional, special event vending permits within the Special Events Areas.
- 9. The District Department of Transportation may authorize additional lane closures and sidewalk closures in association with post-season baseball games for bus loading zones, television and radio broadcast vehicle parking, and other activities associated with post-season baseball games.
- 10. The City Administrator shall inform the Metropolitan Police Department, Fire and Emergency Medical Services Department, Homeland Security and Emergency Management Agency, and District Department of Transportation of all street closures under this Order.
- 11. **EFFECTIVE DATE:** This Order shall become effective immediately.

The decision of such chief judge regarding such appointment shall be final."

2. On May 18, 2016, pursuant to D.C. Code § 10-1141.06,² Washington Gas Light Company ("WGL") filed a Surcharge Update to revise the Rights-of-Way ("ROW") Reconciliation Factor.³ The ROW Surcharge contains two components, the ROW Current Factor and the ROW Reconciliation Factor. In the tariff filing, WGL sets forth the process used to recover from its customers the ROW fees paid by WGL to the District of Columbia government in accordance with the following tariff page:

3. According to its tariff, WGL's surcharge rate for the ROW Reconciliation Factor would become effective commencing with the June 2016 billing cycle.⁴ WGL's Surcharge Update shows that the ROW Current Factor is 0.0328. When the ROW Current Factor is combined with the ROW Reconciliation Factor of 0.0054 for the prior period, it yields a net factor of 0.0382.⁵ Based on our review of the Surcharge Update, the Commission finds that

WGL's calculations for the ROW Reconciliation Factor and the Surcharge Update comply with General Services Tariff, P.S.C. No. 3, Section 22, 3rd Revised Page No. 56.

4. A Notice of Proposed Tariff ("NOPT") regarding WGL's Surcharge Filing was published in the *D.C. Register* on July 29, 2016.⁶ In the NOPT, the Commission stated that WGL has a statutory right to implement its filed surcharges however, if the Commission discovers any inaccuracies in the calculation of the proposed surcharge rate, WGL could be subject to reconciliation of the surcharge. No comments were filed in response to the NOPT and the surcharge proposed by WGL complies with D.C. Code § 10-1141.06.

5. Consequently, the Commission voted to approve WGL's Surcharge Update for the Reconciliation Factor by official action taken at the October 5, 2016 Open Meeting.

3. In the ROW Compliance Filing, Verizon compares the current ROW surcharges and the updated ROW surcharges for the ROW Surcharge Rider.⁶ Specifically, the ROW Compliance Filing indicates that the ROW Surcharge Rider will increase by \$1.67, from \$3.99 to the updated rate of \$5.66, for Non-Centrex lines and increase by \$0.21, from \$0.50 to the updated rate of \$0.71 for Centrex lines.⁷ According to Verizon, the increase is the result of 1) a net under recovery of payments during the period from July 2015 to June 2016;⁸ and 2) the shrinking class of regulated switched-circuit wireline customers who are subject to the ROW use fee.⁹

4. According to the ROW Errata, Verizon requests that the Commission expedite review of its 2016 ROW Surcharge Rider and issue an order approving it by October 1, 2016.¹⁰ In addition, Verizon requests a timeframe of at least two weeks from the issuance of the order for it to make the necessary system changes implementing the new rate.¹¹

5. The Company has a statutory right to implement its filed surcharges. However, if the Commission discovers any inaccuracies in the calculation of the proposed surcharge, Verizon could be subject to reconciliation of the surcharges. DC CLEAN TEAM PROGRAM

The Department of Small and Local Business Development (DSLBD) is soliciting applications from eligible applicants to manage a **DC Clean Team Program** (“the Program”) for the Glover Park commercial district. **The submission deadline is Thursday, November 17, 2016 at 2:00 p.m.**

Through this grant, DSLBD will fund one clean team, which will achieve the following objectives.

- Improve commercial district appearance to help increase foot traffic, and consequently, opportunity for customer sales.
- Provide jobs for DC residents.
- Reduce litter, graffiti, and posters which contribute to the perception of an unsafe commercial area.
- Maintain a healthy tree canopy, including landscaping, along the corridor.
- Support Sustainable DC goals by recycling, mulching street trees, using eco-friendly supplies, and reducing stormwater pollution generated by DC’s commercial districts.

Eligible applicants are DC-based nonprofit organizations which are incorporated in the District of Columbia and which are current on all taxes. Applicants should have a demonstrated capacity with the following areas of expertise.

- Providing social support services to its Clean Team employees.

DSLBD will **award** one grant in the amount of \$135,000.

The **grant performance period** to deliver clean team services is February 1, 2017 through September 30, 2017.

The **Request for Application** (RFA) includes a detailed description of clean team services, service area boundaries, and selection criteria. DSLBD will post the RFA on or before **Friday, October 21, 2016** at www.dslbd.dc.gov. Click on the *Our Programs* tab, then *Neighborhood Revitalization*, and then *Solicitations and Opportunities* on the left navigation column.

Application Process: Interested applicants must complete an online application on or before **Thursday, November 17, 2016 at 2:00 p.m.** DSLBD will not accept applications submitted via hand delivery, mail or courier service. **Late submissions and incomplete applications will not be forwarded to the review panel.**

The online application will be live **Friday, October 21, 2016**. To access the online application, an organization must complete and submit an online **Expression of Interest** (Registration) form

at <https://octo.quickbase.com/db/bks6qx66x> . DSLBD will activate their online access within two business days and notify them via email.

Selection Criteria for applications will include the following criteria.

- Applicant Organization's demonstrated capacity to provide clean team or related services, and managing grant funds.
- Proposed service delivery plan for basic clean team services and commitment to hire residents from within Ward 3.
- Proposed service delivery plan for additional clean team services.

Selection Process: DSLBD will select grant recipients through a competitive application process that will assess the Applicant's eligibility, experience, capacity, service delivery/hiring plan, and budget. DSLBD will determine grant award selection and notify all applicants of their status via email on or before December 14, 2016.

Funding for this award is contingent on continued funding from the DC Council. The RFA does not commit the Agency to make an award.

ORDER DENYING MOTIONS FOR RECONSIDERATION

On October 9, 2015, the Advisory Neighborhood Commission (“ANC”) 7C³ submitted motions for reconsideration of the Board of Zoning Adjustment’s (the “Board’s”) order in each of the above cases. (Exhibits 37 and 32, BZA Orders No. 19040 and 19041-A, respectively.) The ANC also submitted motions to waive the time requirement for filing each motion. (Exhibits 36 and 31, BZA Orders No. 19040 and 19041-A respectively.)

In each case, the Board granted the Applicant’s request for variance relief from the lot area and lot width requirements under § 401, and the side yard requirements under § 405, to allow the construction of a new two-story, one-family dwelling on a vacant lot. The two properties that were the subject of the applications were in close proximity to each other. Because the facts and issues presented were nearly identical, the Board consolidated the two motions for reconsideration. At a decision meeting on November 10, 2015, the Board voted to deny the ANC’s motions for the reasons explained below.

Motion to waive time requirements

Subsection 3126.2 of the Board's Rules provides that a motion for reconsideration of the Board's decision be filed within 10 days from the date of issuance of the Board's final written order. In Application No. 19040, the Board's final written order was issued on September 28, 2015 (Exhibit 34.) In Application No. 19041, the Board's final written order was issued on September 29, 2015 (Exhibit 29), although a Corrected Order (Order No. 19041-A) was issued on October 8, 2015. Both motions for reconsideration were filed on October 9, 2015, 11 days after the final written order in Application No. 19040, 10 days after the final written order in Application No. 19041, and only one day after Corrected Order in 19041.

It is clear that the motion for reconsideration was timely filed regarding Application No. 19041. However, as the ANC recognized, its motion in 19040 was filed late, but only one day late. Under § 3100.5 of the Board's Rules, the Board may waive the time requirement for this filing if the ANC shows good cause and a lack of prejudice to the Applicant. In its motion to waive the time requirement, the ANC alleged it was unable to meet the filing deadline due to "other outstanding community issues". (Exhibit 37.) The Board finds this to be an adequate basis for establishing the "good cause" required under the Rules. Because the Applicant did not respond to the Motion for Reconsideration or the Motion to Waive the Time Requirements, the Board assumes the Applicant will not be prejudiced by the Board's consideration of the merits in this matter.

Motions for Reconsideration

Subsection 3126.4 of the Board's Rules states that a motion for reconsideration shall specifically state the respects in which the Board's decision is erroneous. The ANC filed identical motions for reconsideration in the two matters at hand. In each motion the ANC alleged that, although the Applicant presented both projects to the ANC at a meeting on September 10, 2015, the Applicant did not provide enough information to allow the ANC to make a final recommendation to the BZA. This claim, whether true or false, does not amount to an error in the Board's decision, as is required under § 3126.4. However, giving the ANC the benefit of the doubt, the Board will interpret the motions as also asserting that the Board erred by not allowing a second continuance, so as to enable additional meetings with the Applicant.

The Board concludes that it did not abuse its discretion when it denied the ANC's request for a second continuance. The chronology was the same in both cases. The applications were initially scheduled for July 14, 2015. Both cases were continued to September 22, 2015, at the ANC's request. (Exhibit 24 - 19040 and Exhibit 20 - 19041.) The ANC did not appear on the September 22 hearing date and did not submit an ANC report with a recommendation for the Board to consider. Instead, the ANC filed identical requests for a second continuance (Exhibit 32 - 19040 and Exhibit 27 - 19041), acknowledging that a meeting was held, but stating that it wished to have "a detailed discussion about both properties" at another meeting. Before reaching its decision, the Board questioned the Applicant extensively regarding its efforts to reach out to the ANC.⁴ The Applicant testified that he met with the full ANC (before the hearing) on September 10, 2015, and that he presented drawings depicting the proposed projects at this meeting. (Hearing Transcript of September 22, 2015, ("Tr."), p. 86-87.) He also testified that he met with

⁴ It should be noted that neither the Zoning Regulations nor the ANC Act requires the Applicant to meet with the ANC. However, the Board encourages these meetings so that the ANC can assess the impact of proposals in a meaningful way.

Dr. Gaffney, one of the Single-Member District Commissioners, and others on September 14, 2015 to discuss the two projects further. (Tr., p. 88).

In addition to the Applicant's testimony, the Applicant produced copies of email correspondence demonstrating the communication between the Applicant and the ANC as early as late May of 2015. (Exhibit 30 - 19040.) Based upon the testimony and evidence of record, the Board found in both cases that the Applicant diligently attempted to work with the ANC, and that a second continuance was not justified. As such, the Board denied the ANC's requests for a second continuance in the two cases and proceeded to hear the cases without the benefit of input from the ANC. After hearing further from the Applicant, and hearing also from the Office of Planning and individuals from the neighborhood, the Board granted the requested relief in both cases.

In conclusion, the ANC has not identified any legal or factual errors, or any other basis upon which the Board should reconsider its decision in this matter. For these reasons, it is hereby **ORDERED** that the Motions for Reconsideration are **DENIED**.

(Square 3030, Lot 805).

DECISION AND ORDER

RP 3701 NW LLC (the “Applicant”) submitted this self-certified application on July 29, 2015, for the property located at 3701 New Hampshire Avenue, N.W. (Square 3030, Lot 805). The application was filed pursuant to 11 DCMR § 3103.2 for variances from the off-street parking provisions under § 2101.1, in order to provide no parking spaces where 12 are required, and from the lot occupancy provisions under § 772.1, in order to allow a lot occupancy of approximately 96% for the residential floors, where a maximum 80% is permitted. (Exhibit 1.) Following a public hearing, the Board of Zoning Adjustment (the “Board” or “BZA”) voted to approve the application subject to conditions.

Preliminary Matters

Notice of Application and Notice of Public Hearing. By memorandum dated August 13, 2015, the Office of Zoning sent notice of the application to the D.C. Office of Planning; the District Department of Transportation (“DDOT”), Advisory Neighborhood Commission (“ANC”) 4C, the ANC within which the Site is located; Single Member District ANC 4C08; and the Councilmember for Ward 4. (Exhibits 14-18.)

A public hearing was scheduled for November 17, 2015. Pursuant to 11 DCMR § 3113.12, the Office of Zoning mailed notice of the public hearing to the Applicant, the owners of property within 200 feet of the subject property, ANC 4C, and ANC 1A, which is the ANC located across the street from the subject property, on August 19, 2015. (Exhibits 19-22.) Notice of the public

hearing was also published in the *D.C. Register* on August 28, 2015. Finally, the Applicant confirmed by affidavit that it had posted notice of the public hearing on the subject property on October 29, 2015. (Exhibit 26.)

Requests for Party Status. In addition to the Applicant, ANC 4C and ANC 1A were automatically parties in this proceeding. No other individuals or organizations filed timely requests for party status.

Applicant's Case. The Applicant provided testimony and evidence from Lex Lefebvre, a representative of the property owner, Jeff Goins of PGN Architects, an expert in architecture, and Jami Milanovich of Wells + Associates, an expert in transportation. The Applicant and its expert witnesses described the project, explained the need for the various forms of zoning relief requested, and addressed issues regarding potential adverse impact.

OP Report. By report dated November 10, 2015 and through testimony at the public hearing, OP recommended approval of the application. (Exhibit 30.)

DDOT Report. By report dated November 10, 2015 and through testimony at the public hearing, DDOT found the parking relief requested to be appropriate based on the characteristics of the subject property and the Transportation Demand Management Plan ("TDMP") the Applicant proposed. (Exhibit 29.)

ANC Reports. ANC 4C submitted a written report dated November 9, 2015 indicating that, at a regularly scheduled and duly noticed public meeting held October 14, 2015 with a quorum present, the ANC voted 5-4 to oppose the parking variance. The ANC raised six specific items of concern in its report: (1) the transportation study submitted in support of the application cited areas in Northern Virginia and Ward 3 of the District, which are not an accurate comparison to the Site; (2) the Applicant's plan to lease off-site parking spaces for three years is not a long-term solution to mitigate the problem; (3) the project would place additional pressure on the limited parking supply in the area, particularly near the Georgia Avenue-Petworth Metro Station; (4) granting parking relief would negatively impact the safety and welfare of residents near the site, particularly seniors; (5) granting variance relief would be detrimental to the public good; and (6) DDOT should restrict residents of the proposed project from applying for the Residential Permit Parking ("RPP") program. (Exhibit 28.) ANC 4C submitted a second written report dated November 16, 2015, concerning the public meeting held October 14, 2015, to clarify that, in addition to voting 5-4 to oppose the parking variance, the ANC voted 5-4 to support the variance for lot occupancy, based on the project's unique lot size and shape. (Exhibit 45.)

ANC 1A submitted a written report dated September 10, 2015 indicating that, at a regularly scheduled and duly noticed public meeting held September 9, 2015 with a quorum present, the ANC voted 8-3-1 to support the application. ANC 1A concluded that the project's impact on traffic and the neighboring properties would be negligible and based its decision on a review of the applicant's documentation and presentation. The ANC conditioned its support on three conditions: that the loading zone for the project be moved to the north of the site and the curb cut

along Rock Creek Church Road be removed (subject to necessary public space approvals), that trash dumpsters will be housed interior to the project, and that a rat abatement program be instituted before and during construction. (Exhibit 25.) The Applicant agreed to incorporate these conditions into its project.

Persons in support. The Board heard testimony and received evidence from persons in support of the application. (Exhibits 37, 38, 39, 40, 41, 42, and 44.) These individuals noted that the site was appropriate for the project proposed, that parking and lot occupancy relief were appropriate for this location, and that the requested parking relief in particular was reasonable given the site's small shape and location adjacent to a Metro entrance.

Persons in opposition. The Board heard testimony and received evidence from persons in opposition to the application. (Exhibits 31, 32, 33, 35, 36, 43, 46, 47, and 48.) The individuals in opposition raised concerns regarding increased parking in a congested area, relocation of the Chuck Brown mural, affordable housing, local hiring, and potential tenants in the retail space.

Post-hearing submissions. At the close of the hearing, the Board requested additional information from the Applicant regarding potential RPP restrictions and other parking-related information, as well as responses to issues raised by the community. The Applicant submitted the materials requested by the Board and included replies to the community concerns. (Exhibits 50, 50A.)

FINDINGS OF FACT

The Subject Property and Surrounding Area

1. The subject property is a triangular parcel located at 3701 New Hampshire Avenue, N.W. (Square 3030, Lot 805) (the "Property"). The Property is located at the intersections of New Hampshire Avenue, N.W., Georgia Avenue, N.W., and Rock Creek Church Road, N.W. The Property has a lot area of approximately 4,772 square feet.
2. The Property is small and triangular in shape. It has an unusual and atypical lot configuration. It narrows quickly at the intersection of three streets.
3. The Property also has an atypical extent of street frontage, all within close proximity to a major intersection. The Property also does not have any alley access.
4. The Property is currently improved with a two-story building previously utilized primarily as a restaurant. The Property is also the location of a mural depicting Chuck Brown ("Mural"), which is painted on the Georgia Avenue, N.W. façade of the existing building on the site. (Exhibit 11.)
5. The Property is located directly across New Hampshire Avenue, N.W. from the Georgia Avenue – Petworth Metrorail station.

6. Along the Georgia Avenue corridor, there are many multi-story mixed use buildings with ground floor retail and residential uses.
7. To the east of the Property, the area consists mostly of row homes, as well as one- to two-story commercial buildings. (Exhibits 4 and 11.)
8. The site is not located in a historic district nor is the building on the Property currently designated as a historic landmark listed in the D.C. Inventory of Historic Places or the National Registry of Historic Places.
9. The Property is zoned C-3-A and is part of the Georgia Avenue Neighborhood Commercial Overlay (“GA”).
10. The C-3-A Zone District permits mixed use residential-retail buildings as a matter of right. The C-3-A Zone District permits a building height of 70 feet (11 DCMR § 770) and a floor area ratio (“FAR”) of 4.8 (with the Inclusionary Zoning bonus) as a matter-of-right. (11 DCMR § 771.)
11. Pursuant to 11 DCMR § 1327.3, goals of the Georgia Avenue Overlay include: (a) to encourage additional residential uses along the Georgia Avenue corridor; (b) to encourage improved commercial uses; and (c) to encourage vertically-mixed uses within a quarter mile of the Georgia Avenue-Petworth Metrorail Station along Georgia Avenue, from Park Road, N.W. to Shepherd Street, N.W.

The Applicant’s Project

Building Design

12. The Applicant proposes to construct a five-story residential and retail building (the “Project”). The Project will have a building height of approximately 64 feet, one inch and an FAR of 4.8, consisting of approximately 22,840 square feet in total. (Exhibit 9.)
13. The Applicant proposes to have the Mural’s original artist repaint the Mural either on the new Project building or in another area of the neighborhood. (Exhibit 50).
14. The Project will provide ground floor retail and 21 residential units. The residential units will include approximately 2,023 square feet of affordable residential space, or three total units, with one unit priced for households earning 50% of the Washington, D.C. Area Median Income (“AMI”) and two units priced at 80% AMI. The Applicant’s proposal would exceed the Inclusionary Zoning set-aside requirements in Chapter 26 of the Zoning Regulations. (Exhibits 9 and 50.)
15. The Project will have a lot occupancy of approximately 96%, while the Zoning Regulations permit a maximum lot occupancy of 80% for residential uses or 100% for commercial uses. (11 DCMR § 772.1.)

16. The core of the proposed structure occupies a large percentage of the structure, which creates an inefficient building design. (Exhibit 27A2 at 13.) In order to comply with the lot occupancy requirements of § 772.1, an alternative plan would require moving the core of the building, which would decrease the active street frontages and the retail space.

Parking

17. The Applicant proposes to provide no parking spaces on site.
18. The lot size and configuration constrain the Applicant from providing the required number of parking spaces on the surface of the lot itself, as the lot is small and narrows near the intersection of three streets.
19. The lack of alley access would require parking to be entered off of a street in close proximity to a major intersection.
20. Creating below-grade parking spaces would yield approximately one or two parking spaces, per each level of below-grade parking. Because of the narrow shape of the lot, creating a ramp to access below-grade parking would require a steep grade to access below-grade parking and would result in the removal of the retail use on the ground floor.
21. The lot's narrow width would not allow for excavation of the site to provide sufficient below-grade parking, ramps for two-way circulation, or a turning radius to efficiently access a parking garage.
22. To mitigate the potential impacts of the parking variance, the Applicant proposes a Transportation Demand Management Plan ("TDMP"), which includes a Resident Parking Permit ("RPP") restriction. (Exhibit 50.)
23. Other elements of the Applicant's TDMP are: (1) providing a \$25 SmarTrip card to all residents during the first 10-year period of the Project, and (2) providing a one-year membership to all new residents to either Capital Bikeshare or a car-sharing service for the first 10-year period of the Project. (Exhibit 27B, Exhibit 50, Transcript ("Tr.") Hearing of November 17, 2015, at 16-18.)
24. At the request of DDOT, the Applicant removed its proposal to offer free off-site parking to residents seeking parking spaces, as this effort may incentivize car ownership among residents of the building. Instead, the Applicant offered to assist residents to find and lease off-street parking for the first three-year period of the Project for up to 12 spaces in the Property vicinity. (Exhibit 27B, Exhibit 50, Tr., p. 16-18.)

Zoning Relief

25. The GA/C-3-A Zone District permits lot occupancy of 80% for residential uses or 100% for commercial uses. (11 DCMR § 772.1.) The first floor of the Project will be commercial and

will meet the lot occupancy requirements.

26. The residential floors exceed the lot occupancy requirement, as the Project has a lot occupancy of approximately 96% for the residential floors, and therefore requires variance relief from § 772.1. (Exhibit 9.)
27. The GA/C-3-A Zone District requires owners to provide parking: (i) for retail use, one (1) space for each 300 square feet in excess of 3,000 square feet, and (ii) for multi-family residential use, one space for every two dwelling units. (11 DCMR § 2101.1.) Thus, this site would require a total of 12 parking spots (11 for the residential use and one for retail use).
28. The Project proposes no parking spaces, and therefore, requires variance relief from § 2101.1.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Variances

Standard of Review

The Applicant seeks two area variances pursuant to § 3103.2 to permit relief from the lot occupancy and parking requirements in order to construct a mixed-use residential and retail building providing 21 new residential units.

The Board is authorized under § 8 of the Zoning Act (D.C. Code § 6-641.07(g)(3)) to grant area variances, as provided in the Zoning Regulations, where, by reason of extraordinary or exceptional situation or condition of a specific piece of property, the strict application of the Zoning Regulations would result in a practical difficulty for the applicant, provided that the relief will not cause substantial detriment to the public good or substantial impairment of the intent, purpose, and integrity of the Zoning Regulations and Zoning Map. (See 11 DCMR § 3103.2.)

As discussed below, the Board concludes that the Applicant has met its burden of proof for area variances from 11 DCMR §§ 772.1 and 2101.1.

Extraordinary or Exceptional Condition

The Applicant has demonstrated that the Property is affected by a confluence of factors, which create an exceptional condition due to the lot shape, size, and street frontage. Specifically, the lot is uniquely small and triangular in shape, with an atypical lot configuration. The Property also has a unique and exceptional extent of street frontage, all within close proximity to a major intersection. Two sides of the lot narrow quickly at the intersection of three streets. In addition, the Property also does not have alley access.

Practical Difficulties

The Board also finds that strict application of the Zoning Regulations with respect to the lot occupancy and off-street parking requirements would cause practical difficulty to the Applicant. With regard to lot occupancy, the Board finds that the small size of the lot causes the Project to conform to the lot's unique shape. Although the structure occupies approximately 96% of the lot, the Project nonetheless yields a relatively inefficient building, due to the core taking up a large percentage of the structure. To require the Project to comply with the lot occupancy requirements would yield an exceptionally inefficient building, which would likely require moving the core of the building. Further, moving the core of the building would decrease the active street frontages and the retail space, both of which are goals of the Georgia Avenue Overlay pursuant to 11 DCMR § 1327. The Board credits OP's report, which also highlights the inefficiency of a building complying with lot occupancy and the consequences of moving the building core that amounted to a practical difficulty for the Applicant.

With regard to parking, the Board finds that the atypical street frontage, small lot size, and other exceptional circumstances at the Property create a practical difficulty for the Applicant to provide the required parking. First, the lot is too small to provide the necessary number of parking spaces. In addition, the lack of alley access would require parking to be entered off of a street in close proximity to a major intersection. The Board further finds that requiring the Applicant to provide below-grade parking spaces would be impractical, as the lot size and configuration would require a steep grade to access below-grade parking. Additionally, the Board finds that providing parking would remove much of the retail use on the ground-floor, in contradiction of the Georgia Avenue Overlay. The Board credits OP's report, which also noted the exceptional circumstances that lead to a practical difficulty for the Applicant, that because of the Property's shape and size, below-grade parking would be impractical.

No Substantial Detriment to Public Good or Substantial Impairment of the Zone Plan

Based on the findings of fact and for the reasons discussed above, the Board also concludes that the requested area variances will be in harmony with the general purpose and intent of the Zoning Regulations and Zoning Maps and will not tend to affect adversely the use of neighboring property. In so doing, the Board concludes that the proposed mixed-use building with retail and residential uses is consistent with the Zoning Regulations and Maps.

In so finding, the Board has carefully considered the community concerns raised regarding the Project.² ANC 4C and persons in opposition raised concerns regarding the parking constraints in the area. These individuals explained that residents in the wider Ward zones were driving to the Property's vicinity to park and ride the Metro, thus making parking difficult for neighborhood

² The Board notes that many of the persons in opposition discussed other concerns related to development in the area such as local hiring, local tenants in the retail space, and affordable housing. While these items are of concern generally to the Board, they are not germane to the decision regarding these area variances. The Board appreciates the community's comments and the Applicant's responses to those comments (Exhibit 50); however, the Board does not have the jurisdiction to consider those comments in its review of the variance application.

residents. The Board finds, however, that these concerns relate to a larger parking issue in the area, and are not specific to the proposed Project.

Further, the Applicant's Transportation Demand Management Plan ("TDMP") and other measures mitigate the Project's adverse impacts on the neighborhood and public. The Applicant's TDMP has been adopted by the Board as conditions of this order. In its report, OP noted that the parking relief requested would not cause a substantial detriment to the public good given the Applicant's strong TDMP and the Project's proximity to transit. (Exhibit 30.) DDOT, in its report, concurred, and as discussed above, made suggestions regarding the TDMP, which the Applicant has incorporated. (Exhibit 29.) The Board credits the reports of OP and DDOT in finding that, to the extent that the Project's lack of parking could cause concerns, the Applicant has taken sufficient steps to mitigate potentially related adverse impacts. The Board also finds that the Project furthers the intent, purpose, and integrity of the Zone Plan by providing a transit-oriented development and furthering the goals of the Georgia Avenue Overlay.

Great Weight

Section 13(b)(d) of the Advisory Neighborhood Commission Act of 1975, effective March 26, 1976 (D.C. Law 1-21; D.C. Code § 1-309.10(d)(A)), requires that the Board's written orders give "great weight" to the issues and concerns raised in the written recommendations of the affected ANC. In this case, both ANC 1A and ANC 4C are "affected," therefore the Board has accorded ANCs 1A and 4C the "great weight" to which they are entitled. In doing so, the Board fully credited the unique vantage point that both ANC 1A and ANC 4C hold with respect to the impact of the requested zoning relief on the ANC's constituents. While both ANCs approved the lot occupancy variance, ANC 1A supported the parking variance while ANC 4C voted 5-4-0 to deny the parking variance.

In its first written report, ANC 4C raised six specific items of concern in its report: (1) the transportation study submitted in support of the application cited areas in Northern Virginia and Ward 3 of the District, which are not an accurate comparison to the Site; (2) the Applicant's plan to lease off-site parking spaces for three years is not a long-term solution to mitigate the problem; (3) the Project would place additional pressure on the limited parking supply in the area, particularly near the Georgia Avenue-Petworth Metro Station; (4) granting parking relief would negatively impact the safety and welfare of residents near the site, particularly seniors; (5) granting variance relief would be detrimental to the public good; and (6) DDOT should restrict residents of the proposed project from applying for the Residential Permit Parking ("RPP") program. (Exhibit 28.)

In response to the issue raised by ANC 4C, the Board requested that the Applicant provide additional evidence and testimony to support the accuracy of its transportation study, including specific analysis of the parking conditions surrounding the Site. The Board also considered the ANC's concern regarding the Applicant's plan to assist residents in leasing off-site parking spaces, and ultimately determined that this approach was preferable to the Applicant's initial proposal to provide free off-site parking, which was opposed by DDOT. As discussed above, the

Board found that the proximity to the Georgia Avenue-Petworth Metro Station would not be detrimental to the public good, as it would provide opportunities for residents to use public transit. Further, the Board determined that that the concern regarding residents from elsewhere in the District driving to the Property's vicinity to park and ride the Metro was an issue of general concern, rather than one specific to the proposed project. Finally, the Board was persuaded by ANC 4C's recommendation to restrict residents of the proposed project from applying for RPP, and that restriction is a condition of the Board's order.

The Board has carefully considered ANC 4C's opposition to the parking variance, and for the reasons stated above, the Board has found that the Applicant's efforts in design and mitigation regarding parking result in a Project that will not harm the public good.

In reviewing a variance application, the Board is also required under D.C. Official Code § 6-623.04 (2001) to give "great weight" to the recommendation of OP. For the reasons stated in this Order, the Board finds OP's report and testimony to be persuasive.

Based upon the record before the Board and having given great weight to the ANC 1A, ANC 4C, and OP reports filed in this case, the Board concludes that in seeking variances from the lot occupancy requirements under §772.1, and the off-street parking requirements under §2101.1, the Applicant has met the burden of proving under 11 DCMR § 3103.2, that there exists an exceptional or extraordinary situation or condition related to the property that creates a practical difficulty for the owner in complying with the Zoning Regulations, and that the relief can be granted without substantial detriment to the public good and without substantially impairing the intent, purpose, and integrity of the zone plan as embodied in the Zoning Regulations and Map.

It is therefore **ORDERED** that the application is hereby **GRANTED, AND PURSUANT TO § 3125.8, SUBJECT TO THE APPROVED PLANS AT EXHIBIT 27A³ AND THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS:**

1. The Applicant shall include in the condominium bylaws, public offering statement, purchase agreement, and deeds, a provision prohibiting unit owners from obtaining a Residential Parking Permit ("RPP") for the Property from the D.C. Department of Motor Vehicles ("DMV"), and shall also include a provision allowing the DMV to release to the Home Owners Association ("HOA") any and all records of those owners requesting or receiving an RPP for the Property. The Condominium Bylaws shall include a provision that makes it a violation of the HOA rules and/or bylaws for a resident of the Property to obtain an RPP.
2. If the building is developed as a rental building, the building manager shall obtain written authorization from each resident through a lease provision that

³ The Applicant shall have flexibility to modify such plans to address any minor changes required by the building code or other regulations, so long as the minor changes do not require any additional areas of zoning relief.

allows the DMV to release to the building manager any and all records of that resident requesting or receiving an RPP for the Property.

3. The HOA, if the building is developed as a condominium building, or the building manager, if the building is developed as a rental building, shall monitor resident compliance with the RPP restriction by requesting from the DMV, every twelve (12) months, any and all records of residents requesting or receiving RPPs for the Property.
4. If the building is developed as an apartment building, prior to obtaining a certificate of occupancy for the approved building, the Applicant shall record a covenant against the Property among the Land Records of the District of Columbia prohibiting any resident of the Property from obtaining an RPP for such individual's use of the building as a covenant running with the land for the life of the project.
5. If the building is developed as a rental building, the building manager shall include in its residential leases a provision that prohibits tenants from obtaining an RPP for the Property from the DMV. Each of these parking restrictions shall be prominently featured in each residential lease as a rider that is separately initialed by each residential tenant. Any violations of the above parking restrictions shall be treated as an automatic default under the lease and provide grounds for termination of such lease. Such lease shall set forth that landlord shall use prompt and reasonable efforts, consistent with District of Columbia landlord tenant laws, to terminate such lease and remove the tenant from the premises, in the event of such default.
6. The Applicant shall secure up to twelve (12) parking spaces in nearby parking facilities for exclusive use by the Project's residents for a period of three (3) years after the issuance of the first certificate of occupancy for the project, as set forth below:
 - a. The Applicant will negotiate a lease or other contractual arrangement ("Lease") from an operator ("Lessor") of one or more nearby parking garage(s) that provides the Applicant with up to twelve (12) monthly parking passes ("Passes") to the extent that they are available:
 - i. The Passes shall be dedicated for the exclusive use of project residents or persons affiliated or associated with the Project, to provide access at any time to parking spaces in said garage(s) 24 hours a day, seven days a week, 52 weeks a year.

- ii. The Passes shall require the garage operator to grant persons holding such Passes immediate and continuous access to, and use of, a parking space in the garage.
 - iii. Parking spaces for which the Passes provide access shall be located within ¼ mile of the Project.
 - b. The Applicant shall sublease or assign such spaces to residents in the Project at market rates.
7. The Project shall be designed in a manner that will allow for loading supporting commercial uses to occur from New Hampshire Avenue and the curb cut along Rock Creek Church Road is to be removed, as shown on the plans approved by this Order, subject to approval through the public space permitting process.
8. Trash dumpsters shall be housed interior to the project, as shown on the plans approved by this Order.
9. A rat abatement program shall be instituted by the Applicant before and during construction.

SUMMARY ORDER

SELF-CERTIFIED⁴

The zoning relief requested in this case was self-certified, pursuant to 11 DCMR § 3113.2. (Exhibit 3.) In granting the certified relief, the Board of Zoning Adjustment ("Board" or "BZA") made no finding that the relief is either necessary or sufficient. Instead, the Board expects the Zoning Administrator to undertake a thorough and independent review of the building permit and certificate of occupancy applications filed for this project and to deny any application for which additional or different zoning relief is needed.

The Board provided proper and timely notice of the public hearing on this application by publication in the *D.C. Register* and by mail to Advisory Neighborhood Commission ("ANC") 2E and to owners of property located within 200 feet of the site. The site of this application is located within the jurisdiction of ANC 2E, which is automatically a party to this application. The Applicant testified at the hearing on July 19th that the ANC declined to put the case on its agenda. (See, Exhibit 37.) Subsequently, ANC 2E submitted a report dated September 9, 2016,

¹ This and all other references in this Order to provisions contained in Title 11 DCMR, except those references made in the final all-capitalized paragraphs, are to provisions that were in effect on the date this Application was decided by the Board of Zoning Adjustment ("the 1958 Regulations"), but which were repealed as of September 6, 2016 and replaced by new text ("the 2016 Regulations"). The repeal of the 1958 Regulations has no effect on the validity of the Board's decision or the validity of this order.

² The caption was revised to clarify that the relief being requested as a special exception under the authority of § 411.11 specifically included penthouse setback requirements under § 411.7 and penthouse screening requirements under § 411.18.

³ This case was rescheduled from the hearing dates of April 19, 2016 and May 24, 2016, and postponed from the hearing dates of May 24 and June 14, 2016. It was rescheduled to and heard on July 19, 2016 and continued to September 13, 2016.

⁴ The case record also contains a referral letter dated December 2, 2015 from the Zoning Administrator that indicates that BZA approval from § 411.11 is needed to allow new roof mounted mechanical equipment that does not comply with the minimum setback and screening requirements. (Exhibit 8.)

that indicated that at a duly noticed and regularly scheduled meeting of the ANC on August 29, 2016, at which a quorum was present, the ANC voted unanimously on a resolution to defer “to the Board to determine which of the two proposals -- the proposal that includes screening for the rooftop mechanical equipment and the proposal that does not include screening – is most in keeping with the historic character of Georgetown.” (Exhibit 45.)

The Office of Planning (“OP”) submitted a timely report and testified in support of the application. OP stated that it recommended approval of special exception relief from §§ 411.18 and 411.7 and indicated it was basing its analysis on the Zoning Administrator’s memo at Exhibit 8 in the record. OP noted that this case is subject to review by the Commission on Fine Arts (“CFA”) and Old Georgetown Board (“OGB”). (Exhibit 31.) The District Department of Transportation (“DDOT”) submitted a timely report indicating that it had no objection to the grant of the application. (Exhibit 25.)

Jeremiah DeMichelis, a neighbor of the Applicant, testified at the July 19th hearing in opposition to the application. Specifically, Mr. DeMichelis alleged that he was objecting to the application due to his diminished sunlight and the visibility from Prospect Street of the mechanical equipment and ductwork. He provided correspondence from the CFA to the record that would revise the CFA’s prior approval. In that correspondence, the CFA staff indicated that they made a mistake and after returning to the field to check on the visibility, they found that “the proposed alteration would be visible from a public thoroughfare (Prospect Street).” (Exhibit 40.)

At the conclusion of the July 19th hearing, the Board continued the hearing and requested that the Applicant provide additional information to the BZA, including:

- Plans showing the height of the ductwork;
- An analysis of whether screening for ductwork is required and whether screening of mechanical equipment is feasible; and
- If necessary, comments from the CFA on the revised proposal.

As requested, the Applicant submitted updated architectural plans and elevations with two options: one showing screening of the mechanical equipment and one without screening but only a guard rail. (Exhibit 42.) In its deliberations the Board specified the approved configuration for screening and approved a modification of the Applicant’s Option #2 (showing screening of the mechanical equipment), but the Board did not approve the plans on file because the relief the Board ultimately approved differs from the Applicant’s proposals in the record.⁵

As directed by 11 DCMR § 3119.2, the Board has required the Applicant to satisfy the burden of proving the elements that are necessary to establish the case pursuant to §§ 3104.1 and 411.11,

⁵ At the hearing on September 13, 2016, OP confirmed that if the Board were to require screening of the mechanical equipment, the Applicant would have to return to the CFA and OGB for their review, as they have not seen plans for the screening the BZA was requiring. The Board determined that even if visibility from Prospect Street were not found, it was appropriate to enclosure and screen the mechanical equipment for the sake of the neighbors on the north side.

for special exceptions from the penthouse setback requirements under § 411.7 and the penthouse screening requirements under § 411.18, to construct new rooftop mechanical equipment in the C-2-A District. Specifically, the Board granted relief from the requirement to enclose all mechanical equipment and approved a modified version of the Applicant's Option 2 (Exhibit 42), which would entail screening on the north wall and screening on the 10 ft. portions of the east and west walls that connect to the north wall. No parties appeared at the public hearing in opposition to this application. Accordingly, a decision by the Board to grant this application would not be adverse to any party.

Based upon the record before the Board, and having given great weight to the ANC and OP reports, the Board concludes that the Applicant has met the burden of proof, pursuant to 11 DCMR §§ 3104.1, 411.11, 411.7, and 411.18, that the requested relief can be granted as being in harmony with the general purpose and intent of the Zoning Regulations and Map. The Board further concludes that granting the requested relief will not tend to affect adversely the use of neighboring property in accordance with the Zoning Regulations and Map.

Pursuant to 11 DCMR § 3100.5, the Board has determined to waive the requirement of 11 DCMR § 3125.5, that the order of the Board be accompanied by findings of fact and conclusions of law. The waiver will not prejudice the rights of any party and is appropriate in this case.

SUMMARY ORDER

REVIEW BY THE ZONING ADMINISTRATOR

The application was accompanied by a revised memorandum, dated May 3, 2016, from the Zoning Administrator, certifying the required relief. (Revised, Exhibit 26; Original, Exhibit 3.) The revised memorandum references the Zoning Regulations of 1958, but because the application was not vested under those regulations, the provisions referenced in the memorandum have been converted to the Zoning Regulations of 2016, which became effective September 6, 2016.

The Board provided proper and timely notice of the public hearing on this application by publication in the *D.C. Register* and by mail to Advisory Neighborhood Commission ("ANC") 1A and to owners of property located within 200 feet of the site. The site of this application is located within the jurisdiction of ANC 1A, which is automatically a party to this application. The ANC submitted a report recommending approval of the application. The ANC's report indicated that at a regularly scheduled, properly noticed public meeting on June 8, 2016, at which a quorum was present, the ANC voted 8-0-0 to support the application. The ANC noted that the Applicant committed to allow parents to utilize available parking spaces during pick-up and drop-off, which the Board adopted as a condition of this order.

¹ The original application was filed under the Zoning Regulations of 1958 and included only the special exception request to operate a child development center. (Exhibit 3.) The Applicant submitted a revised memorandum from the Zoning Administrator that added a request for variance relief for one parking space to the application. Because the application was not vested under the Zoning Regulations of 1958, the provisions referenced in the memorandum have been converted to the Zoning Regulations of 2016, wherein the parking relief requested became allowable by special exception. The caption has been revised accordingly.

² This case was originally scheduled for hearing on June 14, 2016, but was postponed to July 19, 2016. The case was further postponed from July 19, 2016 and was scheduled for and heard on September 27, 2016.

The Office of Planning (“OP”) submitted two reports to the record. In its initial report, OP indicated that it required additional information in order to make a recommendation. (Exhibit 32.) SUMMARY ORDER

SELF-CERTIFICATION

The zoning relief requested in this case was self-certified, pursuant to 11 DCMR Subtitle Y § 300.6. (Exhibit 5 – original, Exhibit 37 - updated.) In granting the certified relief, the Board of Zoning Adjustment ("Board" or "BZA") made no finding that the relief is either necessary or sufficient. Instead, the Board expects the Zoning Administrator to undertake a thorough and independent review of the building permit and certificate of occupancy applications filed for this project and to deny any application for which additional or different zoning relief is needed.

The Board provided proper and timely notice of the public hearing on this application² by publication in the *D.C. Register* and by mail to Advisory Neighborhood Commission ("ANC") 6A and to owners of property located within 200 feet of the site. The site of this application is located within the jurisdiction of ANC 6A, which is automatically a party to this application. The ANC submitted a report dated September 13, 2016 recommending approval of the application. The ANC's report indicated that at a regularly scheduled, properly noticed public meeting on July 14, 2016 at which a quorum was present, the ANC voted 8-0 to support the application with seven conditions. (Exhibit 34.) In approving the Application, the Board adopted all of the conditions recommended by the ANC.

¹ This self-certified application was filed on June 1, 2016 while the 1958 Zoning Regulations were in effect. However, as the case was not scheduled for a hearing or heard until after the new Zoning Regulations of 2016 (ZR16) went into effect on September 6, 2016, the relief was revised to reflect the ZR16 provisions. The Board considered the application under the ZR16 provisions. This caption has been changed accordingly.

² The Applicant was required to post notice on the property 15 days prior to the hearing – by September 12, 2016. (11 DCMR Subtitle Y § 402.3.) The Affidavit of Posting indicates that the property was posted on September 22, 2016, only five days before the hearing. (Exhibit 38.) The Applicants testified that this is their first application and unfortunately, they picked up their placard late. The Board waived the posting of notice on the property for the 10 days given that the Applicant had met with, and received, the support of the ANC, and received the support of adjacent and nearby neighbors.

The Board provided proper and timely notice of the public hearing on this application by publication in the *D.C. Register* and by mail to Advisory Neighborhood Commission ("ANC") 2B and to owners of property located within 200 feet of the site. The site of this application is located within the jurisdiction of ANC 2B, which is automatically a party to this application. The ANC did not submit a report to this application. The Applicant testified at the hearing that the Advisory Neighborhood Commissioner for the area in which the project is located declined to have the full ANC consider the application.

No parties appeared at the public hearing in opposition to this application. Accordingly, a decision by the Board to grant this application would not be adverse to any party.

The MU-4 zone allows a maximum height of 50 feet; maximum lot occupancy of 60% (70% for Inclusionary Zoning [IZ]); 2.5 FAR (3.0 for IZ and 1.5 for non-residential¹).

The MU-5 zones are intended to: permit medium-density, compact mixed-use development with an emphasis on residential use; provide facilities for shopping and business needs, housing, and mixed-uses for large segments of the District of Columbia outside of the central core; and be located on arterial streets, in uptown and regional centers, and at rapid transit stops. The MU-5-A zone allows a maximum height of 65 feet (70 feet for Inclusionary Zoning); maximum lot occupancy of 80%; 3.5 FAR (4.2 for IZ and 1.5 for non-residential).
